

Everyday Stewardship



Have you ever paid attention to the purification of the sacred vessels after Holy Communion? If you haven't, I highly recommend doing so this Sunday. See the care with which the priest handles the chalice and the paten, pouring water into them to cleanse any loose particles of the Body and Blood of Christ. Observe the loving reverence he uses in wiping them dry with a special purificator. It's a ritual unto itself, and a powerful moment for reflection.

These vessels begin as earthly objects. They are made by human hands. There is nothing special about them — not until they go about the work for which they have been created. Until they contain the Body and Blood of Christ, they are only ordinary objects. But after they have carried within them the Eucharist, they are nev-

That's why partaking of the Eucharist is, for us, an evangelical undertaking. It is both a transformation and a declaration. When we accept this tremendous gift, we are proclaiming what we believe, and we are accepting the grace to follow through on that commitment.

When we are receiving the Eucharist, it is not possible for us to be passive. We become the vessel. We carry Christ into the world with us.

But do we act like it? Do we treat ourselves, our bodies, our souls, with the same respect as the priest cleansing the chalice? Do we treat one another with the reverence we would reserve for a sacred object? When we look at another person with anger or irritation or envy, do we acknowledge the change that we have willingly undergone by receiving Christ's Body and Blood into ourselves?

Worship Column

16th Sunday in Ordinary Time, July 16-17, 2022 Beth Screnock, Director of Worship & Music

The Word: The readings include the story of Abraham and Sarah preparing a <u>meal for unexpected guests</u>, from heaven nonetheless! The Psalm as a reminder to <u>do what is right</u>, St. Paul describing his work as **"in accordance with God's stewardship given to me to bring to completion for you the word of God..."** (Col. 1:25); and the Gospel story of Martha who is worried and about many things compared to Mary, who was <u>listening to Christ's words</u>.

The Meditation: What do these messages bring to your mind about hospitality and a Word-focused spirituality? What is your "stewardship" that God has given you? Do you remember to combat worry with the Word of God in your spiritual life, both reading and recalling the themes that the Holy Spirit puts on your heart?

Liturgy in Action: Early on in my conversion, I would pray in the morning for help with being more generous or kind, or another virtue. Oftentimes, as the day progressed, I would run into an unfortunate situation, one that caused me pain or embarrassment. But almost immediately, the Holy Spirit would remind me of my morning petition and I would realize that it was in fact an answer to my prayer, as I was being admonished or taught that my attitude was selfish. For example, I was living in Sweden where most of the society is in the mid-range of the economy, but a smaller slice of the population is extremely wealthy. While riding on the tram in the city one day, I noticed a lady with very expensive-looking mittens and I looked at her with scorn. Shortly thereafter, I got off at my stop. To my amazement, my own nice mittens were gone! I had left them on the tram. I remembered my prayer of that morning to the Holy Spirit to make me a better person and to help me not to judge others! Prioritize God, pray with faith and reap the fruits of virtue. Sometimes wearing a Rosary or a Brown Scapular can help us remember.



Prayer: O Mary, Our Lady of Mt. Carmel (Feast: July 16), help us to know God and His will for our life. We ask for the intercession of St. Simon Stock, who prayed for the brothers under his care, that the Holy Spirit enlighten our minds to be aware of our "stewardship" from God and grant us the desire to be spiritually minded, always attune to God's Word. O Stella Maris and St. Simon Stock, pray for us! Amen
