Faith Formation

Sacraments: Reconciliation & First Holy Communion



What a privilege it has been to be the catechist of eight second grade students. Preparing for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Communion is very serious business but we also had fun on this journey. During the course of this year, these students showed me they have "miraculous memories." This is a review game of key concepts taught. We play this game after almost every lesson: get the

review question correct, shake the dice and win that amount of treats...they do have fantastic memories! Students repeat a prayer phrase; this worked especially well for the act of contrition prayer. And yes, Father Tom was so kind in helping each student out a bit during reconciliation. We read in the Bible every week (it is the students' main textbook and coincides with our lesson). One day I decided we would read popcorn style. Students must focus on where we are in the reading but when I stop in the middle of a sentence and say "popcorn" then the student I call on finishes reading the sentence. But if the student errors, he/she has to sit on the floor! They had far too much fun and all wanted to sit on the floor!!! Second graders do need to move around...some days we even dance to songs! We also learned Bible stories through coloring. Each page contained a respective scripture verse which was read once all the sequencing pages were colored.

Speaking of special Communion scripture verses, the following are taken from *The Catholic Children's Bible* we use in class.

John 6:51 Jesus said, I am the living bread that came down from heaven. If you eat this bread, you will live forever. The bread that I will give you is my flesh, which I give so that the world may live. John 6:54: Jesus continued saying: Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life and I will raise you up on the last day.

These eight second graders will receive a very special gift from Jesus when they share His body for the first time. Please pray for them.



Saint of the Month St. Damien de Veuster of Moloka'I | May 10



People may be familiar with leprosy from Biblical times, but not so much in the 1800s. However, St. Damien de Veuster of Moloka'I' (January 3, 1840 – April 15, 1889) would eventually shed a light on the effects of this devastating disease and allow people to see those afflicted with it with more compassion and love.

Born Joseph de Veuster in Tremelo, Belgium, he quit school at 13 so he could work on the family farm. Feeling called for more, however, he entered the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary six years later, where he took the name of a fourthcentury physician and martyr. His brother, a priest from the same congregation, fell ill and was unable to go to his assigned location. Damien quickly volunteered in his place and found himself on the Hawaiian Islands in 1864. Two months after arriving, he was or-

dained a priest of Honolulu and assigned to the Island of Hawaii.

In 1873, he visited the Hawaiian government's leper colony on the island of Moloka'I, where he petitioned to stay permanently to care for their physical, medical, and spiritual needs. After years of working to improve their location and those who lived there, he contracted Hansen's disease and died of its complications. St. Damien was canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on October 11, 2009. —LPi
