

Get Used to Different

My wife, Diana and I have been watching "The Chosen," a new retelling of the story of Jesus, his disciples and Apostles. At one point, as Jesus is challenging his followers to think in new ways, they push back, saying that it is all so different. He tells them, "Get used to different." That statement applies well to parish mission planning.

Brandon Vogt, in *Return: How to Draw your Child Back to the Church*, cites these the statistics:

- An average of 6.5 people leave the Catholic Church for every one that joins.
- Fifty percent of young people who were raised Catholic are no longer Catholic today.

As a parish, we need to do something different. If we always do what we have always done, we will continue to get what we have been getting – smaller and smaller until we are no longer a force in our mission field (parish boundaries.)

The Parish Mission Plan that has been in development for several months now will provide our parish with the "something different" that we need. The Leadership Team from our parish mission planning process is currently collaborating with the Pastoral Council to launch the first priority of our parish mission plan – discipleship formation. The leaders of our many ministries, the staff and other interested parishioners and friends of the parish will be invited to enter more deeply into a relationship with Jesus. As we share our stories of faith together, we will discover new and different ways to be disciples of Jesus in northern Door County. We will maximize the opportunities that we have to unite people in the love of Jesus, guided by our patron Mary, and welcome all to grow in faith and in our parish life.

Worship Column

The Word: This Sunday's collect is a prayer that "always pondering spiritual things, we may carry out. . .that which is pleasing to you." And God Incarnate gives us a lot to ponder in John 13, asking us to love our enemies, not to judge and condemn and to do good to our "enemies."

*The Meditation: The love of Jesus is modeled on the love of God. It is a human translation of that love - universal, unwavering, relentless. It will always be a challenge for us, an ideal for which we strive. But we cannot love God and be indifferent to others. We have to learn how to love those who are not perfect and who may be outcasts. We have to learn how to love those we might feel very naturally repelled by. What Jesus says in the Gospel is that there is no way we can claim to love God without being accountable to loving and serving others, who themselves are unique reflections of the presence of God.

*Liturgy into Action: But let's face it. This is one of the most difficult teachings that we have received from Jesus on the practical living out of our faith. When we examine our own relationships, both with God and with our neighbor, we certainly realize how difficult it is for us to imitate the love of Jesus and put this into practice. Our love is imperfect. It can be colored by fear, by some hidden motive, by selfishness. Often, our love is conditional. We only love those whom we like, or those who earn our love by pleasing us. Our love is fragile and sensitive. It withers and dies if we are hurt or misunderstood. Or we simply get tired of giving. We grow weary of preferring others to ourselves.

Is it really possible to forgive our enemies in a world torn by war and terror, religious and ethnic prejudice, economic disparity and exploitation of the weak? We are certainly not expected to overlook these evils, but as St. Paul tells us "we bear the image of God" and we are called to forgive and not retaliate. We are called to be merciful, not vengeful. This is real heroism and we are all called to it.

Jesus teaches us to be concerned for the needs of others. He asks that we use God's gifts wisely and well. At the heart of our faith is a spirit leading us to acknowledge that it is God's love and goodness that provides so abundantly for all of our needs. And this should be the springboard to our sharing what we have with our brothers and sisters.

Prayer: This Tuesday, Feb. 22, is the Feast of the Chair of St. Peter the Apostle, so we ask for his help: "Dear God, through the intercession of St. Peter, your chosen "Rock" and pillar of your Church, grant us the graces to live out the teachings of your only-begotten son, Jesus Christ. Help us to forgive, to show mercy, to refrain from judging or condemning others and in all respects, live out the "golden rule" to treat others as we would like to be treated. We thank you for the gift of salvation and for calling us to be members of your holy Church. Amen.


