The other day I started cleaning out clutter from some cupboards/closets and I thought this is a great 2022 New Year's Resolution! As I continued, I saw all the boxes I have containing angel figurines...many angels I keep out throughout the year but most appear at Christmas...and then there are the many books I have about angels. So of course,

I started reading...a diversion from a task is always good!

One of my favorite Angel books is Meditations on Vatican Art -Angels by Mark Haydu. I started reading about "Nativity and Adoration of the Shepherds" painted by Bartolo di Fredi in 1383. Haydu writes about this masterpiece, "The Virgin Mary and St. Joseph are depicted in a cave in front of the Child Jesus...The Virgin, upright with her arms folded across her chest, is painted in a higher scale than the other characters to indicate the devotion that drives her to the Lord...The angel who appears to these shepherds brings the news of the birth of our Lord and holds an olive branch, symbol of peace and celebration."

This meditation ended with a prayer and reflection; I believe we all can all benefit from pondering the following:

- 1. If the angels of the Lord came to you today and asked you to drop everything and go see Jesus, would you be able to do it or would you need to get things in order first? It is also important that we as "church" provide a listening heart and hands of support to anyone in need of healing from abortion. Pro-
- 2. The shepherds came to celebrate the birth of Jesus even though they brought no material gifts. God has given us all gifts that we alone can give back to him. What can you bring the baby Jesus that can't be bought in a store?
- 3. It is the purpose of angels to be ministers of God's word. Who in the aftermath of abortion. It is open to all in your life needs to be reminded of that message? Say a prayer for God to send one of these angels into that person's life as God's love and mercy is bigger than any sin! a reminder of God's heavenly peace.

Cleaner Air at All Worship Sites

We have just completed the installation of iWave-R self-cleaning needlepoint bipolar ionization generators in all of the furnaces, in all of our worship sites. These units work to clean the air supply. As the air flows past the iWave unit, positive and negative ions actively clean the air supply, reducing bacteria, viruses (including SARS-Cov-2 [Covid-19]*), smoke, odors, as well as other particles. These units work continuously while the heating or air conditioning units are operating. The improved indoor air quality will make our worship sites safer for gatherings.

Respect Life

The Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children:

January 22 has been designated by the <u>General Instruction of the</u> <u>Roman Missal</u> as the "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children." The Church directs: "In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22, (or January 23, when January 22 falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion." As individuals, we are called to observe this day through the penitential practices of prayer, fasting and/or almsgiving.

The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops also sponsors an annual, nationwide novena called "**9 Days for Life**" which encompasses the liturgical observance of the Day of Prayer. Each day for nine days (Jan. 19-27), a different intention is featured, accompanied by a short reflection, suggested actions and related information as we pray for the respect and protection of every human life. It is also important that we as "church" provide a listening heart and hands of support to anyone in need of healing from abortion. Project Rachel Ministry is a ministry of the Catholic Church in the U.S. for those who have been involved in abortion. It is a diocesanbased network of specially trained priests, religious, counselors and laypersons who provide a team response of care for those suffering in the aftermath of abortion. "Who is this Christ? Is he like you?"

Perhaps you've heard this story, often attributed to the life of St. Teresa of Calcutta. A sick man asked her this question, as he marveled at her tireless service to himself and others in the name of someone named Jesus Christ.

"He is nothing like me," the saint is said to have answered. "But I hope I am like him."

Though the authenticity of this exchange cannot be verified, its message rings perfectly true: all the value of our stewardship lies in its relativity to the one in whose name we perform it.

Consider the figure of John the Baptist — a magnificent, towering character even purely from a literary or historical perspective. A martyr who fed on wild locusts and boldly spoke truth to power — a man so great some mistook him for the Messiah.

But why is he great? Because he prepared the way. All his accomplishments and escapades mean nothing if they are taken out of the context of salvation history. He only makes sense relative to Christ and this is exactly as he wanted it. "One worthier than I is coming," he insists. And because of that humility and that total embrace of God's will, he is given one of the greatest honors in the New Testament — he baptizes the Son of God.

Let's examine our lives in the light of their relativity to Christ. How do we prepare the way? When Christ comes to us, what do we do? How do we leave ourselves open to be actors in God's plan? — *Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS*
