#### The Beatitudes



# Saint of the Month

St Bernadette Soubirous



At the age of 14 St. Bernadette (1844-1879) was living in abject poverty with her family in a oneroom basement which had previously been used as a jail, in the town of Lourdes in southern France. She was a sickly child, having fallen victim to Cholera in 1854 and would battle asthma and tuberculosis for the rest of her short life. Bernadette was illiterate and is characterized in many accounts as slow or ignorant. It was in her 14th year that Bernadette was granted 18 visions of a 'Lady' at a grotto in Massabielle. The Lady instructed Bernadette to come daily to the grotto to receive the visions, eventually proclaiming 'I am the Immaculate Conception'. A spring at the grotto, which appeared where Bernadette was instructed to dig, has been a site of miraculous healing. The Lady also asked that a chapel be built in the grotto for pil-

grims. Today the Marian shrine at Lourdes is one of the world's most popular.

During and following the period of visions, the saint was examined rigorously by Church and local authorities. The popular excitement around the visions left her subject to persistent questioning and attention. Eventually she sought protection by retiring to a home for the poor in a nunnery. She took her vows in 1866 with the Sisters of Charity at Nevers. She worked as an infirmary assistant and later a sacristan, but by the end of her life she was too sick to participate in convent life. She died at the age of 35, humble and penitent until the end.



# Worship Column

## Holy Week, 2022

The Word: Excerpts from prescribed readings

Palm Sunday's Gospel:

As he rode along..

the whole multitude of his disciples began to praise God aloud with joy for all the mighty deeds they had seen." (Luke 19) "Christ Jesus, though he was in the form of God....emptied himself....obedient to the point of death." (Phil 2)

Collect for Holy Thursday:

".....when about to hand himself over to death, [he] entrusted to the Church a sacrifice new for all eternity, the banquet of his love."

Good Friday's Gospel:

"'I told you that I AM....

Shall I not drink the cup that the Father gave me?"

Meditation: Who is this King of Glory?

The crowds, like us, gathered to welcome Jesus Christ. How is it that some days later he was brutally murdered as a criminal? Who are we? In a prayer attributed to St. Francis of Assisi, "Canticle of the Creatures," he writes, "no one is worthy to mention Your name."

While living in Sweden, before my conversion to Catholicism, I experienced the most-attended Service of the Church Year of the Swedish Lutheran Church, the First Sunday of Advent. It is a grand opening for the winter months, for the lighting of candles, the eating of saffron buns and the singing of folk songs. You can feel the excitement as large cathedral-size churches fill up with families who love to sing, "Hosanna to the Son of David!" and listen to the beautiful, clear tones of the choir amidst the glow of candlelight. Yet, for the rest of the year, the church spaces are sparsely filled. What happened to the crowds?

Am I a better person than they? How often have I passed along the chance to honor the Lord with a prayer of thanksgiving or simply for asking him for a blessing on what I am about to do?

#### **Liturgy in Action** "God is love."

Bring along all your sorrows to the Masses this week and remember his suffering for us and his death, so that we may be untied to him by meditating on his grievous wounds. Prepare to receive him, the King of Kings and the King of our hearts! Prepare to rejoice, united with him, at the celebration of his victorious Resurrection!

#### **Praver**

Come Lord Jesus! Come into my heart and lead me through this Holy Week. Forgive me my sins. Bless my heart and my mind. Bless me with abundant grace so that, in order to empty myself and abandon myself to you, I may be more united to you than ever before. We pray through the intercession of St. Francis of Assisi and Our Stella Maris! Amen.
