

## Respect Life

Abortion laws in many states around our country are making headlines with changes. Looking at them collectively they are more polarized than ever. The laws range from becoming more restrictive and protecting the baby in the womb that can feel pain, Their has a beating heart and brain waves, to the opposite extreme of removing any restrictions (even parental notification of minors) during the full nine months of pregnancy with no regard for what the fetus would endure. (And, a current California drafted amendment, AB2223, even goes beyond pregnancy....Much like the states of Maryland and Colorado this decriminalizes the killing of a baby born alive as a result of a failed abortion or other reason during the "perinatal period").\*

Where are we in our support of these laws? Pew Research shows Catholics are close to evenly split on the view of abortion being legal, but support for how that should be carried out is as mixed as the laws in each state. Our faith teaches we should protect has unconditional value simply by its being. But, are our views

We are celebrating the Resurrection of our Savior, Jesus Christ. His sacrificial love of laying down his life for us destroyed death and opens heaven for us. We don't have to do anything to earn this salvation, but our hearts should be affected by that incredible love. We should be radiating that love unselfishly to all others, seeing "the face of Christ" in all. If we reject new life, we are rejecting people created by God--people we should be loving and serving, not eliminating.

# Worship Column

**The Word:** Many signs and wonders were done. . . they were all cured..

This is the day the LORD has made; let us be glad and rejoice in it.

I am the first and the last, the one who lives. Once I was dead, but now I am alive forever and ever.

Blessed are those who have not seen me, but still believe!
Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me?

Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

**Meditation:** Our Lord is a great God! He is the first and last, the one who was dead, but is now alive! Of all the ideals and philosophies that are believed in on this globe, there is not one that has this claim, but Christ. We believe in things that we can't see. The above excerpts have key words about rejoicing in our faith and about things we have experienced, but do not "see." I once joined a mediation session for Christian Contemplation, not planning to become a Christian, but only to counteract stress. The practice is to be as silent and still as possible, including stilling all thoughts, while kneeling (or sitting) in the sanctuary, focusing on an icon or a candle. Something powerful was happening. I began looking forward to the session without really knowing why. It was as though a magnet was pulling me gently in. I would have really hated to miss even one session. After time, I learned that the "magnet" was Christ. Something I could not see was happening. The signs and wonders I was experiencing were internal, not visible. I now rejoice in "My Lord and My God!" (St. Thomas)



**Liturgy into Action**: If we have experienced that one, true God, we are called and compelled to "pass it on." One way to do this is to do acts of Mercy.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church, paragraph 2447 reads:

The works of mercy are charitable actions by which we come to the aid of our neighbor in his spiritual and bodily necessities. (cf. Isaiah 58:6-7; Hebrews 13:3). Instructing, advising, consoling, comforting are spiritual works of mercy, as are forgiving and bearing wrongs patiently. The corporal works of mercy consist especially in feeding the hungry, sheltering the homeless, clothing the naked, visiting the sick and imprisoned and burying the dead. (cf. Matthew 25:31-46). Among all these, giving alms to the poor is one of the chief witnesses to fraternal charity: It is also a work of justice pleasing to God. cf. Tobit 4:5-11; Sirach 17:22; Matthew 6:2-4).

He who has two coats, let him share with him who has none and he who has food must do likewise. (*Luke 3:11*). But give for alms those things which are within and behold, everything is clean for you. (*Luke 11:41*). If a brother or sister is ill-clad and in lack of daily food and one of you says to them, "Go in peace, be warmed and filled," without giving them the things needed for the body, what does it profit? (*James 2:15-16; cf. 1 John 3:17*)
