



#### A note from Fr. Doug...

Dear Parishioners,

The 4th Sunday of Advent gospel is the visitation, Mary greeting Elizabeth. As John the Baptist leaped in the womb of Elizabeth, in greeting Jesus in the womb of Mary, may we recognize Jesus moving in us as we approach Christmas. I encourage you to be about purposely planning so as to

more fully encounter Jesus this Christmas.

As you plan your Christmas, here are a few thoughts for you:

Question: Does Mass on December 25th at 4:00 p.m. count for both Christmas and Holy Family (weekend) Mass?

Short answer: NO, there are no "two-fers" (2 for 1) when it comes to these high holy Masses.

<u>Pastoral answer:</u> Christmas and Holy Family (Sunday Mass) are such great celebrations, that you can not limit it to just one Mass, so plan to come to one of each. Furthermore, did you know that Christmas is an octave (eight days)? Consider this when you think about coming to Mass during Christmas week.

If COVID and crowds worry you, carefully choose the Christmas Mass that you will attend. Our Christmas Eve 4:00 p.m. Masses are usually the most attended, so you may want to avoid them if crowds are a worry to you. Early Christmas morning 7:30 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. Masses will probably be the smaller crowds.

A few other notes to help you plan for Christmas at our parish:


- The designated overflow area for 4:00 p.m. Christmas Eve, is the parish hall at GRAND site. There is more space to spread out in there if you are worried about sitting too close to someone.
- There is NO 4:30 p.m. Christmas Eve Mass at Roncalli High School.
- Incense-free Mass will be the 4:00 p.m. Mass at Grand on Christmas Eve.
- 7:00 p.m. Christmas Eve Mass at Marshall is in Spanish. (Thank you Fr. Ben)
- Mary Mother of God (January 1st Holy Day) is non-obligatory because it falls on a Saturday. But why limit your prayer? (December 31st, 4:00 p.m. Mass at Waldo and January 1st, 9:00 a.m. Mass at Marshall site.)
- With the rise in COVID cases, masks are optional/highly recommended. As long as the COVID count is critically high, priests and deacons are going to wear masks in church, except for when they are in the sanctuary.
- If your health is compromised, or you live with someone whose health is compromised, I highly encourage you to carefully choose a Mass where there will be less people (not the 4:00 p.m. Mass) or you may choose to virtually attend instead of in-person.
- Christmas is an octave, do not limit yourself to just one day of celebration. Come to daily Mass through out the octave (eight days) of Christmas.
- Servers, lectors, greeters, and Eucharistic ministers are still needed! Avoid the rush, sign up now to help out at the Masses. (Go online to the ministry scheduler, or call Sue Krueger or Dcn. Mark Knipp at the parish office.)
- Most importantly, plan your time with Christ this Christmas.

I encourage you to continue to gather around the advent wreath for family prayer. As you light the 4th candle, let the light build the expectation of the Christmas lights and family gatherings. Share the greeting of Mary and Elizabeth and their expecting of Jesus and John the Baptist to patiently wait for Christmas.

St. Thérèse of Lisieux. I love her "little way" of striving for holiness (which is our first call) by recognizing our littleness and need for God's mercy and by doing small things with great love.

Visit our *gbvocations.org* for more information about the Adopt a Seminarian program. If you found yourself with half an hour of free time, what would you do during that time?

If I am in a place with people nearby (such as a formation house), I would go talk with them. Otherwise, I would read, journal, or watch television.

What is your favorite mystery of the rosary? The First Joyful Mystery — The Annunciation. I love this mystery because it commemorates the moment when God, the maker of heaven and earth, became one of us in the womb of the Virgin Mary. Another reason I love this mystery is that in it, Our Lady teaches us how to receive God.

If someone came to your hometown, what is one thing they would have to do and why?

My hometown, Bamba, is 30 minutes away from one of the hot springs in Burundi. If someone came over there, I would take them to the hot springs. Here in the U.S., I live in Oshkosh. If you ever come to Oshkosh, I suggest taking a boat ride from Lake Butte des Morts into the Fox River and into Lake Winnebago. It is a great way to see the city.

Briefly, how would you explain what happens at Mass to someone? At Mass, the story of salvation is retold and enacted. We are told about what the Lord did in the past with Israel, which culminates in Christ and the apostles. We participate in the saving death and life-giving resurrection of Christ through the consecration of the Eucharist, the offering of the Eucharist as a sacrifice, and the reception of Christ in the Eucharist. In the Mass, we have a foretaste of heaven by receiving the Eucharist which foreshadows our final union with the Lord in heaven and makes that present now under the veil of faith.

Explain how a priest helped you discern a call to the priesthood.

I have three priests who played a major role in my journey of discerning the priesthood. The first is Fr. Daniel Schuster. He was the vocation director for the Diocese of Green Bay when I was in high school. In his talks to discerners, he always emphasized that the first call is the call to holiness, the call to live in right relationship with God. That helped me — and still does — to stay grounded in my relationship with God as I discern his specific call for me.

Another priest who helped me is Fr. Adonis from Burundi. He invited me to receive baptism in the Holy Spirit and gave me a passage from the Gospel to pray with, through which the Lord drew me to consider a call to the priesthood. Lastly, Msgr. James Shea, my university chaplain, suggested that I get a spiritual director. I took his advice and started meeting with a spiritual director who helped me to grow in my relationship with the Lord and to discern a call to the priesthood.

How do you view a priest's relationship to the Blessed Mother?

On the cross, Jesus said, "Behold your mother." He said that to John, the "beloved disciple," who represented all of us, his disciples. Our call as disciples of Jesus is to gratefully receive the gift that Jesus offers us and to let the Blessed Mother be our mother. We should entrust ourselves to her, rely on her intercession, and ask her to teach us the ways of the Lord. A priest is called to do at least that. He should entrust himself to the Blessed Virgin so she can help him be the disciple that Christ wants him to be.

In addition, a priest should seek a closer relationship with Our Lady. In Genesis, the Lord said that it is not good for man to be alone and that he would make a helper fit for him. Given the priest's call to celibacy, the Blessed Mother is the helper fit for each priest, each in his unique way, to help him be the man Christ wants him to be for his church. A priest should invite the Blessed Mother into all of his life and ministry.

#### A note from Fr. Jason...

Dear Parishioners.

This weekend our Mass Gospel is the story of the Visitation of Mary to her cousin Elizabeth while she is six months

pregnant with John the Baptist. This got me thinking about the Rosary. During my Immaculate Conception homily I told the story of my conversion. Mary and the Rosary were an integral part of that conversion. In case you were not at my Mass, the short version is that in trying to date this one woman in college, I needed to start to practice my Christian faith again. By the way, things didn't work out with her. But, instead of getting a date I fell in love. I fell in love with Jesus Christ and His Church again. I had never really known how to pray daily so I started with the Rosary. It was daily prayer that solidified my conversion to Jesus Christ. Daily prayer is life-changing prayer. It was Mary who assisted my conversion to her Son with her prayers. It is like she tied my hand to Christ's hand with the Rosary, that I might never leave Him or His Church again.

While I was away for these past four months, I had additional time to pray that I don't have while in the parish. With this additional time, I made the Rosary a priority. Most days I prayed four Rosaries. In the parish I usually only have time to pray one Rosary a day. The four Rosaries were for the following: one for the parish of St. Francis of Assisi (for you), one for the priests of the Diocese of Green Bay, one for my family, and one for myself. I would rotate the intentions each day so that I would pray a different set of mysteries for those intentions.

With each mystery I prayed for specific things. The Visitation of Mary to her cousin Elizabeth before the birth of John the Baptist is the second joyful mystery. The intention that I prayed for you and me, is that we might have a greater love for our neighbors, especially in our relationships with our own family members.

We know we are called to love, especially our family, but it can be hard. Often the closer we are to a person the more trouble we can get into with them. I think the reason is that since we are closer to them we are with them more and have more opportunities to rub each other the wrong way. That is why I pray for a better relationship with our family members. We need all the graces we can get. Mary loved her cousin. She showed this love through a concrete act of love, the Visitation. We can always use the intercession of Mary so that we might have the best relationship we can with those we are closest to.

#### Moving of the Statues at SFA - Marshall Site Church

At the St. Francis of Assisi Parish Marshall site (previously St. Mary's), we are considering moving some statues so that the symbols on each of the side altars match the statues and to make a Mary Grotto area. We hope to make these changes in time for the January 1st, 2022, celebration of Mary Mother of God, 10:00 a.m. Mass.

- 1. Currently on the top of the high altar, front, center, is a St. Mary statue, which helps to connect to the old name of this site.
- 2. On the left side altar, currently is a statue of St. Joseph, which we would like to replace with a Sacred Heart of Jesus Statue to match the "IHS" symbol.
- 3. On the right side altar, is a St. Mary statue which we would like to place in a grotto where the old confessional was on the right side of the church. We would place the St. Joseph statue from the other side on the altar which would then match the "SJ" symbol.
- 4. In the old confessional area, on the right side, we make into a little Mary shrine area, placing our statue there, votive candles and kneelers. (Store the tables elsewhere.)
- 5. This would also align the wood statues on the wood altars and the Mary statue made of plaster, in the shrine area by itself.



The January 1, Solemnity of Mary collection basket, will be included in your 2022 contribution statement. The date of receipt by the parish is the determining factor, not the date of the check.

#### **REST IN PEACE**

Catholic cemeteries and mausoleums are reverent and prayerful places. They are adorned with special Christian symbols, monuments, and structures that make visitation a holy and serene experience. Choosing to be buried in a Catholic cemetery or entombed in a Catholic mausoleum is a way of remaining surrounded by the faith and members of the Church even in death. Just like the sacraments we receive throughout our life, such as Baptism, First Communion, Confirmation and Marriage, God is calling to be present with us at the completion of our life's journey.

Most importantly, Catholic mausoleums and cemeteries are reminders of the promise of the resurrection. We hear about this promise in the Gospel of John:

"I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me will never die." – John 11:25-26

As Catholics, we know that death is not the final destination. Instead, death is a transition to an even greater awakening that can only be realized in the presence of God. "Life has changed, not ended"




