

Lectionary: 21 Gospel MK 1:7-11

#### **Spiritual Reflections:**

In her book, <u>A Contemplative Reading of the Gospel of Matthew: The Journey Toward Hope</u>, scripture scholar Elena Bosetti writes the following: John was not a pompous, arrogant preacher who spoke from on high to those beneath him and of whom it was not permitted to ask questions. Luke makes us see that the people questioned him. And the austere prophet of the desert had ears for everyone: for the crowd, but more particularly for the publicans—kept at a distance by the spiritual leaders of Judaism—and even for soldiers.

#### Spiritual Questions:

- 1. How do you think John the Baptist was able to remain humble despite the fact that his birth was announced by an angel and people expected great things from him?
- 2. Why did the Jewish people at the time of John the Baptist feel that it was important to exclude people?
- 3. Why do people exclude others today?
- 4. Who are the people that we need to reach out to today?
- 5. How do you tell people about Jesus? Would people say your style is similar to John the Baptist's?

#### Youth Ministry Update

Our young people are the future of our parish, bringing new gifts and inspiration to so many with great energy and enthusiasm. And because they are so unique, they need to be supported and given a voice that is inspired by the Holy Spirit, a voice that will be louder than the noise of this world.

As we begin the new year, I would like to invite the teens of our parish to join me on a seven-week journey called the Search:

The Search is an innovative video series that tackles the key questions of every human heart. In seven beautifully filmed episodes, Chris Stefanick, and experts from multiple fields of science, medicine, psychology, art, and religion examine our place in the larger story of existence. Our journey will begin on January 9th in the Parish Center after the 5:00 pm Mass. Parents, if your child has not been to youth group in a long time, please consider inviting your teen(s) to attend at least one session. Ultimately, we (the Church and parents) desire the same thing for your teen – happiness.

#### Looking for a Youth Minister

As was announced a couple weeks ago, Maggie Schurz, our youth minister, has taken a job as a campus minister at a local Catholic High School. We are now looking for someone to fill that role. Do you want to be an integral part of bringing young people to a personal relationship with Christ? Do you want to develop the

disciples for the future of the church in St. Louis? If so, we want to talk to you.

We have an immediate opening for a fulltime youth minister. The position is responsible for assisting the high school and junior high teens of our parish on their faith journey by sponsoring weekly programs, planning, and executing annual retreats, summer camps and ministry fund raising events. You will be an advocate for the youth and their leader, encouraging each of them to a deeper relationship with Christ and in their engagement as active parishioners at St. Joseph. You will be responsible for recruiting and training adult volunteers to assist you with this mission and will work alongside parish priests coordinating the Confirmation preparation program for the parish.

#### **Safe Environment Program Reminder**

Are you a volunteer at St. Joseph or planning to volunteer? Please remember that all volunteers who work with children or vulnerable adults must be in compliance with the Safe Environment Program of the Archdiocese of St. Louis.

# The Archdiocese developed a new system in 2021 for Safe Environment compliance called Prevent and Protect STL.

Everyone (clergy, employees and volunteers) ministering to minors and vulnerable adults in the Archdiocese is required to register in the new system and complete additional online requirements including registering for a background screening, viewing two online training modules on abuse reporting and the Code of Ethical Conduct, and agree to the updated Code of Conduct by signing a digital copy. For those who have already attended a Protecting God's Children workshop, your previous training date will transfer to this new system. You will not need to repeat that class. Fr. Thomas Pastorius Spiritual Ponderings Atomic Habits

In his book *Atomic Habits: Tiny Changes, Remarkable Results*, James Clear lays out a plan to assist his readers to develop good lasting habits that will help them become better people. I would like to share with you some insights from his book (which will be in bold) and some of my personal reflections (in normal font) with the hope that they will help us answer God's call to repent.

If you're having trouble changing your habits, the problem isn't you. The problem is your system. Bad habits repeat themselves again and again not because you don't want to change, but because you have the wrong system for change. You do not rise to the level of your goals. You fall to the level of your system.

Growing up, I played CYC baseball until I entered high school. I was a horrible hitter until my eighth grade year. The summer between seventh and eight grade, I went to a high school summer camp. One of the sessions that I rotated through was focused on baseball. The coach leading this session pulled me aside and showed me a different way to hold the bat and how to swing my body around faster. These little tips helped me become a much better hitter. My CYC coach was just not equipped to help me like the high school coach was. Sometimes we need to find the right coach, prayer group, counselor, friends, in order to make it to the next level.

The process of building a habit can be divided into four simple steps: cue, craving, response, and reward. Breaking it down into these fundamental parts can help us understand what a habit is, how it works, and how to improve it.

By breaking down the process of building a habit, it helps me understand why I do the things I do and how to avoid them if they lead to bad habits or how to increase them if they lead to good habits.

First, there is the cue. The cue triggers your brain to initiate a behavior. It is a bit of information that predicts a reward. Our prehistoric ancestors were paying attention to cues that signaled the location of primary rewards like food, water, and sex. Today, we spend most of our time learning cues that predict secondary rewards like money and fame, power and status, praise and approval, love and friendship, or a sense of personal satisfaction. Cues are the things that get our attention or get us thinking about committing a certain act or behavior. Cues became obvious to many of us during COVID when we would walk into the Church and put our hand into the empty holy water font without thinking. Post-it notes act as a cue for me in my morning routine as seeing them reminds me to do certain actions.

Cravings are the second step, and they are motivational forces behind every habit. Without some level of motivation or desire—without craving a change—we have no reason to act. What you crave is not the habit but the change in state it delivers.

A cue gets me thinking about something, but a craving gets me to want the reward of doing the action. For example, sometimes people explode because they are craving a release of negative energy. I may desire to feel superior to my brother who has just wronged me and so I will retaliate instead of choosing to forgive him. When my brother wrongs me, I can also desire to feel Christ-like and therefore be more ready to forgive.

The third step is the response. The response is the actual habit you perform, which can take the form of a thought or action. Whether a response occurs depends on how motivated you are and how much friction is associated with the behavior. If a particular action requires more physical or mental effort than you are willing to expend, then you won't do it. Your response also depends on your ability.

Up until this moment, we have not committed one way or the other. Our response can either be positive and Christ-like or negative and sinful. A person cuts you off in traffic and you get angry. You have not committed a sin. If you respond by cussing at the individual then you have sinned.

Finally, the response delivers a reward. Rewards are the end goal of every habit. The cue is about noticing the reward. The craving is about wanting the reward. The response is about obtaining the reward. We chase rewards because they serve two purposes: (1) they satisfy us and (2) they teach us.

St. Thomas Aquinas stated that he never believed someone did evil for the sake of evil. Rather he believed that people chose the lesser good and thus evil resulted. In other words, since no one chooses to do evil for the sake of evil, when someone commits an evil act we should be asking ourselves why that person thought the action was a good act or the best action they could take.



As we move into a new year all of us at St. Vincent de Paul want you



Con la celebración del Bautismo del Señor se da por terminado el tiempo de Navidad. El Bautismo de Jesús es como una nueva epifanía, es decir, una nueva manifestación de Dios por medio de Jesús ahora en el Jordán. "El Espíritu Santo bajó sobre él y se manifestó exteriormente en forma de paloma, y del cielo vino una voz: Tú eres mi Hijo, hoy te he dado la vida" (Lucas 3,22). La revelación del Padre se manifiesta proclamando a Jesús como su Hijo.

El Papa Francisco en una de sus catequesis lo muestra en tres puntos muy importantes para todos los que hemos sido bautizados en Cristo Jesús: "Jesús quiso recibir el bautismo predicado y administrado por Juan el Bautista en el Jordán. ¡Cuánta humildad tiene Jesús! Y al hacerlo, manifestó lo que hemos celebrado en Navidad: sumergirse en el rio de la humanidad". Jesús, va con todo a lo que refiere la cuestión humana, menos en el pecado. "El Evangelio subraya que Jesús, apenas salió del agua vio rasgarse los cielos y el Espíritu que bajaba hacia él como una paloma. El Espíritu Santo desciende en plenitud sobre Jesús para darle la fortaleza de cumplir su misión". Por medio de nuestra vocación es que tenemos nuestra misión en la vida. ¿Cómo la estamos cumpliendo? "La fiesta del bautismo de Jesús invita a cada cristiano a recordar su bautismo". ¿Sabes, o recuerdas la fecha de tu bautismo? 
