

CHRIST THE LIGHT OF THE WORLD

Today's Gospel tells about the cure of a man born blind. We all suffer from different forms of blindness. We all have many blind spots. But there is hope for us if we are willing to admit them.

Our sins are a form of blindness. Let us confess them asking Christ to let the light of his grace shine into our minds and hearts.

1st READING (1 Samuel 16:1, 6-7, 10-13). God chose David, the least of Jesse's sons, to be king of Israel. This shows that, whereas people look at appearances, God looks at the heart.

2nd READING (Ephesians 5:8-14). Paul tells the Christians at Ephesus that once they were in darkness but now Christ has enlightened them. Therefore, they must adopt a life-style which is appropriate to their new state.

GOSPEL (John 9:1-41). Jesus is the light of the world. He not only gives sight to those who are physically blind, but the light of faith to those who are spiritually blind, provided they are open to receive it.

The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass (8) "Mea Culpa - Lord Have Mercy"

Having just made the Sign of the Cross, we begin the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass by first recognizing that we are all sinners in need of God's never-failing mercy. Calling to mind any particular ways we have offended the Lord, we strike our breast three times and ask God's pardon. This part of the Mass is called the Penitential Rite.

But why do we do this? To begin with, we must recognize that all of us have

"sinned and fallen short of the Glory of God" (Romans 3:23). Furthermore, we take to heart our Lord's words when He says: "if you are offering your gift at the altar, and there remember that your brother has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go; first be reconciled to your brother, and then come and offer your gift" (Matthew 5:23-24). And since every offense we've committed against our brother is first and foremost an offense against God, we ask God's forgiveness.

However, this is only part of the picture. As we know from Sacred Scripture and Church teaching, there are two categories of sins—venial and mortal. Venial sins are the minor offenses we commit on a daily basis, either through our actions, and even our lack of action. They injure our relationship with God and man, but do not

cut off the life of grace—the connection between us and God. Mortal sins, on the other hand, are serious sins, and completely cut off the life of grace in our souls, and rupture our relationship with God. And while venial sins can be and are forgiven in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, mortal sins are not.

If we have mortal sins on our soul, we must partake of sacramental confession before approaching the altar and receiving Holy Communion. In fact, St. Paul reminds us that "anyone who eats and drinks [the Eucharist] without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment upon himself. That is why many of you are weak and ill, and some have died" (1 Corinthians 11:28-30). In other words, if we receive Holy Communion in a state of mortal sin, we commit a sacrilege of the highest order, compound the sin, and con-

demn ourselves before the throne of God. It is that serious! This is why Jesus gave us the sacrament, and why we offer the Sacrament of Reconciliation six days a week here at St. Peter's, in the hopes that all will take advantage of the grace be-

ing offered in the Tribunal of Mercy.

So let us examine our conscience, confess our sins.


