

Breaking Open the Word January 2, 2022 The Epiphany of the Lord Lectionary: 20 Gospel MT 2:1-12

Spiritual Reflections: In her book, A Contemplative Reading of the Gospel Mathew: The Journey Toward Hope, scripture scholar Elena Bosetti writes the following: "Where is the newborn king of the Jews?" the Magi asked (2:2). And by asking where, they announce that he is born. The Good News comes from afar. A tragic paradox ensues. Instead of producing joy and feasting, the news of the birth of the King causes anguish and agitation in Jerusalem. Not only Herod but the entire city is disturbed. The account dramatically anticipates the story of the passion."

Spiritual Questions:

- 1. Why did the announcement of "the newborn king of the Jews" cause so much anguish and agitation in Jerusalem?
- 2. Why does the acknowledgement of Jesus cause so much anguish and agitation in our world today?
- 3. What bothers people most about Jesus?
- 4. Who are the people in your life who help you find Jesus?
- 5. What are some other similarities between the coming of the magi and the passion?



Safe Environment Program Reminder

Are you a volunteer at St. Joseph or planning to volunteer? Please remember that all volunteers who work with children or vulnerable adults must be in compliance with the Safe Environment Program of the Archdiocese of St. Louis.

The Archdiocese developed a new system in 2021 for Safe Environment compliance called Prevent and Protect STL.

Everyone (clergy, employees and volunteers) ministering to minors and vulnerable adults in the Archdiocese is required to register in the new system and complete additional online requirements including registering for a background screening, viewing two online training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethical Conduct, and agree to the updated Code of Conduct by signing a digital copy. For those who have already attended a Protecting God's Children workshop, your previous training date will transfer to this new system. You will not need to repeat that class. Fr. Thomas Pastorius Spiritual Ponderings Atomic Habits

Archbishop Fulton Sheen in his writings stresses the fact that the theme of John the Baptist's preaching, Jesus's preaching and St. Peter's preaching on Pentecost could be summarize in the word "repentance." The word that is translated into English as "repentance" is the Greek word "Metanoia" which literally means "put on a new mind" or "adopt a new way of thinking." For example, the monk Copernicus introduced a new way of thinking when he theorized that the sun was the center of the solar system and not the earth. People changed the way they were thinking and began to look at the world in a new way. As Catholics we believe that we are called to change the way we think. For many, we begin by thinking that to be like God is to be all powerful, always in control, and always getting our way. Jesus on the other hand showed us that we need to think of God as all loving, always respecting our free will, and always sacrificing for us out of love. Catholics therefore have to rethink what it means to be like God and change our behaviors accordingly.

Changing our behaviors is not always easy. In fact, most of the time it is extremely difficult. In order to improve my own life both spiritually and physically, I began reading the book *Atomic Habits: Tiny Changes, Remarkable Results* by James Clear. For the month of January, I would like to share with you some insights from his book (which will be in bold) and some of my personal reflections (in normal font) with the hope that they will help us answer God's call to repent.

A habit is a routine or behavior that is performed regularly—and, in many cases automatically. We all have habits. Some of the habits we have are good and some of the habits we have are bad. The first thing we must do is to become aware of our habits. The second thing we must do is realize what is behind our habits. For example, if I have the bad habit of cussing people out who cut me off in traffic, I can come to realize that I cuss people out because I feel like they seem to feel that they are more important than I am or they are being careless with something that is important to me (my life). Once I realize why my habit happens, I can start trying to stop my bad habit by reminding myself that my cussing will not have any real effect on the other person. Instead, I can do something more productive like say a prayer for that person.

We all face challenges in life. This injury was one of mine, and the experience taught me a critical lesson: changes that seem small and unimportant at first will compound into remarkable results if you're willing to stick with them for years. We all deal with setbacks but in the long run, the quality of our lives often depends on the quality of our habits. With the same habits, you'll end up with the same results. But with better habits, anything is possible.

This quote reminded me of a story about two boys with an alcoholic father that I have found on different websites:

There's an old story about two boys who had a father who was an alcoholic. They grew into young men. One son became an alcoholic. "What choice do I have?" he said. "My father is an alcoholic." The other son never touched a drop of alcohol. "How could I?" he said. "Look what it did to my father."

The sons' attitudes cannot change the fact that their father was an alcoholic, but their attitudes can affect what they do with that information. It is sometimes necessary for us to step back and see how our attitudes in different situations are holding us back. Some people refer to them as self-fulfilling prophesies.

When I was an associate there was a staff member at one of the parishes I was assigned to that drove me crazy. Every thing about this coworker showed me that he or she believed in things that I thought were anti-Catholic and I believed we would never get along. I was reminded though through the scriptures at Mass that I was supposed to love my enemies and pray for those who persecuted me. I asked God to help me us positive sentiment override to deal with this person. The idea is simply the more positive feelings you feel toward someone the more you will put up with the negative qualities of the person. I therefore made it the HABIT of thanking God for three things each time I met with this person. Our relationship did improve and we were able to work together. We never became good friends but we were able to work together on the same team.

The backbone of this book is my four-step model of habits—cue, craving, response, and reward—and the four laws of behavior that evolve out of these steps.

Growing up I suffered from depression and many of the counselors I met with told me that I had to just "tough it out," but they never told me how to "tough it out." Thanks be to God that when I was in the seminary, I was introduced to counselors who helped me figure out how to manage my depression like a diabetic learns to manage his or her blood sugar. One of the things that I like about the Atomic Habit book, is that James Clear, the author, offers a clear process of how to make good habits stick.





También, nos explica sobre la participación de los magos del Oriente y lo que ellos representan. "Los Magos, venidos de Oriente, representan a todos los pueblos lejanos de la fe judía tradicional: se dejan guiar por la estrella y se enfrentan a un largo y arriesgado viaje; se postran ante Jesús y le ofrecen regalos simbólicos: oro, incienso y mirra; la búsqueda del Señor implica también la generosidad del corazón" (1/6/2019). ¿Qué le estoy ofreciendo a Jesús en esta etapa de mi vida? ¿Qué tipo de manifestaciones he tenido de Dios a lo largo de mi vida? Pidamos, en esta Eucaristía, que la luz de Cristo se manifieste en estos tiempos turbulentos y oscuros que experimentamos en el mundo entero. Sigamos vigilantes, caminemos por sendas nuevas, sigamos el ejemplo de los Magos. Ellos, regresaron a su país por otro camino.

We will also continue to broadcast our 11am Mass into the parking lot over the radio and bring communion to your cars.


I have asked all staff to have a mask handy, so if you would like to speak to a staff person and they are not wearing a mask, simply ask them to put one on.




