Social Justice Ministry

Issue: Respect for the Planet's Resources

Crisis in Lebanon

Thank you for your continued support of Catholic Relief Services. Tuesday evening August 4, massive explosions shook the port of the capital Beirut, killing more than 100 people, injuring thousands and causing extensive damage. Search efforts are underway as many are feared to still be trapped under rubble. Catholic Relief Services —along with local partners—is assessing needs and supporting our sisters and brothers during the aftermath of this tragic incident.

HERE'S WHAT WE KNOW SO FAR:

EMERGENCY UPDATE: As search and evacuation efforts continue, there is increasing concern of potential food shortages and price increases. Lebanon is already suffering from an economic crisis, hosting more than a million Syrian refugees while battling the COVID-19 pandemic. 300,000 people have been displaced, and those who have been affected by the explosion are in immediate need of food, shelter, hygiene supplies and medical and psychosocial support.

CRS RESPONSE: Along with Caritas Lebanon, CRS is distributing emergency supplies, clearing rubble, and preparing medical and mental health teams for dispatch.
