REACHING IN, REACHING OUT, REACHING GOD

Father Gerry's "CAP"-TIONS

These past weeks across the United States we have seen the violent impact of what guns can do to destroy lives which tears at the heart and fabric of human society where every life is sacred in the image and likeness of God. In the face of the latest tragedies Catholic-Christians are called to support Gun Control. Gun Control is a Pro-Life Issue.

Father James Martin, S.J. wrote back in 2012: "Gun control is about the defense of life. Those who consider themselves religious or pro-life must be invited to see that the desire to prevent gun-related deaths is part of the religious defense of the dignity of all life. To put the matter bluntly, if one is in favor of protecting the unborn—and advocate for them, march in protest on their behalf, donate money to pro-life groups and encourage voting for legislators who protect the unborn—one should be equally in favor of protecting those lives out of the womb, throughout life, at every walk and stage of life (partial paraphrased sentence).

"Many of my political opinions, then are formed by my religious ideals: for example, a commitment to help the poor and marginalized, a desire for a peaceful world, and a respect for the sanctity of life from natural conception to natural death. That is why I believe that gun control is a religious issue. It is just as much what many religious people call a "life issue" or a "pro-life issue," as is abortion, euthanasia or the death penalty (all of which I oppose), and programs that provide the poor with the same access to basic human needs as the wealthy (which I am for). There is a "consistent ethic of life" that views all these issues as linked, because they are. No matter who the person is, no matter at what stage of life the person is passing through, and no matter whether or not we think that the person is "deserving" of life, God gives life to every person, and that life is holy."

God is good, all the time!

May God's love and grace abide with you this week!
