

Dear Parishioners,

This Tuesday evening, we'll have a special Mass of remembrance for those who have lost loved ones during COVID (see this bulletin cover for details). I'm very much aware that many of our funerals were very limited during that time. I believe that sometimes those that are left grieving need another opportunity just to share the name of their lost loved one and to gather in prayer with others. So, Tuesday evening at 6:30 p.m. at the Grand site we will gather for a Mass of Remembrance to remember those loved ones who have passed away in the last couple of years. Feel free to come and bring a friend or neighbor who you know is grieving a lost one.

A note from Fr. George...

Disciple in the perspective of Mt. 5:13

Salt is good. Without salt, everything is insipid and tasteless. Jesus sketches out for a disciple a man He wishes His disciples to be: A disciple is the man of the Beatitudes. A man happy to be poor, meek, merciful, pure, persecuted, the peacemaker. This is what the Lord desires His disciples to be.

Jesus says, "If a disciple is of this type, then you are the salt of the earth." Then a disciple gives taste and strength to mankind, which is in constant danger of falling into tasteless mediocrity.

Mankind is to be saved only through disciples whose lives are fully orientated to the kingdom of God. Salt gives taste to everything it touches. Around disciples, what is happening, what is growing? Goodness, love, a taste for God? Or, on the contrary, is it bitterness, petty -mindedness, and mediocrity?

"If the salt loses its taste, with what can it be seasoned...thrown out...trampled underfoot." This is the responsibility of the disciples of Jesus Christ, to give taste to the world.

We are warned that a vocation to be a disciple may weaken and lose its vigor. God's call in us may get lost in tastelessness, after a certain period of generosity and dynamism. Jesus warns us that faith may get weakened.

In such a case, we are good for nothing. A good for nothing disciple is one who has lost his taste for God. He will be "thrown out" like the wedding guest who has not put on the wedding garment (Mt. 22:12) or like the lazy servant who has buried his talent (Mt. 25:30).

The Gospel is salt. Pay careful attention to what Jesus expects of His disciples: good deeds which is a way of life, and the good that a disciple does in his/her life.

A disciple lives for the glory of God.
