

## **Epiphany Blessing 2022**

**V.** Let us pray. + Bless, O Lord God almighty, this home, that in it there may be health, purity, the strength of victory, humility, goodness, and mercy, the fulfillment of Your law, and thanksgiving to God the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. And may Thy blessing remain upon this home, and upon all who dwell therein. Through Christ our Indwelling Lord. **R.** Amen.

*Take the blessed chalk, and first write the initials of the three Magi, connected with Crosses, over the inside of your front door (on the lintel, if possible). Then write the year, breaking up the number so that two digits fall on either side of the initials. It should look something like this:*

**20 + C + M + B + 22**

*The “20” being the millennium and century; “22” the decade and year; “C” for the first Wise Man, Caspar of Tarsus, who brought the gift of myrrh; “M” for Melchior of Arabia, who brought gold; “B” for Balthazar of Ethiopia, who brought frankincense. Additionally, it is popularly believed that the Magi’s initials also stand for “**Christus mansionem benedicat**” (“**Christ bless this house**”).*

*The chalk markings remain over the door until **Pentecost**.*

**A note from Fr. Doug...**

Dear Parishioners.

Happy Feast of the Three Kings! What do the three gifts symbolize? **Myrrh** being commonly used as an anointing oil, **frankincense** as a perfume, and **gold** as a valuable. The three gifts had a spiritual meaning: gold as a symbol of kingship on earth, frankincense (an incense) as a symbol of deity, and myrrh (an embalming oil) as a symbol of death. The gold tells us that Jesus is King of the Universe. The incense names him high priest. The myrrh tells us that he came to die for us.

We recognize these as gifts as symbols that are telling us who Jesus is. Scriptures never tell us what Jesus did with these gifts, it does tell us that he fulfills the roles symbolized by the gifts. In other words, the gifts given to Him were lived out in His life. He opened and used the gifts he did not return them.

Speaking of returning gifts...have you returned any Christmas gifts? According to the National Retail Federation and Appriss Retail, retailers are expecting 13.3% of merchandise sold during the holiday season to be returned, equating to an estimated cost of \$101 billion. Reasons for returns are wrong size, wrong color, or just want to get something else. I am sure there are really many more gifts that are received and never used.

May we recognize not just our Christmas gifts that we received this year, but the gift of faith. Throughout the years, from whom have we received the gift of faith? Perhaps parents, grandparents, catechists, teachers, neighbors, or friends. Recall how we embraced that gift, as well as some that are perhaps sitting there unopened, unused. It is not a gift that you can return.


To whom have you given the gift of faith? Can you see that many have opened the gift and used it, and some have not. It is not a gift that is returned, it is just left unused, to be thrown aside. It is difficult to see the gift of faith passed on to many people who are not actively using them, but I try to not let that stop from using the gifts that I have received and passing them on.

Thank you for your gifts to the parish and also for those given to me personally. The St. Francis of Assisi community extends sincere appreciation for joining us in the celebrating of the true meaning of Christmas: Jesus' birth. I pray that this celebration continues to bring peace, hope, and love into your hearts during the Christmas Season and in the New Year. A special thank you to all our musicians and ministers for making this Holy Christmas Day special with their gifts of ministry and presence. Thank you also for your generous support of the parish, through your giving of donations and time.

I encourage you, on this feast of three kings, as you recognize the gifts they gave, recall the gift of faith we have received, and commit again to using and living your gift of faith. I also encourage you to be purposeful in passing on the gift of faith to others time and time again.

### If you found yourself with half an hour of free time, what would you do during that time?

I am one who likes to just relax, maybe with a cup of jasmine tea.

### What is your favorite mystery of the rosary?

The Fourth Glorious Mystery — The Assumption. Each mystery is its own treasure, but if I had to pick one, I would pick The Assumption, because it is the day I picked as my Marian consecration day.

### If someone came to your hometown, what is one thing they would have to do and why?

One thing Appleton is known for is the Performing Arts Center downtown. They put on high-quality shows, and the town likes to advertise it to visitors. If visitors come at the right time of the year, they could go to Mile of Music in the summer or Oktoberfest in the fall.

### Briefly, how would you explain what happens at Mass to someone?

The Mass is where heaven and earth come together. The Liturgy of the Word is where the word of God is proclaimed to his people. The word is opened to us through the homily where the priest or deacon shows the people how the readings relate to our lives today. The Liturgy of the Eucharist is where we remember the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus through the breaking of bread. The bread and wine become the body and blood of Jesus, whom we consume in this most precious sacrament.

### Explain how a priest helped you discern a call to the priesthood.

There were two priests who stood out to me in my discernment, the first being Fr. Quinn Mann. I did the missionary internship at Catholic Youth Expeditions and learned a lot about my faith and grew in my discernment. Fr. Quinn also taught me what it means to be a missionary disciple and a leader, as he led by example.

The other priest was Fr. Norman Krutzik. He was my regular confessor for a while until he passed away in 2020. He was always there whenever I needed him and, looking back, I want to do for others what he did for me. Fr. Norm also showed me what a priest is meant to be by his example, and it is something I hope to imitate. Both of these priests are examples that I would like to follow by how "in tune" they were with the Holy Spirit and how they were present to the people around them.

### How do you view a priest's relationship to the Blessed Mother?

On the cross, Jesus gave his disciples Mary as our mother, and every person has this precious relationship with her as a result. This is especially true for priests, seeing as they are *alter Christus* or "another Christ." As she does with all of the faithful, Mary loves her priests and walks with them in their daily lives. Jesus chose Mary to be the means by which he came to his people 2,000 years ago, and he chooses her again to come to his people through the priest.

Throughout my vocational discernment, Mary has been with me every step of the way, and I believe she guides all future priests to their ordinations whether they realize it or not. Mary's assistance does not stop at ordination. She loves her priests so much that she continues to help them conform themselves ever more to her son, Jesus. Mary gave herself completely to her children, and so it is only right that we give ourselves completely to Jesus through her. As such, it is important for all of us, but even more so for priests, to treasure this relationship and take it seriously. The role of the priesthood is not complete without Mary.



**A note from Dcn. Mark LeGreve...**

I'm back home from my trip to El Paso/Juarez and can say I am absolutely exhausted. Exhausted physically, psychological, emotionally, and spiritually. I'm glad I went and cannot encapsulate everything in a short note. There is good news and hope but there is also a tragic and complicated mess on our southern border. Some of my beliefs were reinforced and others were reframed. I fear that any words I type or say out loud will be misunderstood. Our world is filled with much fear and distrust fueled by a political division where actual dialogue is near impossible. Listening without responding is the unicorn of our current society. The one thing I am confident in is that the Holy Spirit is alive and well in the midst of chaos. People of little means and education are courageously making a huge difference in spite of immense obstacles. I am considering offering in the new year a small group presentation and discussion of what I experienced. Warning, you will not be comforted, but hopefully challenged in the words I have to say. I ponder, How many vocations to religious life and Priesthood are trapped in the chaos, corruption, and limited opportunity south of our border? How many people of great and awesome potential are trapped in the chaos, corruption, and lack of opportunity south of our border? What if we fear the migrant and stranger so much that we prevent the gifts and talents which God sends us from reaching us? Instead migrants on the wrong side of the border are sitting ducks for kidnapping into organized crime and human trafficking. It is hard for me to wrap my head around and align with my faith beliefs that anyone born outside our border is considered first a criminal and a threat to our country unless they are of extreme intelligence or wealth. It is hard enough to wrestle with this thought or statistic, but then even harder to look at actual migrants in their eyes and know that I am a citizen of what openly rejects them. Part of me continues to wrestle deeply with what I experienced and for this I am blessed. We all should wrestle with this. This is part of our spiritual migration towards our Creator. Please pray for migrants and those that fear migrants. I deeply trust in a God who can do all things balanced with the reality of our human nature to resist what God calls us all to do. All God ever asked was for us to love others as he loves us. Sacrificially, unconditionally, and unceasingly.






