


# Worship Column

#### 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time, August 7, 2022 Beth Screnock, Director of Worship & Music, written July 25, 2022

The Word: "But God said to him, 'You fool, this night your life will be demanded of you and the things you have prepared, to whom will they belong? Thus will it be for the one who stores up treasure for himself but is not rich in what matters to God." (Luke 12:20)

The Meditation: Thinking about "storing up treasures" that may influence my future, last Sunday's sermon by Fr. Don Thimm in Jacksonport comes to my mind. He spoke about how he considered that God's decision to destroy Sodom & Gomorrah may be connected to that community's lack of good choices. Good choices for us could mean these: spending some time each day thinking about or praying to God (say, 1% of our day = 15 minutes); welcoming strangers (and in all ways, those who think differently than us); being conscious of the "us" as in the Lord's prayer; remember that in the Mass we bring up our gifts, our whole person (let's plan on bringing up "good" decisions from the week prior) and that we are to be a "sanctified" people.

Liturgy in Action: Am I rushing through life, grabbing the best opportunities and the most comforts, blindly passing by opportunities to show God that I do care about Him and my fellow persons? "Oh, but I do," one might answer. Yet there are examples of Catholics coming to worship that may not echo that response. Last week, before one of the Masses, Fr. Tom Farrell asked us to wait before beginning, to wait for some expected guests. A person overheard a lady impatiently whisper, "Let's get the show on the road!" How many of us in the room had similar impatient thoughts? What does that say about the Golden Rule and about our attention to what we are gathered for? What does it say about our lack of discipline? As Fr. Don suggested, a society that practices the opposite of the Gospel, refusing to live at peace, could be one headed for destruction. Where are my treasures? When singing "One Bread, One Body," how do our lives stack up with the text: "Gentile or Jew?"

**Quotes from St. Alphonsus Liguori, Doctor of the Church** (Feast Day August 1): He quotes St. Bernardine of Sienna, ". . .that it was of this rainbow that the Lord spoke, when he said to Noah that he would place in the clouds the bow of peace. . .Mary is that very bow of eternal peace. For as God, at the sight of the bow remembers the peace promised to the earth, thus at the prayers of Mary he pardons sinners the offenses committed against him and establishes peace with them." ("The Glories of Mary," America Needs Fatima, 2015, pp. 125-26.)

**Prayer**: "Holy God, may it please you to assist me with your grace to be a better person, a better family member and worker, but above all, to assist me in refusing the things that lead me to pride, selfishness and greed and lead me to store up treasures in heaven. Oh Mary, most Holy, pray for us! St. Alphonsus, pray for us! Amen."
