If you found yourself with half an hour of free time, what would you do during that time?

Prudent me would like to spend it contemplatively or with those around me, but chances are I would be alone watching an episode of The Office.

What is your favorite mystery of the rosary?

The Third Joyful Mystery — The Nativity. This has been one of my favorite images for a while now of the sweet baby Jesus lying peacefully in the manger in the quiet night with Mary and Joseph looking lovingly back at him.

If someone came to your hometown, what is one thing they would have to do and why?

Technically, neither the National Shrine of Our Lady of Good Help nor the National Shrine of St. Joseph are in the city limits, so I cannot claim those as Green Bay "must sees." However, we do have a couple of good local burger joints, so if it is not a Friday in Lent, I would suggest going to either Kroll's or Al's Hamburgers.

Briefly, how would you explain what happens at Mass to someone? The Mass is the celebration of the victory Christ won on the cross for us. We gather in communion to not only fulfill our Third Commandment duty to keep holy the Sabbath, but also to praise God through song, personal and communal prayer, and sacred Scripture. During Communion, Jesus miraculously makes himself present to us in body, blood, soul, and divinity in the form of the bread and wine so that we can receive him and he can dwell within us for our salvation. The Eucharist is the centerpiece of our Catholic faith.

Explain how a priest helped you discern a call to the priesthood.

I have been blessed for the past nine years to have Fr. Mark Vander Steeg as our parish priest at St. Bernard's. Through different youth ministry events and trips in high school, Fr. Mark was able to plant in me the desire from God to grow in relationship with him and start considering possible vocations.

The culmination of this came during COVID-19 when churches shut down and public Masses were canceled. St. Bernard's was moving to an online format and Father approached me asking if I would be willing to help with reading and serving the livestream Mass. I said "yes," seeing the opportunity to be one of the few non-priests who would still be able to receive the Eucharist. However, as the weeks went on, I began to feel a constant tug on my heart that there could be a deeper reason behind why I am here and that maybe God was trying to invite me, through Fr. Mark's invitation, to discern a call to the priesthood.

How do you view a priest's relationship to the Blessed Mother?
We always hear that Mary loves little children. This is because when little children are scared, they, without hesitation, turn to their mothers and fathers. They surrender all their fear and trust into their parents' hands. Priests should have that same faith in our Blessed Mother. A priest, in particular, cannot then pretend they do not need a relationship with Mary or to ask for her intercession, because even Jesus gave himself to his mother's will.

When God kept Mary free from the stain of sin in St. Anne's womb and preserved her virginity so she could give God a human face and human heart to love us in his son, Jesus Christ, he had the plan for Mary to be the mother of us all. Therefore, we should go to Mary with all our struggles or fears as one would their biological mother so that she can bring them to the foot of the cross for us and lift all our burdens. As a priest, you need to constantly rely on Mary and Jesus to be able to properly take care of the souls of your parishioners because it is our duty to lead those souls to heaven. We need to love Mary as the mother that she is and remember that she is the Queen of Heaven and Earth and to treat her as such. Never fear loving Mary too much because Jesus loved her perfectly.



A note from Fr. Ben...

Dear Family, Merry Christmas!

I wish each one of you all the grace, peace, and joy of our Lord in this festive and sacred season! If you haven't read my column before, I like to use this space to share little nuggets that I gained from 8 years in the seminary. And so in honor of this special season, this is *Stuff I Learned in Seminary Part 24: "Xmas" Edition.* 

I used to think it was inappropriate to write "Xmas" instead of Christmas. I figured people did this to dissociate Christ from Christmas—which of course should never ever happen! And unfortunately yes, some people do have that intention, but it's actually really ironic. See, when I was in my first years of seminary and took a Greek class, I came across the origins of "Xmas" and was very surprised to learn it's actually an old school, traditional Catholic thing. Yes—ironically, the term "Xmas" was invented, used, and understood by Catholics! Let me explain:

So in Greek, "Christ" is "Χρίστος" (pronounced "Christos") and this used to be common knowledge among Catholics. Although, of course, not everyone knew Greek, they would at least know some select terms that were important for liturgy and used in church architecture. Speaking of church architecture, that might be a place where you have encountered this already—have you ever seen what looks like an overlaid "X" and "P"? At our church on Grand Ave, we have that at the top of what used to be the high altar. These are actually not the English letters "X" and "P," they're the first two Greek letters of "Χρίστος." Throughout the life of the Church, this was common shorthand for the name of Christ, and it had preferred usage over writing "Christ" because Greek is one of the three sacred languages—the other two being Latin and Hebrew. This practice of using the overlaid "XP" dates all the way back to the first centuries of the Church, when Christians were heavily persecuted. These early Christians would actually place subtle graffiti "XP" on structures to secretly direct other Christians to where underground communities were, or where Mass was being celebrated. They would also mark or etch this on the graves of early Christians, to identify them while still hiding from persecution. The use of "XP" has continued even to this day—I even put it on my ordination card!—but within the past 70 or so years, many people have forgotten or were never told what it means. Similarly, the use of "Xmas" ("Christ-Mass") to mark the celebration of Mass on the Nativity of our Lord had been introduced and used by Catholics since at least the 1500's, but the use and understanding of it was lost alongside the declined use of "XP." In my opinion this is unfortunate, and today the argument has become all backwards. "Xmas" was not invented by the secular world, and part of me wants to reclaim the term! It is, after all, referencing the name of Christ, which is holy and to be revered.

So by all means, go forth and text your friends "Merry Xmas." But also share with them the history behind the term "Christos" and the Greek letter "X."

Have a very Merry Xmas, friends!




#### **Prayer Shawl Ministry**
