We begin this week with our annual **40 Hours Devotion**, Sunday, October 31, through Tuesday, November 2. If you have not already committed to a specific time of prayer on these days, I invite you to stop by the church whenever you are available to spend some time in quiet prayer in the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. This time of prayer can change your life!

You're also invited to join us for some special Masses this week – on Monday, November 1, at 6 pm, to celebrate **All Saints Day**; and on Tuesday, November 2, at either 8:30 am or 7 pm, to commemorate **All Souls Day**. Note that since it falls on a Monday, All Saints Day is not a day of obligation this year, but we will continue to have Mass. And at the evening Mass on All Souls Day, as we conclude our 40 Hours Devotion, we will remember and pray in a particular way for our parishioners who have died over the past year. I invite you to join us.

Finally – don't forget about the opportunities to volunteer at this year's NCYC (National Catholic Youth Conference), to be held here in Indianapolis November 18-20. A link to the volunteer sign up portal can be found on our parish website.

NATIVITY ST. VINCENT DE PAUL FISCAL YEAR UPDATE

Our Nativity St. Vincent de Paul Conference completed its fiscal year at the end of September. Below are some highlights from our team: Collections from you -our supporters were **\$13,079**.

We provided home visits (most were virtual due to pandemic) to 74 families, helping about 229 family members in total per below:

- Financial aid (for assistance with utilities, rent, shut-off prevention, etc.): **\$6,499**
- Direct cash outlay for items (Bedding, washer/dryer, hotel stays, Christmas, etc.) **\$3,811**
- Donations to SVDP Food Pantry, Good Shepherd SVDP, a Mission 27 fund raiser: **\$4,982**
- Kroger gift cards purchased to help our many families in need: **\$ 950**

In kind goods provided to above families in need from Mission 27 warehouse: (estimated values below)

Furniture: 8 families \$ 800

Clothing: 10 families \$1,000

Misc. household goods: 13 families \$1,300

We sent 10 families to the Catholic Charities Christmas Store where each child receives gifts and the family gets one overall present.

We also had 7 investigators participating in our Changing Lives program collaboration with St. Jude in the spring of 2021 when it was interrupted by Covid complications. We hope to resume this program in 2022.

Thank you for your past support and prayers and please continue to help as we are now getting more calls for help than ever.

Also, know that shopping the Mission 27 thrift stores and donating goods to these stores (including our annual fall collection), provide financial support for the Food Pantry and the Changing Lives program. To donate items, please call 317-687-1006 and schedule a truck for pick-up.

NATIVITY CATHOLIC SCHOOL

Nativity School students are learning about Dia de los Muertos (Day of the Dead) in their homerooms, PE, Art, Music, Technology, STEM, REACH, and Library.

One of the important parts of the holiday is making altars (ofrendas). In memory of the departed, these altars are covered with pictures, candles, flowers, and cavaveras (sugar skulls). Seventh grade students will be making their own sugar skulls to place on the altar as a reminder of the cycle of life and death. Students in other grade levels will be making lighted flowers and other decorations to place on the altar.

Nativity school families are decorating a Remembrance frame and attaching a photo of a deceased loved one(s) in the center. These posters will be hung up surrounding the Day of the Dead ofrenda in the entry by Door #1.

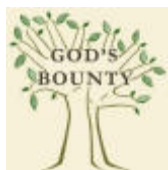

FAMILY FAITH FORMATION

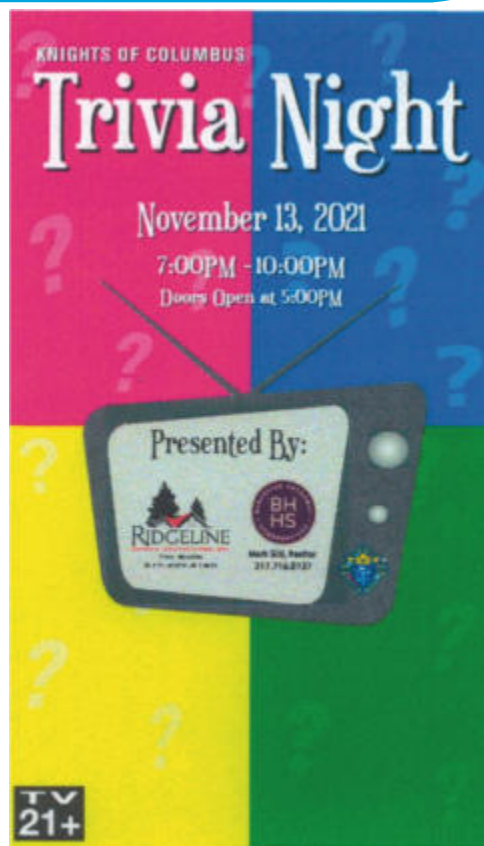
This year we are trying a new approach to religious education!

Family Formation is a family-based catechetical program that helps families to grow in the transforming love of God by understanding and living the Catholic Faith.

Every first Sunday of the month students in Grades K-8 meet in classrooms in the school, divided by grade level, where trained catechists present the lessons. Parents gather in the parish center to learn about different aspects of the faith, engage in discussion with other parents, and receive that month's home lessons.

Through weekly Home Lessons, Family Formation helps parents pass on the Catholic Faith to their children and grow in faith and holiness. 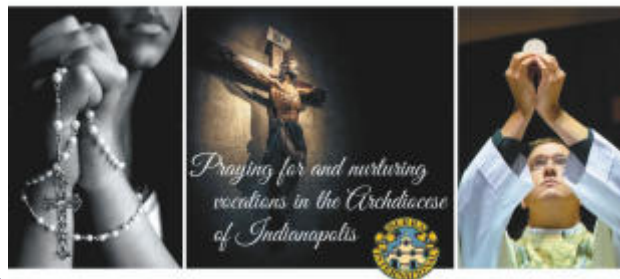

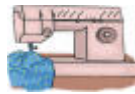
PRAYER SHAWL MINISTRY
