

Breaking Open the Word December 26, 2021 Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph Lectionary: 17 Gospel LK 2:41-52

Spiritual Reflection: Today's Gospel teaches us that being sinless and not making mistakes are two different things. The Blessed Virgin Mary and St. Joseph make a mistake and "misplace" Jesus for a while. They also demonstrate to us how to handle a family crisis without turning it into a sinful situation. All three members of the Holy Family remain respectful of each other in their moment of crisis.

- 3. What would this story look like in your family?

Encharistic ADORATION


"My heart sings for joy, and overflows with gladness, for the Lord my Savior is born!"

Youth Ministry Update

Our young people are the future of our parish, bringing new gifts and inspiration to so many with great energy and enthusiasm. And because they are so unique, they need to be supported and given a voice that is inspired by the Holy Spirit, a voice that will be louder than the noise of this world.

As we begin the new year, I would like to invite the teens of our parish to join me on a seven-week journey called the Search: The Search is an innovative video series that tackles the key questions of every human heart. In seven beautifully filmed episodes, Chris Stefanick, and experts from multiple fields of science, medicine, psychology, art, and religion examine our place in the larger story of existence. Whether you're a practiced inquirer or a jaded skeptic, The Search will speak to you. You may be reassured by some parts and challenged by others. Either way, you'll find a lot here to think about. And when all is said and done, life's questions demand to be answered. Are you ready for The Search?

Our journey will begin on January 9th in the Parish Center after the 5:00 pm

Mass. We will begin with dinner around 6:15 pm followed by games and then the Search program which will end around 8:00 pm. I firmly believe that this program and the adults assisting me will help all those who attend come to discover the joy

of being a disciple of Christ. Parents, if your child has not been to youth group in a long time, please consider inviting your teen(s) to attend at least one session. Ultimately, we (the Church and parents) desire the same thing for your teen - happiness.

Looking for a Youth Minister

As was announced last weekend, Maggie Schurz, our youth minister, has taken a job as a campus minister at a local Catholic High School. We are now looking for someone to fill that role. Do you want to be an integral part of bringing young people to a personal relationship with Christ? Do you want to develop the disciples for the future of the church in St. Louis? If so, we want to talk to you. We have an immediate opening for a fulltime youth minister. The position is responsible for assisting the high school and junior high teens of our parish on their faith journey by sponsoring weekly programs, planning, and executing annual retreats, summer camps and ministry fund raising events. You will be an advocate for the youth and their leader, encouraging each of them to a deeper relationship with Christ and in their engagement as active parishioners at St. Joseph. You will be responsible for recruiting and training adult volunteers to assist you with this mission and will work alongside parish priests coordinating the Confirmation preparation program for the parish. If you are still in school, we are willing to discuss this position now and consider a June 2022 hire date, if needed. 

Spiritual Ponderings
Through the Heart of St. Joseph

It is my hope that these reflections on St. Joseph, inspired by the book *Through the Heart of St. Joseph* by Fr. Boniface Hicks OSB, help us experience both Advent and Christmas with a new sense of awe. Quotes from Fr. Hicks's book will be in bold and my commentary will be in the normal font.

The Magi teach us how to find St. Joseph: With our eyes raised to the heavens, let the noise of the world fall away and let the advice of worldly power slip into the background then proceed in silence, led by the passion of the heart toward the most unlikely place, a little house where we find a humble man guarding his little family. St. Joseph is more readily found by those who choose silence because he himself was a man of silence.

Fr. Boniface, before this quote, has a good section about how the Magi needed to stop in Jerusalem in order to find Jesus because they took their eyes off the heavens and assumed that they in someway knew better. He goes on to point out that Herod encourages them to search diligently for the Christ child but not in a holy way. Herod was encouraging lying, gossiping, etc. It is only when they look up to heaven and approach the Holy Family in silence that they are not only able to find the Christ-child (with Joseph and Mary) but also discern God's will for them not to return to Herod. When we want to find God, it is important that we take time to be silent.

But the most important witness St. Joseph gave was not with words, and so no words of his are quoted in Scripture... St. Joseph's more important witness was through his actions and through his presence.

St. Joseph is a great example that we can evangelize through our actions. I do not believe St. Joseph was a mute, but I do believe that his actions spoke louder than his words.

As Pope Francis said: "Joseph is certainly not passively resigned, but courageously and firmly proactive. In our lives, acceptance and welcome can be an expression of the Holy Spirit's gift of fortitude. Only the Lord can give us the strength needed to accept life as it is, with all its contradictions, frustrations, and disappointments.

Pope Francis I think hits on a major highlight of St. Joseph's life. Joseph is a planner in the sense that God can give him a task and he will set about doing it to the best of his ability. He is also at the same time capable of placing his plans aside and doing things God's way if his and God's way differ. We should discover the best way to serve God but at the same time be willing to change if He calls us in a different direction.

Pope Benedict XVI assured us that "Joseph fulfilled every aspect of his paternal role. He must certainly have taught Jesus to pray, together with Mary." At least we know that Jesus's love for St. Joseph always led Him to lift His Heart to His Father in Heaven. Surely that was true in a special way when the eyes of Jesus as a little boy looked in love at his dear father in prayer.

It is so important for parents to practice their faith with their children and help teach them the truths of the faith. It is very unlikely that a child will remain a practicing Catholic if his or her parents are not practicing. The following quotes from the Catechism speak of this important duty:

"Parents have the first responsibility for the education of their children. They bear witness to this responsibility first by creating a home where tenderness, forgiveness, respect, fidelity, and disinterested service are the rule. The home is well suited for education in the virtues. This requires an apprenticeship in self-denial, sound judgment, and self-mastery—the preconditions of all true freedom. Parents should teach their children to subordinate the 'material and instinctual dimensions to interior and spiritual ones.' Parents have a grave responsibility to give good example to their children. By knowing how to acknowledge their own failings to their children, parents will be better able to guide and correct them." (CCC 2223)

"Education in the faith by the parents should begin in the child's earliest years. This already happens when family members help one another to grow in faith by the witness of a Christian life in keeping with the Gospel. Family catechesis precedes, accompanies, and enriches other forms of instruction in the faith. Parents have the mission of teaching their children to pray and to discover their vocation as children of God. The parish is the Eucharistic community and the heart of the liturgical life of Christian families; it is a privileged place for the catechesis of children and parents." (CCC 2226)

If you think you are unworthy to teach the faith to your children, then imagine how St. Joseph must have felt. St. Joseph does it though because he trusts God and loves his Son.

other human family, the Holy Family had to confront real and concrete challenges. Yet, 'in every situation, Joseph declared his own 'fiat" (PC 3). His 'yes' to the Lord meant that regardless of the hardship and personal sacrifice to himself, he consistently chose to put the needs of Mary and Jesus before his own. Joseph's devotion helps reveal to us our own call to show special care for the lives of those whom God has entrusted to us."

Did You Know...

As we get close to ending this year we wanted you to be aware of ways that you can make donations to the church and possibly get a tax advantage.


We always encourage you to sign up for Electronic Offertory. This is an easy way to set up your regular giving

to the parish and can be set up on any schedule you wish. You can scan the QR CODE above to go directly to WeShare to set this up. If you're a little unsure of how to do this, contact Jim or Katie at the parish office and they will be happy to help you. One and done!

Though we ask that you discuss the following with your tax advisor, there are ways that you may, even if you no longer itemize your taxes, get some tax advantage with these donations:

- The CARES Act set up a deduction for individuals who do not itemize for their taxes in 2021. "The law now permits these individuals to claim a limited deduction on their 2021 federal income tax returns for cash contributions made to certain qualifying charitable organizations. These individuals, including married individuals filing separate returns, can claim a deduction of up to \$300 for cash contributions made to qualifying charities during 2021. The maximum deduction is increased to \$600 for married individuals filing joint returns."
- 100% limit on eligible cash contributions made by itemizers in 2021. "The law now
 permits electing individuals to apply an increased limit ("Increased Individual
 Limit"), up to 100% of their AGI, for qualified contributions made during calendaryear 2021. Qualified contributions are contributions made in cash to qualifying
 charitable organizations."

- Many parishioners who no longer itemize have found some tax benefit when making donations with Required Minimum Distributions (RMD), or using Charitable Fund Distributions or Stock Sales.

Again, we encourage you to talk to your tax advisor to determine the method best for your particular situation. And as always, we appreciate your prayerful generosity and all you do to provide for the mission of St. Joseph Parish.





We will also continue to broadcast our 11am Mass into the parking lot over the radio and bring communion to your cars.


I have asked all staff to have a mask handy, so if you would like to speak to a staff person and they are not wearing a mask, simply ask them to put one on.




