GOSPEL REFLECTION

July 25, 2021 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

St. Oscar Romero said, "We cannot do everything, and there is a sense of liberation in realizing that. This enables us to do something and to do it very well. It may be incomplete, but it is the beginning, a step along the way, an opportunity for the Lord's grace to enter and do the rest."

There were a group of ladies many years ago who made quilts. They were beautiful creations reflecting inspirational designs artfully composed from the simple scraps of fabric each woman would bring to their individual pieces. There was no plan for the finished project as each finished work became the combined creation of what each woman contributed. They abounded in vibrant colors and dazzled the beholder with intricate patterns and their myriad textures. They were so beautiful that they became coveted family treasures passed from generation to generation. Those women never realized the power of their work. Countless babies rested in the comfort of those quilts warmly nestled in the legacy of tradition they were fortunate to inherit. They adorned countless homes with their beauty and brought joy and solace to many faces.

We cannot do everything. We are not meant to. Our work in life is to contribute our individual piece, a piece that reflects the unique thumbprint I claim as my own. We only have to do small things well. Then, as St. Oscar Romero reminds us, the Lord's grace will enter and do the rest. We have to trust that this is true just as those women trusted in the eventual beauty of their final work.

Eucharistic blessings are blessings that start small and multiply. We all come to life with only a few loaves of bread and a few fish. Not any single one of us has all that it takes to transform our world. Who knows what God will do with the little we have and how many will benefit from our kindness, compassion, wisdom, courage, conviction, love, warmth, zeal, faith, and hope? That young lad never dreamed that his few leftovers would do all that they did. God shows up in unexpected ways! Where would life's adventure and fun be if it were any other way? Being able to be part of bringing God's creative, transforming, healing to the world opens us up to wonder, awe, and excitement! We can all bring our little piece to the bigger work of God that can result in being a coveted jewel passed generation to generation. This is good news indeed!

Bread and wine transform into Christ's Body and Blood and we become what we eat. Trust that.

PLEASE GOD OUR FATHER

Little children like to show their moms and dads the things they can do: ride bikes, draw pictures, catch balls, sing songs, play instruments, and the list goes on even into adulthood.

Grandmas and grandpas make really good audiences too! But guess who delights most in watching us use our talents? God, our Father. And, it's built into us to want to share all we think, say, and do. We're communal and we look for approval. So then, what's wrong with success, popularity or power? Well, as Henri J.M. Nouwen pointed out, success, popularity, and power can indeed present great temptations, but their seductive qualities often come from the way they are part of a much larger temptation to self-rejection. If one doesn't get positive approval early on, one could easily fall into the trap of believing the voices that cut

down one's eternal worth, thereby making the above solutions attractive, albeit false.

Henri J.M. Nouwen sums this up very well: "Self-rejection is the greatest enemy of the spiritual life because it contradicts the sacred voice that calls us the "Beloved". Being the Beloved constitutes the core truth of our existence."



Let Jesus set you straight. Visit Him in the Adoration Chapel. It's a sacred place where you can talk with Our Lord, telling him all about what you're thinking and doing. He is so happy to listen! Then, you listen. And, little by little, you will begin to hear and pay attention to His voice, forsaking all false voices. After all, at the Transfiguration of Christ, God, our Father said, "This is my Beloved Son, listen to Him." (Mark 9:7)

Sunday in the Word: July 25th, The 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time By Matt Pozen – Director of Faith Formation



The gospel readings for Sunday Mass follow a 3-year cycle: Year A is from Matthew, Year B from Mark, and Year C from Luke. The gospel of John does not have its own year, but rather is used every year during the seasons of Lent and Easter. We are currently in Year B, following the story of Jesus from the gospel of Mark, but for today and the next four Sundays we shift to chapter 6 from John: the famous "Bread of Life Discourse". Since Mark is such a short gospel, it is not long enough to fill all the Sundays of the Church year, so it is supplemented with five weeks from John 6.

Gospel --- John 6:1-15

John 6 begins with the famous story of the multiplication of the loaves and fish, which is the only miracle of Jesus recounted in all four gospels. All four versions make an implicit connection with the eucharist, saying that Jesus "took, blessed, broke, and gave" the bread (the same four words used at the

Last Supper). Only John's version makes this connection even more clear by mentioning that "the Jewish feast of Passover was near."

We all know the general story: it was getting late; the crowd of 5000 were hungry; Jesus tells his disciples to feed them; they inform him there are only five loaves of bread and two fish; Jesus takes, blesses, breaks, and gives the loaves and fish; all are miraculously fed and there are even twelve baskets of leftovers. Only John's version ends by noting that when the people saw the "sign" he had done, they said, "This is truly the Prophet, the one who is to come into the world." And John adds that "since Jesus knew that they were going to carry him off to make him king", he withdrew alone to a nearby mountain.

This seems to be John's version of the so-called "messianic secret", whereby Jesus, during his earthly ministry, was hesitant to accept the title "king" (or "messiah"). Perhaps this was because the true nature of his "kingship" could not be fully understood until he had endured his suffering and death on the cross. Are we sometimes like the crowds from today's gospel, expecting Jesus to take care of all our needs and spare us from all suffering in life? Can we embrace the redemptive value of the crosses in our lives, trusting that through this Jesus draws us closer to his heart and leads us to new life?

1st Reading --- 2 Kings 4:42-44

The prophet Elijah and his successor, Elisha, were two of the earliest prophets in Israel's history, preaching in the northern part of Israel circa 850 BC. Their stories are recounted in the 1st and 2st book of Kings in the Old Testament. Not only did they preach against the idolatry of the kings and leaders of Israel, but they also performed miracles to back up their words. In today's reading from 2 Kings 4, a man brings 20 loaves of bread to Elisha, who tells him to give it to a vast crowd of people. The man objects that it is not nearly enough to feed them, to which Elisha responds, "Thus says the Lord: 'They shall eat and there shall be some leftover." And sure enough, the people ate and there were leftovers.

Clearly this story was chosen as foreshadowing of today's gospel reading. Both stories are reminders that our God is not stingy with his grace and love, but rather gives to us with overflowing abundance. The celebration of the eucharist (which means "thanksgiving" in Greek) is the Church's great prayer of thanksgiving which we offer together, to the Father, through the Son, in the Holy Spirit.

2nd Reading ---- Ephesians 2:13-18

As a reminder, the 2nd reading at Sunday Mass usually comes from one of the letters in the New Testament, especially those of St. Paul. Each letter is followed, chapter by chapter, over the course of several Sundays. Last week we heard from Ephesians 2 and its emphasis on Christ's role in breaking down all divisions and reconciling us with God and one another. Today's passage from Ephesians 4 continues this emphasis on unity. Paul urges us to "live in a manner worthy of the call we have received, with all humility, gentleness, patience, and love." In a famous verse he then lists seven facets of the Church's unity: "one body, one Spirit, one hope, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all." This unity is both God's gift to the Church and a continuing task for the Church. How can we be a sign and agent of God's reconciling love to the world if we are torn by our own inner divisions? Let us rededicate ourselves to Paul's emphasis on "humility, gentleness, patience, and love."
