



FROM THE SHARED PASTOR'S DESK

1.) The Annual Good Friday Collection – Helps parishes and schools in the Holy Land as well as to preserve the sacred shrines. The pandemic hit particularly hard in the Holy Land as many if not most of the Christians living there depend on pilgrimages for work. This special collection helps meet the basic needs of the people still living in the land where Jesus and the Church were born. For more information, visit www.myfrancis can.org/good-friday. Please be generous; thank you! 2.) What is "Viaticum?" – It is the distribution of Holy Communion to individuals in danger of death, who are about to leave this earthly life and are preparing for eternal life. The celebration of the Eucharist as Viaticum, food for passage through death to eternal life, is the sacrament proper to the dying Christian. It is the completion and crown of the Christian life on earth, signifying that the Christian follows the Lord into eternal glory and the banquet of the heavenly kingdom. The essential rite of "Viaticum" is an individual in danger of death receiving Holy Communion, but it is often preceded by the sacraments of Anointing of the Sick and Confession. The word for this special rite has its' origin in ancient Mediterranean traditions of a meal shared by those setting out on a journey. The hosts of this shared meal not only provided it but also supplied everything else necessary for the journey – food, clothes, utensils and expenses. In Greek, the meal itself was a called a hodoiporion and the gift supplies called ephodion; the adjectival Latin equivalent of these two terms is viaticus, of or pertaining to a road or journey. Communion in the Body & Blood of Christ Who died and rose from the dead, received at the moment of passing from this world to the Father, is the seed of eternal life and the power of the resurrection. No wonder the Church says it is wrongful to delay receiving the Sacraments for the Sick and Dying lest a dying person be unable to participate in or to receive the Eucharist which is officially our "last rites." 3.) Confirmation Names – We continue to rejoice in the Confirmation of our youth nearly a month ago; as part of their preparation to receive this Sacrament, they choose a saint's name as their Confirmation name, researching and selecting their choice with both curiosity and deliberation. Each year certain names have distinctive popularity; this year's most frequently chosen name was Sebastian (patron of archers, soldiers, police, physicians and athletes, etc., many of these interesting to young people now or as futures are imagined); sometimes a previously obscure name is chosen – this year it was Goar, a parish priest who lived c. 575AD; preferring solitude, he became a hermit. Intrigued by his humble, modest lifestyle, many people came to listen to him; he was particularly patient. Some notoriety having been gained, a busy-body complained to his bishop, accusing Goar of deception, drunkenness, hypocrisy, sorcery, and other personal irregularities. The bishop wanted him severely disciplined but Goar was vindicated when it was discovered that the accuser and bishop were guilty of

similar charges! After that bishop was deposed, Goar was invited to be his successor; the idea of becoming a bishop so upset Goar that he became ill; he asked for time to prayerfully consider nomination and went back home and, before he could indicate whether he would've accepted the honor, he died peacefully, relieved.




