### THE GIVER WHO BEGAN BY ASKING

The Gospel today tells of a woman who was searching for a water that would quench her thirst for happiness. Right out of the blue she encountered a person who told her that he could provide her with that water. The person was Christ. We are all looking for the elusive 'something' that will make us happy. We come here this morning to encounter the only person who can give us what we are looking for. Let us pause a while to draw close to him.

# The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass (7) <u>"The Sign of the Cross"</u>

Having arrived early to the Church, and spent some time in silence, in order to prepare ourselves for our sacred meeting with God, we begin the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. The sign of the Cross is an essential prayer for us as Catholics, not only because it recalls our baptism, in which we were baptized with the pouring of water and the Trinitarian formula, but it is by the Holy Cross that we are redeemed, set free, and enabled to enter into the heavenly kingdom at the end of our sojourn.

Going back as far as the third century, we find the early Church Fathers already speaking of the sign of the Cross. For example, Tertullian (d. 250 AD) said that "In all our travels and movements, in all our coming in and going out, in putting on our shoes, at the bath, at the table, in lighting our candles, in lying down, in sitting down, whatever employment occupies us, we mark our foreheads with the sign of the Cross" (*De corona* 30). In his catechetical lectures, St. Cyril of Jerusalem (d. 386) says "Let us then not be ashamed to confess the Crucified. Be the Cross our seal, made with boldness by our fingers on our brow and in everything; over the bread we eat and the cups we drink, in our comings and goings out; before our

sleep, when we lie down and when we awake; when we are traveling, and when we are at rest" (*Catechesis* 13). The fourth century also sees another Church Father, St. Basil the Great, telling us that the Apostles "taught us to mark with the sign of the Cross those who put their hope in the Lord."



St. Anthony of the Desert (251-356 A.D.) advises us that "The illusions of the world [will] soon vanish, especially if a man arms himself with the

sign of the Cross. The devils tremble at the sign of the Cross of our Lord, by which He triumphed over and disarmed them." St.



John Vianney (1786-1859) instructs us that "The sign of the Cross is the most terrible weapon against the devil. Thus the Church wishes not only, that we have it continually in front of our minds, to recall to us just what our souls are worth and what they cost Jesus Christ, but also that we should make it at every juncture ourselves: when we go to bed, when we awaken during the night, when we get up, when we begin any action, and above all, when we are tempted." And lastly, St. Charbel reminds us that "The most

important, greatest, and holiest sign is the sign of the Cross."

In other words, the Sign of the Cross has accompanied us from the early days and has remained with us for 2000 years, and it will remain with us until the end of time! Let us begin in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.
