



Good Stewards

In his book, Return: How to Draw Your Child Back to the Church, Brandon Vogt quotes research that says for every one person who enters the Roman Catholic Church, approximately 6.5 leave. Why are they leaving? 68% say they left because their spiritual needs were not met. This means almost 70% left, not because they necessarily disagree with the existence of God or even the views of the Church, but because they do not see the relevance of the Church in their life. They are not seeing how religion matters. They are therefore simply disengaging. In order to re-engage them, we need to meet them where they are, which is why St. Joseph Parish, under the guidance of our Engagement Coordinator, Fernanda Thurmond, and the help of KP Consulting, is working on developing our "brand." We want St. Joseph Parish to stand out and catch the attention of those not coming to Church as well as those in the pews. We can use branding as an evangelization tool.

While good branding inspires employees in the business world, I believe it inspires parishioners in the church world. Just as businesses build a good brand because they want to get more customers, we want to build a good brand in order to draw more people to St. Joseph Parish and the Catholic faith.

Branding improves recognition. When St. Joseph posts on social media, others will recognize us and know that St. Joseph is a viable option for their faith home. Branding creates trust and helps with evangelization by demonstrating to people that we care and are professional in our outreach. Putting effort into branding shows others that we are serious about wanting to make them a part of our community. Branding also helps develop stewardship as people begin to have a clearer idea of who we are and what we do for the community, how we become Good News for others!

We have already begun working hard to create a unified social media presence that catches the attention of web surfers and inspires them to grow in their love of God and neighbor. Fr. Thomas Pastorius *Spiritual Ponderings* Happy to be a Priest

Throughout the month of May, I am using Fr. Rossetti's book, <u>Why Priests Are Happy: A</u> <u>Study of the Psychological and Spiritual Health of Priests</u>, to share with you some reflections on the priesthood with the hopes of encouraging all of us to support the young men who are considering a call to the priesthood and to encourage all of us to challenge young men to ask the question, "Is God calling me to the priesthood?" My reflections are in normal font and quotes from Fr. Rossetti's book are in bold.

It might be useful also to highlight the importance for priests of attending priest gatherings. Its correlation with a priest's Relationship with God was strong. For a priest to connect and be part of the presbyterate is not something peripheral to the priesthood. The priest is ordained into a community, and an essential part of his spiritual life is this sacramental bond he shares with his bishop and brother priests. Nurturing these relationships nurtures his own priesthood and contributes significantly to his overall spiritual life.

My friend Stephen Smith (he was one of our mission speakers a few years ago and he founded his own non-profit that serves the poor in Africa, Haiti, and other parts of the world called Too the Nations) invited me to his 70th birthday party in Hiawassee, GA. During this trip, four priests met for the first time and went out to dinner together. One priest was from Africa, one was from Colombia, one was from Haiti, and I of course was from the United States. It was amazing to truly experience a brotherhood that went beyond borders.

I have recently started attending a priest retreat/conference once a year put on by the St. Paul Biblical Society. These conferences have had over 250 priests from across the United States attend. One of the reasons I have come to enjoy these retreats is because of the wide variety of personalities present which is often expressed by the clothing each priest wears while on retreat. Some priests wear "lay clothing," some wear clerics and some wear cassocks the entire time. Each priest respects the others and appreciates them as a brother.

Not too long ago, one newspaper reported, "In the wake of one scandal after another, the image of the genial, saintly cleric has given way to that of a lonely, dispirited figure living an unhealthy life that breeds sexual deviation." The facts in this study dispel such erroneous presumptions. Just the opposite is true.


Priesthood consistently measures as perhaps the most fulfilling and satisfying vocation of any. Priests reported levels of happiness that are remarkably high and consistent across many studies. Moreover, priests, by and large, are not lonely. They live in an intimate communion of relationships with other priests and laity. Nor are their lives unhealthy; they are much less burned out, more satisfied, and less psychologically impaired than their lay counterparts.

I believe that one of the reasons why we priests are blessed is that many of us have been given great tools to maintain a healthy lifestyle. In my time at the seminary and as a priest, I have been blessed to receive excellent counseling which has helped me learn to manage my mental health. I have also been blessed that in most of my time as a priest, I have worked with really good people who constantly challenge me to take better care of myself. I am also in an environment where seeking help is considered a strength and not a sign of weakness.

Today, this has all changed. Young priests often become pastors after only a few years of ordination, not uncommonly three to five years. Thus, at a very early age they are thrust into running their own parishes, which is not unlike running a small business as the CEO with the additional pastoral and spiritual challenges of being the shepherd of hundreds, maybe thousands, of people. This is not easy. The young priest is expected to be fiscally responsible, a good employer, a plant manager, as well as a good homilist and presider at liturgy, a gentle confessor, and a wise pastoral counselor.

I was never trained for the business aspect of running a parish, but I have discovered that God provides me always with the things I need and so I have to take full advantage of what God provides. I am blessed to have been pastor of two parishes with great staffs, finance councils, parish councils, etc.
