A Note From Fr. Doug...

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend Father John Luong, OVM is glad to have the opportunity to visit our parish on behalf of Fellowship of Catholic University Students (FOCUS).

Fr. John Luong, OMV is a FOCUS National Chaplain and is a religious priest of the Oblates of the Virgin Mary (OMV). He was ordained in 2012 by Archbishop José Gomez in Hawaiian Gardens, CA. Prior to his role at FOCUS, he served for six years as Vocation Director for the OMV in Boston and six years as Parochial Vicar at St. Mary in Alton, IL.



FOCUS is a national organization serving college students at more than 232 campus/locations including eight international locations, 23 parish venues and nine digital expansion campuses. More than 970 FOCUS missionaries invite college students into a relationship with Christ and His Church, while equipping them for a lifetime of Catholic evangelization. Fr. September 29th is the feast of the archangels. Can you name the 3 archangels? Gabriel, Raphael, and Michael. Since we invoke Michael at the end of our Mass, here is some further insight about him. St. Michael the Archangel four Main Roles in Catholic Teaching (source: Catholic online) We recognize that St. Michael has four "offices" or roles.

- Leader of the Army of God: St. Michael is seen as the commander of heaven's forces, leading the angelic host in their battle against the powers of darkness. He serves as a model of spiritual warfare, reflecting the ongoing struggle between good and evil.
- **Angel of Death**: St. Michael is regarded as the angel of death, accompanying the souls of departed Christians to heaven. At the moment of death, he offers the souls an opportunity for redemption, thwarting the devil's attempts to claim them.
- **Weigher of Souls**: St. Michael is often depicted holding balanced scales, symbolizing his role in weighing souls during the Last Judgment. This signifies his involvement in the divine judgment of humanity.
- **Guardian of the Church**: St. Michael serves as the guardian of the Church and the Chosen People. Throughout history, he has been revered by military orders of knights and is considered the patron saint of various cities and countries.



It's Priesthood Sunday Sept 28-29th The Vocations Ministry asked our priests some questions...



Fr. Doug

Q. Who was the most surprised by your vocation/calling?

My parents. I was living in Minnesota for several years, working as a software engineer for a major computer firm, and they knew I was dating a wonderful gal. They didn't know much about my involvement at my parish and in my prayer life. On my visits back it was usually all about farming and family that I hadn't seen. I didn't talk about my discernment. After I decided to go to seminary, I came back one weekend to share the news with them. I think I caught them off guard and they just didn't know how to respond.

Q. How would you describe the vocation of priesthood to a non-believer?

Vocation of priesthood is like putting a job and marriage together in one. I guess growing up on the farm and seeing my folks living and working together all the time is an example of marriage and job being the same. In my vocation as a priest I am in a way married to the church and I work for the church. In the Catholic Church, priests are ordained, set apart for service to God. This ordination is often referred to as a "spiritual marriage" to the Church and is often used metaphorically to express a deep commitment and devotion to the Church and its mission.

Q. How (early) do you prepare for a homily?

Sunday homilies, I start on the Sunday before, reading and praying over the gospel. Lectio Divina. Usually on Monday I do Lectio on the first reading, then do some scripture background. On Wednesdays we have a homily help group that regularly meets. It gives me feedback on last week's preaching and thoughts about the gospel in the coming week. Then Thursday or Friday I try to put down my focus and main points. During the week in my daily ministry I am always looking for good examples that speak to the gospel. By Friday or Saturday I practice the homily a few times, usually out loud. I take this ministry seriously as that is the only time I get to break open the word with a large number of parishioners. For weekday masses I try to read the readings the night before, and spend my morning prayer time on one of the readings for mass.

Q. Who was the most surprised by your vocation/calling?

Me. I did not think I was mature or holy enough to be a priest nor did I want to be a priest. After experiencing the call, I did a 180. I was convinced God would make me holy enough and I could not imagine being anything else.

Q. How would you describe the vocation of priesthood to a non-believer?

I'd show them the Crucifix and explain the empty tomb. My vocation as a priest is to introduce or reintroduce people to Jesus, his life, his love, and his power.

Q. What's your favorite sacrament to celebrate?

Baptism. Everyone present is filled with joy! It also permanently reorients the life of the new Christian which can be explained by the acronym JOY: Jesus, others, you.


- Q. Who was the most surprised by your vocation/calling?

My favorite sacrament to celebrate is the Eucharist.

It's that time again! As we approach October, the month of the Rosary, it is also time for our monthly meeting. The Lord is with thee. Luke 1:28. Then, around 1050, the words from the visit with Elizabeth were added. Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. Luke 1:42. In 1261, Pope Urban IV added the name of Jesus to the end of Elizabeth's words. In 1555, St Peter Canisius published the final petition Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, and 11 years later, added Now and forever, Amen. Official approval was given in 1568. A beautiful prayer repeated 53 times when we recite the Rosary. It is a simple, beautiful, and focused meditation, especially when adding the mysteries.

I hope to see you all at the meeting on Tuesday, October 1st. Remember to bring a non-perishable food item for the St. Vincent DePaul pantry.


