
Welcome to August 8, 2021 Francis Assisi Parish

I know we're all tired of COVID, but I still encourage you be safe as you can. Masks are optional in church, and if you find it safer, please feel free to wear one.



A note from Fr. Ben...

Hello everyone! I know the last column about the Breviary might have seemed a little dry, but now that we've introduced this form of prayer and how it works, allow me to share *why* it is so good and highly encouraged for *all* to pray, not just priests, deacons, and seminarians. This is *Stuff I Learned in Seminary* #19: The Breviary (Part 2).

The beating heart of the Liturgy of the Hours is the Psalmody—the collection of psalms which make up the bulk of the prayer. The psalms are beautiful and highly valued for a number of reasons. They express a wide degree of human experience, emotion, and faithfulness, all in the context of giving glory, praise, thanksgiving, and adoration to God. One could argue they are some of the most "human" prayers in Scripture. In this, they have special value for priests because it is the duty of the priest to offer these prayers for the people of his parish, and the psalm might manifest something very real and relevant to someone, even if not the priest himself. A great example of this is in Psalm 88, prayed during Friday night prayer. This is the psalm of someone in great distress, containing such lines as "I call to you, Lord, all the day long... Lord, why do you reject me? Why do you hide your face? ... Friend and neighbor you have taken away: my one companion is darkness." This is a very raw prayer, and although I may not be personally feeling those emotions contained within the psalm on a given Friday night, I know that someone out there is experiencing this, and so I offer my prayer especially for them. Here's another big reason why the psalms are so great: these are the very same prayers that Jesus prayed. As a faithful Jew, Jesus knew these prayers well-we see him invoke Psalm 22 from the Cross, as He cries out "My God, My God, why have you abandoned me?" Praying the same prayers that our Lord prayed is a great way to grow closer to Him.

The Breviary is a beautiful way to sanctify the whole day, and even if you pray it alone, you can bet that someone, somewhere, is praying that same hour with you, be it morning, daytime, evening, or night. I highly encourage anyone who is interested to seek out either the one-volume or the four-volume set, and join me in this prayer of the Church!



SCRIP UPDATE:

As of July 1, we welcome Ann Altergott as our Scrip Coordinator. Ann is replacing Cindi Verch who has wonderfully served our parish in the Scrip program for many years. We gratefully thank Cindi for all she has done for our parish and school. Scrip is a crucial part of our ministry and discipleship here at St Francis of Assisi.

What is scrip you might wonder! Scrip is fundraising while you shop and you don't have to sell anything! Fundraising gift cards (scrip) are the same as regular gift cards. We purchase them at a discount, sell them at face value, and you redeem at face value. The difference is the rebate and that is used to support both the parish and the school.

This truly is a ministry where volunteers manage 85% (170 hours a week) of the program. We are always looking for more volunteers, from data entry, picking up at local businesses weekly, selling in the office, picking up at the elementary and middle school, to counting inventory weekly.
