## Respect Life

Fathers' Irreplaceable Role in Welcoming Life

Although fathers do not physically carry their children from conception, fathers can still be overwhelmed by an unexpected pregnancy. We Christians must support men who, in following the example of St. Joseph, choose to embrace their role as a father in all circumstances, but especially in challenging situations. St. Joseph was unexpectedly called to fatherhood amid extremely confusing and difficult circumstances. However, despite many obstacles, St. Joseph chose to be faithful. St. Joseph chose life by listening to God's will and consciously deciding to be a father to Jesus, the Son of God. Pope Saint John Paul II said that fathers are called to exhibit "generous responsibility for the life conceived under the heart of the mother" (Familiaris consortio 25, 1981). Like St. Joseph, all fathers are uniquely entrusted with the protection and defense of both mother and child and, in this way, safeguard the sanctity of human life. But biological fathers, because they do not physically carry the child, sometimes fail to truly father their children.

Our society increasingly tells fathers that they should have no say in the lives of their unborn children, no opportunity to choose to father their children. Our society seems to restrict the decisions regarding an unborn child solely to the discretion of the mother. In the face of false messages about fatherhood, we must respond with the truth that the role of a father "is of unique and irreplaceable importance" (FC 25). We know that the assistance and support of the father of a child, or lack thereof, can often be a deciding factor in a woman's decision to choose life"...... "fatherhood extends beyond simple procreation and biology. Fatherhood is first a spiritual reality, because fatherhood has its origins in God who chose to reveal Himself to us as Our Father, sending his only Son for the sake of our salvation. Fathers therefore have a special and unique role "in revealing and in reliving on earth the very fatherhood of God" (FC 25).

**Got Any Enemies?** 

"And do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; rather, be afraid of the one who can destroy both soul and body in Gehenna. Are not two sparrows sold for a small coin? Yet not one of them falls to the ground without your Father's knowledge. Even all the hairs of your head are counted. So do not be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows." Everyone who acknowledges me before others I will acknowledge before my heavenly Father. But whoever denies me before others, I will deny before my heavenly Father." (Matthew 10:28-33)

Meditation: Thinking of the past over 2,000 years of Christian history, we recall those who were persecuted, tortured and executed for the Faith. Even today, there are accounts of martyrdom. Bringing these events to mind can be an overwhelming, sorrowful experience. In this passage above, Christ is encouraging us; He, the King of Saints & Martyrs. As we attend Mass and anxiously await the Eucharist, we yearn for encouragement and for solace. This encounter with God, as Fr. Don Thimm mentioned two weeks ago in his Sermon on the Body & Blood of Christ, should be a time of the week that we look forward to.

Everyone has enemies. But oftentimes, we are our own worst enemy. Each soul is responsible for their own choices. God gives all souls the choice of life or death; we choose which principles to follow and things to hold dear. Writings in the Hebrew Bible (the Old Testament) emphasize right living as a way to righteousness and to pleasing God. "The one who pleased God was loved—snatched away, lest wickedness pervert his mind or deceit beguile his soul; for the witchery of paltry things obscures what is right and the whirl of desire transforms the innocent mind." (Wisdom 4:10-12) With an earnest heart and prayer, we can achieve God's protection from our own evil tendency (original sin) and from those around us who may wish us "un"-well.

Prayer: "Lord, Father and Master of my life, do not abandon me to their designs, do not let me fall because of them! Who will apply the lash to my thoughts, and to my mind the rod of discipline, that my failings may not be spared or the sins of my heart overlooked? Otherwise, my failings may increase, and my sins be multiplied; and I fall before my adversaries, and my enemy rejoice over me? Lord, Father and God of my life, do not give me haughty eyes; remove evil desire from my heart. Let neither gluttony nor lust overcome me; do not give me up to shameless desires." (Sirach 23:1-6) "I will extol you, my God and king; I will bless your name forever and ever. Every day I will bless you; I will praise your name forever and ever." (Psalm 145:1)
