



FROM THE SHARED PASTOR'S DESK

- **1.) Renewed Appointment** Archbishop Listecki has been pleased to renew my appointment as the Dean for Priests in Washington/Dodge Counties for an additional 1-year term.
- 2.) Aid To Ukraine Our national Conference of Catholic Bishops asked us to take up a collection at Ash Wednesday Masses and services for direct aid to those suffering in that part of the world; as this notice came to us with less than 24 hours turnaround, some may not have been prepared to help; in that case, go to www.support.crs.org/ukraine for online giving or call 1-877-HELP-CRS or mail to: CATHOLIC RELIEF SERVICES: UKRAINE RESPONSE PO BOX 17090 Baltimore, MD, 21297-0303. This is the official humanitarian outreach agency of the Catholic Church in our country for extending national/international help in time of crisis or need. Others representing themselves as arms of the Catholic Church may be scams; exercise cautious prudence when being generous.
- 3.) Saint Patrick While Thursday will see much "wearing of the green" and associated festivities in which many "Irish wannabes" will participate, I think that a greater way to honor the saint might be to devote ourselves with passion similar to his to the mission dearest to his heart, that being to bring Christian faith to those without it! St. Patrick himself was somewhat ascetic; he denied himself simple pleasures, fasted, practiced vigilance of the tongue, etc., these practices intended to help him control his desires (he would abhor some of the intemperance with which we honor his day), make reparation for past sins (he could not forget a small dishonesty he committed as a young lad when, by his own admission, he barely knew right from wrong), and make his example of striving for spiritual perfection a living invitation to all he met to intentionally follow Jesus; an example for us to consider as so many lack lively relationship with Jesus and His Body in Church.
- 4.) Saint Joseph Along with the Annunciation of the Lord, the feast of St. Joseph is of such a great significance that it turns Lenten violet white for his observance! This quiet man, so very close to Mary and Jesus during the "hidden years" of the Lord's preparation for His ministry of salvation for us and the world, has long been considered to have had a most holy death in their presence before Jesus began to preach and teach (Scripture calling Jesus "Son of the Carpenter" or "Son of Mary," referring to His father's trade or His mother's name are polite ways of saying Joseph had already died) and, as such, is invoked as the patron saint of a happy death. However, his most glorious title when we venerate him is Guardian of the Universal Church (remembering that he protected the Holy Family from threats to do them harm). "To other saints the Lord has given power to help in one sort of need, but this glorious saint, as I know by experience, helps us with every need. I cannot remember ever having asked him for anything which he did not obtain for me." (St. Teresa of Avila) I, with his great name as my middle name, totally agree!




