Father Gerry's 'CAP'-TIONS

Friends in Christ, Our Bread of Life! Today is the Solemnity of 'The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ' within the Catholic Church, traditionally known as 'Corpus Christi'. The Holy Eucharist is the central mystery of our faith which gathers us weekly around the Table of the Lord to be nourished and fed on the Bread of Life and the Cup of Blessing, the Body and Blood of Christ. It is a time of Thanksgiving for the Life we share as one as the Body of Christ. What we receive at the Table is what we are to become for each other. We become the 'Bread of Life' and the 'Cup of Blessing' for each other and our world. The love of Christ Jesus in our relationships is what the world most needs, and what most needs to be fulfilled in our lives.

Henri Nouwen, from <u>Bread for the Journey</u>, (1997) reflected on 'The Intimacy of the Table' where he wrote: "The table is one of the most intimate places in our lives. It is there that we give ourselves to one another. When we say, "Take some more, let me serve you another plate, let me pour you another glass, don't be shy, enjoy it," we say a lot more than our words express. We invite our friends to become part of our lives. We want them to be nurtured by the same food and drink that nurture us. We desire communion. That is why a refusal to eat and drink what a host offers is so offensive. It feels like a rejection of an invitation to intimacy.

"Strange as it may sound, the table is the place where we want to become food for one another. Every breakfast, lunch, or dinner can become a time of growing communion with one another."

The reception of the Holy Eucharist, the Body of Christ, is our desire and commitment to become what we eat. May our longing for Jesus, the Bread of Life, be our Food for the journey, thereby becoming Food, the Bread of Life for each other and our world.

God is good, all the time! May God's love and grace abide with you this week! Fr. Gerry
