JESUS IS HIGH PRIEST

Through the Paschal Mystery of Jesus Christ, we can be saved. What exactly is the Paschal Mystery? The Paschal Mystery was what Jesus told the Apostles to be witnesses to. They were to be witnesses to others that Jesus came from the Father, suffered death for our sins, rose from the dead to conquer sin, and then ascended into Heaven to invite us to follow Him. This is the most central message of our faith. This is the saving truth of our redemption.

And, how does Jesus continue this work of redemption? His power is passed on through the Sacrament of Holy Orders, which was instituted by Jesus at the Last Supper. After receiving Holy Orders, a man becomes ontologically different. That is, a change in *being* takes place, not unlike the change that takes place in a person who gets baptized. And what are these ordained powers bestowed upon priests? A priest can offer the sacrifice of the Mass, forgive sins, and exercise authority in Christ's name. The priesthood, as established by Christ Himself, is vital to the life of the Church.

Today is Vocations Sunday, which is a reminder to ask God for more priests, priests who can remain faithful to Jesus, our High Priest.

Come before Our Blessed Lord in the Adoration Chapel and beg Him for an increase in vocations to the priesthood. And, remember to pray for all our current priests, that God give them strength and healing as necessary. There should be no identity crisis in the Catholic priesthood.



Dear Lord, may all priests be granted great faith in the powers bestowed upon them by You and that their presence in the world is essential for salvation. Amen.

GOSPEL REFLECTION*April 25, 2021**Fourth Sunday of Easter*

Any builder worth his or her salt knows the value and importance of a cornerstone. Properly laying and securing this primary unit determines how the rest of the project unfolds and its success. Cornerstones are necessary elements not only of buildings but of lives as well. Many human beings conduct the business of their lives paying little attention to a grounding reference or starting point. Hence, what unfolds is a tapestry of relativism, with few anchors or guideposts and many impulsive choices. Some consider love to be their cornerstone. While this may sound attractive and useful, the pursuit of love without a simultaneous pursuit of its source can be shallow and self-focused. Just because a person chooses to do no harm and love others does not mean that they are living in truth and properly anchored to the real cornerstone.

Jesus is the true and authentic cornerstone and shepherd. It is only in following the Risen One as the way, the truth, and the life that we can move from being well grounded ethical people to properly focused moral ones. Proper conduct, a true sense of justice, wisdom, virtue, moral principles, faith, hope, and love will be difficult to find unless we listen to the right Voice. It is when we learn to listen to the voice of God that we begin our journey on the road to salvation. It is only the Good Shepherd, the authentic and solid cornerstone, who can guide us through life's questions and challenges and bring us to the safe and proper pasture.

A person's life only has meaning when the cornerstone is properly selected and set. Understanding themselves only as random acts of creation, existing without intent or purpose, will color their choices and influence their decisions. The foundation of their lives will be simply a matter of preference and choice, leaving benchmarks of growth and higher ideals optional to pursue. Whereas people who believe that they are fashioned and loved into existence by a God who purposely made them, have this incredible unconditional relationship at their source which has tremendous significance. Their allegiance is not to themselves but to their Creator. Life, then, is an adventure in search of this Creator God and a journey of self-discovery that seeks to unite their will to His. There is a cost. We have to give up our life in order to gain our life. As ironic as that sounds, it is true. It is only when we finally figure this out that the true cornerstone of our lives will be properly laid and we can, with God's help, get about the business of properly constructing a temple that endures.

What are the requirements for being a confirmation sponsor?

Although many dioceses have specific requirements for who can be a sponsor for the Sacrament of Confirmation, the Code of Canon Law identifies certain requirements that are true for all dioceses and parishes. First, the sponsor should be chosen by the one to be confirmed (or, in some cases, by the parents or even the pastor). Second, a sponsor must be at least sixteen years old (unless the local bishop has chosen another age, or a special exception has been made). Third, the sponsor must be a Catholic who has been confirmed and who has already received the Sacrament of the Eucharist. Beyond this, they must lead “a life of faith in keeping with the function to be taken on.” Fourth, they can have no sort of canonical penalty or impediment. Finally, they cannot be either the father or mother of the one to be confirmed (See Canons 893, §1 and 874, §1).

In some cultures, it is customary for one of the confirmand’s godparents to act as sponsor, although this is not required by Church law.

To learn about the requirements for your parish or diocese, you can consult your pastor or your parish or diocesan director of religious education or the diocese’s office liturgy and worship.

Faith Matters

The Question of Authority (Article 19)



In our exploration of the development of authority and leadership structures in the early Church, last week we began to look at the seven letters of bishop Ignatius of Antioch (in Syria), written circa 115 AD to churches in western Asia Minor (now Turkey) and to Rome. These letters reveal an important shift in the authority structure in some churches, from a conciliar leadership shared by equal presbyter-bishops to a more hierarchical structure with one bishop presiding over a council of presbyters and a group of deacons. This was certainly the case for Ignatius' church of Antioch and for other churches to which he wrote, but it was not yet the case for the church in Rome, as we will explore below. The letters also give us insight into Ignatius' understanding of the proper minister of the sacraments, which related to their validity. In his letter to the church in Smyrna, Ignatius says: "Only that Eucharist which is under the authority of the bishop (or whomever he delegates) is to be considered valid (8:1)." And he goes on to reprimand those who "refuse to acknowledge that the Eucharist is the flesh of our Savior Jesus Christ (6:2)."

Ignatius' letter to the church in Rome differs greatly from his other letters. While the others deal mainly with the unity of the local church under the leadership of the bishop and his presbyters, Ignatius makes no mention of a bishop in his letter to Rome. Because of this glaring omission, many scholars believe that at that point the church in Rome was still using the older model of leadership, i.e. by a council of presbyter-bishops with shared authority, rather than a single bishop with sole authority over his presbyters (though one of the presbyter-bishops may have held an important honorary role.) The opening greeting of the letter shows the great respect Ignatius had for the Roman church: "To the church which presides in the district of the Romans, worthy of honor and presiding over love (1:1)...You have never envied anyone, but have taught others (3:1)."

Ignatius then goes on to refer to both Peter and Paul's ministry in Rome, on which the prestige of that church rested: "I do not give you orders like Peter and Paul; they were apostles, I am a convict (4:3)." So even though, seemingly, the church in Rome was not yet being led by a single bishop, the whole church of Rome was viewed with great respect because it was there that two greatest apostles gave the ultimate witness of faith: martyrdom. Ignatius himself was being transported to Rome by imperial guards to face charges of blasphemy and treason for rejecting the official Roman religion and leading the "seditious" Christian community in Antioch. In a beautiful passage in chapter 2, Ignatius exhorts the church in Rome not to hinder his martyrdom: "Grant me nothing more than to be poured out as an offering to God...because God has judged [me] worthy to be found in the West, having summoned [me] from the East...It is good to be setting out from the world to God, in order that I may rise with him."

It is interesting to compare the letters of bishop Ignatius of Antioch with the letter called 1 Clement (which we covered last week). 1 Clement was written from the church in Rome circa 95 AD, by a member of the council of presbyter-bishops. It was written to the church in Corinth (Greece), also led at the time by a council of presbyter-bishops, urging the community to reinstate those leaders who had been unjustly deposed. Clement invokes the earliest instance of the notion of "apostolic succession", claiming that the apostles themselves had appointed their successors in all the churches, who in turn handed down leadership to others. Yet, Clement does not refer to a single bishop presiding over the church in his day, either in Rome or in Corinth. The letters of Ignatius were written 20 years after 1 Clement, from the single bishop of Antioch (in the East) to the other churches in the East (Asia Minor) that had a bishop presiding over each of them. The only exception is Ignatius' letter to the Romans, written to a church in the West, which does not refer to a single bishop presiding over the church there. At a period when structures of authority in the churches were developing, it is not surprising that, given the differences in time and region, there would be differences between the churches in Rome & Corinth (in the West) and those further East.


