

Youth Ministry at St. Joseph

I was blessed to be able to attend the Life Teen Catholic Youth Ministry Convention in Phoenix Arizona with Mary Galaske (our new youth minister) and Julie Quillo (Director of Family Ministry). I walked away from the conference with a renewed commitment to re-developing youth ministry at St. Joseph. I would like to share with you a quote from the Life Teen conference website:

If you've been involved with youth ministry over these past couple of years, chances are your head has been filled with a variety of voices telling you why you should stop. Parish budget, changes in staff, the digital frontier, impossible to meet mandates and policies... the reasons pile up. But, as real and varied as these difficulties are, one thing does not change: the teenagers in your parish still need you. You might be bruised, beaten, and broken but you're still an integral part of Jesus's plan for their salvation. In fact – if you let it – this broken yet persistent dedication will be the vessel through which your teens experience God's grace in action. Teenagers don't need plastic sanctity or the appearance of perfection – they need to see the perseverance of a weathered yet convicted faith showing up each day, simply because Christ is worth it. At Life Teen, despite your circumstances and hardships, we believe this is still your calling – to keep going, Always Forward.

In order for our parish youth programs (high school and middle school) to grow, we need men and women to volunteer to be a part of youth ministry core teams. Youth ministry is not a one-person job. Some of the best core members I have seen in my previous parishes do not always fit the mold. For example, one core member was in her late 70's and another core member was the mother of six little ones under the age of ten. The number one thing young people are looking for is authenticity. If you think you might be interested in helping with our parish youth programs, please reach out to Mary Galaske as soon as possible.

All Things New

This past spring, parishioners across the Archdiocese of St. Louis were invited through their parish to share their thoughts, reflect on their spiritual growth as well as provide parish leadership with invaluable insight regarding their parish's strengths and opportunities through a survey, the Disciple Maker Index (DMI). The DMI survey was designed to capture information regarding attitudes and beliefs, relationship and satisfaction, participation and demographics using a quantitative tool that can be used for benchmarking and trending information.

Fr. Thomas Pastorius Spiritual Ponderings Sin

During this month of June, I am sharing insights that I have gained over the years from reading Catholic websites and periodicals about different types of sin. Today I want to share some insights on the sin of Gluttony from Fr. Hoffman's article: *Gluttony*. Quotes from his article will be in bold, and my commentary will be in normal font.

How does gluttony work? You just get bigger and bigger and bigger! Gluttony is the vice that leads us to eat and drink more than we need and more than we ought. It is a very easy vice to fall into if we are not mortified and become accustomed to satisfying our cravings.

When I was younger, I thought gluttony only had to deal with eating and drinking too much. I have since come to believe that gluttony is more about trying to solve spiritual, mental, or emotional problems without God by turning to comfort from material things like food, drink, or drugs.

The sense of taste is just one sense that needs to be mortified. If we give our body all that it wants, it takes over and suffocates our soul, easily leading toward that downward path of sin and degradation. Instead of living as children of God, we wind up living like animals.

If we become focused on material or consumable things, we take our eyes off of heaven and away from God.

Pleasure is not wrong. But always in moderation. Remember what St. Paul wrote to the Romans: "Let us then throw off the works of darkness [and] put on the armor of light; let us conduct ourselves properly as in the day, not in orgies and drunkenness, not in promiscuity and licentiousness, not in rivalry and jealousy" (13:12-13).

One of the best stories about sin that I believe applies to gluttony comes from how Eskimos hunt and kill wolves. An Eskimo hunter will dip the blade of a knife in blood and then let the blood freeze to the blade until he has created a bloody popsicle. The wolf will then lick the blood off the knife at such a quick pace that the cold will numb the wolf's tongue so when the wolf does eventually cut himself on the knife's blade, he does not realize it. The wolf will eventually pass out and die. Gluttony is when we become so fixated on material things that we no longer pay attention to the dangers (physical or spiritual) around us.

Yes, you can sin — more or less deliberately — if you eat too much during the holidays. But you can also sin against charity if you do not eat your mother-in-law's pumpkin pie on Thanksgiving. Rather, pace yourself, and then express your appreciation for the hard work and care that others have spent to make life pleasant for you at Christmastime.

In my weight loss battles, I am much more successful when I am pacing myself and eating smaller portions than when I just try to deny myself.

But pay attention here! If you are only concerned about avoiding mortal sin, you are skating on thin ice! We need to avoid even deliberate venial sin, because venial sin easily accepted inevitably leads to mortal sin. So we have to keep the battle far from the walls of the main fortress.

All sins are bad because they prevent us from being the person who we are called to be.

Six helps against Gluttony:

- 1) Remember that Gluttony is a sin (admitting you have a problem is always the first step).
- 2) Follow Jesus's example of fasting and self-mortification.
- 3) Make smaller sacrifices throughout the day to help prepare for bigger ones (for example, give up salt & pepper for a day).
- 4) Think of the poor who are in need of bread.
- 5) Remember that pleasures are only for a moment (think of the story of Lazarus and the rich man).
- 6) Work on trusting God more.



It's hard to believe we are seeing temperatures near 100 degrees. Food prices, gas and other staples at upper limits mean real challenges for some of our neighbors in need. 
Our first drawing for the 2022-23 Lily & Hammer Club will be July 17th so sign up NOW! Brochures are in the vestibule and parish office or sign up online.

All you YOUNG AT HEART folks, be sure to join us for our annual Fourth of July picnic lunch Tuesday, July 5th.


It will be a typical picnic, with one exception. We will be in the cool Parish Center.

SANDWICH AND UNSEEN DINNER GUEST PROGRAMS

Both of these St. Joseph outreach programs were suspended during the Covid outbreak but are now operating and can use additional participants to help feed the homeless and needy in the city of St. Louis. Each Friday, donated food is taken to St. Vincent de Paul parish and St. Patrick Center.

Sandwiches/bags of fruit should be dropped off in the refrigerators located in the Athletic Field garage on Wednesday or Thursday for the Friday delivery. Sandwiches from a loaf of bread are prepared with meat (and cheese optional) but without condiments and are put into individual sandwich bags. Prepared sandwiches are returned to the loaf bag which is labeled and dated. Another option for participation is to donate bags of fruit (apples, oranges, etc.).

Unseen Dinner Guest volunteers prepare single servings of soup or stew or set aside individual portions from their family meal. Each serving is frozen, labeled and dated. Since this food is frozen, it can be placed anytime in the freezer compartments of the refrigerators located in the Athletic Field garage.




