ADORATION – REST ASSURED SALVATION

Blessed be the Lord, who daily bears us up; God is our salvation. (Psalm 68:19)

And God gives us Sunday – To rest. Do not resist resting in God! Throughout the centuries, many saints have found their rest in God not only on Sundays but in adoration before the Holy Eucharist. St. John Bosco, founder of the Salesians and champion of orphaned children, put it simply but profoundly:

Do you want Our Lord to give you many graces? Visit Him often. Do you want Him to give you few graces? Visit him seldom. Visits to the Blessed Sacrament are powerful and indispensable means of overcoming the attacks of the devil. Make frequent visits to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament and the devil will be powerless against you. (St. John Bosco)

Tomorrow is the feast day of St. John Bosco. What a great priest! He knew how to laugh and make lighter the burdens of those with whom he came into contact. In fact, he was a good juggler and enjoyed playing ball and other games with the impoverished boys he educated.

But nothing took Him away from the seriousness of his mission: the salvation of these children's souls. When asked by his students how one could live a long and healthy life, St. Bosco's maxim consisted of four things: always have a clear conscience, eat in moderation, live an active life, and surround yourself with good companions.

What better companion is there to spend time with than Our Lord Jesus Christ!

What better thought can I have for my soul's profit than to humble myself completely in Your Presence, forever praising Your infinite goodness to me? (The Imitation of Christ, Book IV – On the Blessed Sacrament)


Educating on the Nature and Dignity Of Women


Please join us for a book club review of "The End of the Present World and the Mysteries of Future Life" by Conroy & Arminjon.

It's one of those books that come out of nowhere - almost literally - just when the world needs it most. But a great saint - Thérèse of Lisieux - was so taken by this book that it spurred her entry into the convent. "Reading this book was one of the greatest graces of my life," she wrote in her autobiography. Completed in 1881 by an aged French priest, this remarkable book surfaced long enough to draw Thérèse into the convent and then, for more than a century, plunged back into obscurity.

Now the very first English translation of this hope-filled, chilling work has been published.

In it, Fr. Arminjon writes: "The end of the world, Christ says, will come when the human race, sunk in the depths of indifference, is far from thinking about punishment and justice." Fr. Arminjon insists that we "steer clear of every perilous opinion and make no assertion that is not justified by Tradition and the doctrine of the Fathers." Yet

it's precisely his sober reliance on Scripture and Tradition that makes this book so convincing and so chilling! But Fr. Arminjon doesn't merely sketch the darkness ahead; he also shows how Jesus will fill that darkness with light; and he details the rich bounty Christ has in store for all who stay faithful. This book will show you how to read the signs of the times and prepare you to bear yourself as a Christian (as it did

The History of the Papacy --- Article 18 By Matt Pozen – Director of Faith Formation

Last week we began to look at the first "ecumenical" (worldwide) council in the Church's history, which was convoked by Emperor Constantine in 325 AD and met at his palace in Nicea, near Constantinople. (Notice that this first worldwide gathering of bishops was not organized by the Pope, but rather by the civil authority, the emperor --- which would be the case for the first seven ecumenical councils.) Constantine convoked this first ecumenical council in order to deal with the Arian heresy, which, in order to affirm the oneness of God, denied the true divinity of the SON. Only 10 bishops came to the council from the west, and the bishop of Rome (Pope Sylvester) did not attend in person but rather sent two legates. The bishops issued a condemnation of the heretical teaching of Arius, but in order to affirm the true divinity of the SON and clarify his relation with the FATHER they decided to compose a CREED, a brief and precise statement of the Church's faith. This became known as the Nicene Creed, and to this day we recite it every Sunday at Mass.



The early Creeds of the Church all followed a three-fold structure, articulating what the Church believes about the mystery and work of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. In the Nicene Creed the council greatly expanded the second section in order to clearly affirm the Son's divinity without sacrificing the oneness of God. It says: "I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only-Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages." It goes on to reiterate that he was "begotten, not made" in order to affirm that the Son was not "created" by the Father, but rather was born of his very essence and thus shares in his divine nature. Yet, unlike human parents who "beget" their child at a certain moment in time, the Son is "born" of the Father from all eternity, which the Creed calls "before all ages". Further, the council taught that the Son is "consubstantial with the Father", meaning that he shares with the Father the same divine "essence" or "substance". It was this truly divine and eternal Son who, "for us and for our salvation, came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man." Interestingly, the third and final section of the original Nicene Creed simply said, "We believe in the Holy Spirit", and it ended there. It wasn't until 50 years later, at the next ecumenical council (in Constantinople), that this section was expanded to affirm and clarify the true divinity of the Holy Spirit, and added the final verses on the "one, holy, catholic, apostolic Church, the forgiveness of sin, the resurrection of the body, and the life of the world to come."

After completing its Creed the council of Nicea ended by issuing a series of 20 "canons" (legal rulings on various practical matters), pertaining to the qualifications and conduct of clergy, the election of bishops, the goal of each diocese or region holding its own "synod" regularly, etc. One key canon decreed that the bishops of Rome, Alexandria, Antioch, and Jerusalem would hold a special place of authority in their regions and carry the title of "patriarchs". (The bishop of Constantinople would be added to this list later in the century.) At the end of the council all of the bishops except two signed its decrees. Constantine then exiled the heretic Arius, as well as the two bishops who refused to sign the council's decrees, thus setting the precedent of civil authorities issuing legal punishment for those who refused to consent to Church teachings. From ensuing events we know that some of the bishops who signed the decrees of Nicea did so while privately holding on to their Arian convictions, biding their time for a changed situation. Though Emperor Constantine favored and supported the Church in his realms, it was not until he was on his deathbed in 337 AD that he officially requested to be baptized, hoping this would ensure his dying in a "state of grace". Oddly, his chaplain who baptized him held Arian convictions, thus revealing the continuing influence of this heretical teaching.

After Constantine's death two of his sons jockeyed for power and ended up sharing it. Constans, who was an ardent Catholic and fully supported the decrees of the Council of Nicea, ruled the western half of the Empire. Constantius, a declared Arian, ruled the eastern half. The new bishop of Alexandria, a man named Athanasius, became the strongest and most vocal defender of the Nicene Creed. This put him at odds with the eastern emperor and some powerful Arian bishops. They gathered a regional synod in Antioch, deposed Athanasius, and then the civil authorities exiled him to the west. Thankfully, Athanasius was received with open arms by Pope Julius (337 – 352 AD), who then summoned the Arian bishops to a synod in Rome to resolve the issue. When they criticized the pope for receiving someone they had condemned, the pope and his synod ruled in favor of Athanasius. This raised a crucial issue: If one regional synod annuls the decrees of another, which action is valid? Next week we'll look at how Pope Julius responded to this tension between local autonomy and central authority. (This reminds me of the current tension in American politics between federal authority and states rights, or between state governors and local school boards.)


