THE DOCTOR IS IN



January 28 is the Feast Day of St. Thomas Aquinas. He is a Doctor of the Church and is thought by many to be the greatest mind in the history of the Church. For centuries his scholastic theology and philosophy have been taught in seminaries and Catholic universities.

Theology is the study about God. Prayer before the Blessed Sacrament gives us knowledge of God Himself. One is the academic study of love, the other is the warm experience of Love Personified. One may be likened to a book all about a person, while the other is that Person telling us firsthand all about Himself.

St. Thomas said it best a long time ago. He stated that he got more out of **one** Holy Hour of prayer before the Blessed Sacrament than what he learned from all of the books he ever read. He discovered more about His love by being in His Real presence, than all he ever wrote. All that has ever been written and said was as meaningless as straw, in comparison to the meaningfulness of a single personal encounter with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. 
TRUTH SETS CAPTIVES FREE! HAVE YOU OR A LOVED ONE BEEN DECEIVED & WOUNDED?

New Book Club Thursday January 27 9:30-11:30, in the Hospitality Room (Every Thur: 1/27 - 2/17)


Please join us for a book club review of "The End of the Present World and the Mysteries of Future Life" by <u>Conroy & Arminjon</u>.

It's one of those books that come out of nowhere - almost literally - just when the world needs it most. But a great saint - Thérèse of Lisieux - was so taken by this book that it spurred her entry into the convent. "Reading this book was one of the greatest graces of my life," she wrote in her autobiography. Completed in 1881 by an aged French priest, this remarkable book surfaced long enough to draw Thérèse into the convent and then, for more than a century, plunged back into obscurity.

Now the very first English translation of this hope-filled, chilling work has been published.

In it, Fr. Arminjon writes: "The end of the world, Christ says, will come when the human race, sunk in the depths of indifference, is far from thinking about punishment and justice." Fr. Arminjon insists that we "steer clear of every perilous opinion and make no assertion that is not justified by Tradition and the doctrine of the Fathers." Yet it's precisely his sober reliance on Scripture and Tradition that

makes this book so convincing and so chilling! But Fr. Arminjon doesn't merely sketch the darkness ahead: he also shows how Jesus will fill that darkness with light; and he details the rich bounty Christ has in store for all who stay faithful. This book will show you how to read the signs of the times and prepare you to bear vourself as a Christian (as it did Thérèse) ... no matter what the future holds!



The History of the Papacy --- Article 17 By Matt Pozen – Director of Faith Formation

Last week we looked at the changed situation of the Church after Emperor Constantine's "Edict of Milan" in 313 AD, which ended the persecutions and legalized Christianity in the Roman Empire. Constantine gifted Pope Miltiades (311-314 AD) with imperial resources, but in return he put the pope in charge of dealing with the Donatist schism that divided the Church in north Africa. During the reign of Pope Sylvester (314-335 AD) Constantine conquered his co-emperor in the east and became sole emperor. He decided to move the capital of the Empire from Rome, which was still majority pagan, to the new city of Constantinople in the east (modern Istanbul), which was majority Christian.



Unfortunately, Constantine's dream of a unified Empire bolstered by a unified Christian faith was

threatened by a major doctrinal controversy tearing the Church apart. The theological question at the root of the controversy was: If Christians, building on the Jewish faith, believe in ONE God, yet also believe that this one eternal God (the FATHER) also had an eternal SON (or WORD) who became flesh in Jesus of Nazareth, then did this not mean that they believe in TWO gods? (The controversy was not extended to the Holy Spirit until later in the 4th century). Were not Christians more like their pagan neighbors, who worshiped many gods, than their Jewish neighbors, who worshiped one God?

As a way of solving this conundrum, a brilliant presbyter in Alexandria (Egypt) named Arius began teaching that the Son/ Word was not as truly eternal and divine as the Father, but rather was created in time by the Father as his first act of creation, and then through this Son/Word the rest of creation came to be. After all, according to the creation story in Genesis 1, "In the beginning...God SAID: 'Let there be light, and there was light." In other words, God created through his spoken WORD, so this WORD must have existed before creation. Arius said that this WORD could not have been equally eternal and divine alongside God, for that would imply there are TWO gods. Rather, God first created his WORD, and then through this WORD he created everything else.

The other key biblical text in this controversy was from John 1: "In the beginning was the WORD, and the WORD was with God, and the WORD was God." (The Greek word John uses for "Word" is LOGOS, so this became known as the LOGOS debate.) Since Arius was convinced that to call the Word "God" would imply the existence of two eternal gods rather than one, he interpreted the word "beginning" as meaning that the WORD came to be "in time". To help common people to understand his complicated theological point, Arius came up with a simple jingle: "There was a time when the WORD was not." In other words, in relation to the line between Creator and creature, Arius argued that the WORD was on the creature side (with us) rather than on the Creator side (with God). Thus, when John 1 says that "the WORD became flesh" in Jesus, since this WORD is not fully divine then Jesus could not be fully divine.

The bishop of Alexandria, a man named Alexander, recognized the danger of Arius' teaching, so in 320 AD he condemned and deposed him. Alexander knew that from the earliest days of the Church believers had WORSHIPED Jesus as "Lord", alongside the Father, and if Jesus was not truly divine, as Arius taught, then this would make no sense. The problem was that, through his popular preaching and hymns, Arius had won over to his side many of the people in Alexandria. He also had connections with other bishops in the eastern part of the Empire, and they rallied to his side and condemned Alexander. This whole "Arian" controversy threatened to divide the Catholic Church and undermine Constantine's hopes for Christianity to be the unifying "glue" of his empire. So he appointed as his theological advisor a man named Hosius, the bishop of Cordoba in Spain. In 324 AD Hosius gathered a local synod of bishops at the city of Antioch in Syria, and together they condemned Arianism and its supporters.

Unfortunately, this local synod failed to win over many of the bishops in the east. Constantine recognized that a more general gathering of bishops was needed, so in 325 AD he summoned bishops from across his empire to the imperial palace at Nicea, just outside Constantinople. Due to the challenges of travel, only about 1/5th of the bishops were able to attend, around 300 total, and most of them were from the eastern part of the Empire. Only 10 bishops came from the west, and the bishop of Rome (Pope Sylvester) did not attend in person but rather sent two legates. This council came to be known as the first "ecumenical" council, from the Greek word for "general" or "worldwide". Constantine himself gave the opening speech, and he attended all the sessions of the council, which lasted about two months. The bishops wanted to do more than just condemn the teaching of Arius, they wanted to issue some kind of positive statement to clarify the issue of the divinity of the Son (Word). So they decided to compose a CREED, a brief and precise statement of the Church's faith. Next week we'll look at this Nicene Creed, issued by the Council of Nicea in 325 AD, which we still recite to this day at Sunday Mass.
