Dear friends in Christ,

Each weekend, it seems, someone asks me if there is an update on the stained-glass windows in the church. You may recall that the plan has been to install stained-glass windows depicting angels in the sanctuary, on either side of the tabernacle, as well as a set of stained-glass windows in the Reconciliation room. As with so many things these days, production of the windows has been delayed, especially due to manufacturing slowdowns during the pandemic.

We do, though, have a new update and a projected timeline for installation of the windows! At the end of August, we heard from Br. Martin Erspamer, OSB, the Benedictine monk at Saint Meinrad Archabbey who designed the windows, that he has finished painting the panes of glass and delivered the individual window pieces to Emil Frei Studios in St. Louis. There, the panes of glass will be fired, assembled, and leaded before being ready to be brought here for installation. The best-guess estimate for installation is late October or early November.

These windows will be the final major piece of our church renovation project and will add a beautiful visual dimension to the church sanctuary. More updates will come as we hear the final timeline for delivery and installation.

The Bible is one of the greatest sources of inspiration. When we pray with the Bible, God touches and changes lives. Each student at Nativity receives a Bible when entering the sixth grade. This Bible is theirs to use each day of their sixth, seventh, and eighth grade school year. Having a personal Bible allows students to highlight passages that speak to them and make notes of reference in the scripture. These notes help connect students with God on a deeper level - both now and in the future when they review their highlighted passages and notes. The Catholic Youth Bible offers extra information, summaries, and a "Did you know?" section to further help students learn the Catholic faith. Having our students excited about reading the Bible and understanding how to use it is of utmost importance at Nativity.

"Pray it! Study it! And live it!" is the motto of Nativity's Middle School Religion classes. Our students make use of their Bibles in Religion class during their sixth through eighth grade years. Upon graduating from eighth grade, students will take their Bibles with them to use in high school and keep as a treasured memory of their faith journey.

The Catholic Business Network, an association of businesses and professionals devoted to supporting and developing Catholic education in the community, provided funds for Nativity to begin this unique program. A huge thank you goes out to the members of the Southside Business Network for their generosity in awarding Nativity with the \$2500 grant to purchase the Bibles to begin the program.



FAMILY FAITH FORMATION

Family Formation is a family-based catechetical program that helps families to grow in the transforming love of God by understanding and living the Catholic Faith.

Every first Sunday of the month students in Grades K-8 meet in classrooms in the school, divided by grade level, where trained catechists present the lessons. Parents gather in the parish center to learn about different aspects of the faith, engage in discussion with other parents, and receive that month's home lessons.

Through weekly Home Lessons, Family Formation helps parents pass on the Catholic Faith to their children and grow in faith and holiness.
