FROM THE SHARED ASSOCIATE PASTOR'S DESK

Last week, when I was on my silent retreat, I stayed at a retreat house for priests at the Shrine of the Most Blessed Sacrament in Hanceville, Alabama. It is a fascinating and beautiful place to be able to stop and pray for a while. The Shrine was built by Mother Angelica who was also the foundress of EWTN, the US Catholic media outlet. While I was there, I was able to read from a few books about her life. After a fairly miraculous healing when she was a young cloistered Franciscan nun, Mother Angelica promised the Lord that she would start a monastery of nuns in the south. She did so in Birmingham, Alabama – which had a 2% Catholic population at the time.

Following that she started printing mini-books to catechize and evangelize. Eventually, she came to a news station in Chicago to talk about the work that she was doing – and she saw the satellites and television equipment and said, "I've got to get me one of those." One of the sisters that was traveling with her, without knowing what Mother Angelica was thinking, had a similar idea while praying on the way back to Alabama. There are tons of stories in which Mother would order some printing press or paper cutter, or something for evangelization and media – with only \$200 in the nuns' bank account. The next day someone would come in and donate some outlandish amount of money to cover that very specific cost. Again and again, she heard the Lord asking her to do bold and grand and seemingly crazy things, and she did it. And, the Lord provided. Mother Angelica trusted the Lord. She went out on a limb and did almost absurd things to tell others about Jesus, and the Lord provided. She was certainly a spitfire of woman who was not afraid to go toe-to-toe with some of the US bishops when she disagreed with them.

Moral of the story of Mother Angelica? The Lord asked her to do bold things for Him, and when she trusted Him, he gave her everything she need to complete it magnificently. Jesus might not ask us to build a monastery or a global Catholic media center, but He might ask us to evangelize our family, or pray for 10 more minutes each day, or to be involved in some aspect of our parish's life in a new way. Will we trust Him to provide for whatever we need?

On another note, you may have noticed that during the Penitential Act at Mass lately, I have used the Greek responses. Kyrie, eleison. Christe, eleison. Kyrie, eleison. They simply mean what we say in English. Lord, have mercy. Christ, have mercy. Lord, have mercy. There are a number of reasons that I've chosen to do this. One of them came from a conversation with a friend who mentioned that when Jesus was crucified and died on the Cross, his "crime" was printed above Him on the Cross in three languages: Hebrew, Greek, and Latin. The Cross is the decisive moment when Jesus conquers sin and death for us. These three specific languages were used to
