



The RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults) process at St. Paul Catholic

Church in Highland is a year-round process. Monthly gatherings are held in June, July and August, with weekly sessions beginning on the first Sunday following Labor Day each year and continuing through the celebration of the Easter season the following spring. This is a personal commitment of approximately 8-12 months or as long as needed. Weekly RCIA sessions meet on Sunday mornings from 8:30 a.m. until 11:00 a.m., beginning with Mass in the Church.

Pre Jordan (Baptism class)

Pre Jordan classes are held every other month. They are typically held on the first Thursday of the month at 6:30 pm in the second floor All Saints room in the Parish

BAPTISM OF BABIES If anyone asks, or if you yourself are wondering, a good age to baptize infants in the Catholic Church is anywhere from three weeks to three months old. This is why it is important to attend the PreJordan session during the pregnancy. You are strongly encouraged to have your baby's baptism before 3 months old. We want to give our children the gift of Jesus and the promise of salvation in Jesus as soon as possible. However, please be assured that we will baptize your child whenever you bring him/her to us.

TANK CREDIT

The Tax Credit Scholarship program was approved by lawmakers in an effort to offer school choice to Illimois students and their parents. The program is simple: It allows individuals and corporations to denate to scholarship-granting arganizations (SGO) and receive a 75 parcent credit on their state income taxes. The SGOs then use this maney to grant scholarships to low-income and working-class students who want to attend a Catholic or nanpublic school

Since awarding its first scholarships for the 2018–19 school year, the program has been an overwhelming success, with about 5,000 students annually receiving scholarships from Empower Illinois, the largest SGO that also serves most Catholic schools in the state. Yet need outstrips the available donations, leaving about 20,000 students each year on a waiting list.

Now, Gav. J.B. Pritzker wants to slash the state income tax credit from 75% to 40%, which would devastate the program. Our Illinois bishops have written a letter to the Catholic faithful, urging them to contact their state lawmakers and tell them to save the Tax Credit Scholarship program. Fr. Kosk's Korner

Every day the Holy Spirit allows me to notice how He is working in my life as an ordinary person, as a priest, and

through the life of this parish and of all of you. The work of the Holy Spirit is unique, surprising, and very often different from what I would like or choose. God knows that his children find it challenging to understand, perceive, and live in His mystery, in the mystery of faith. Therefore, He gradually shows us on the pages of the Holy Scriptures who He is. who Jesus is, and today who is the Holy Spirit.

Last week, Jesus in his Gospel highlighted the fact that He knows the Father and the Father knows the Son. In Biblical language, "to know" means being in a close relationship with another person. God is in a relationship with His Son and the Holy Spirit; they are one, and the bond that unites them is love. Love also connects us on earth. Families begin with a marriage. From this love, fruit is born. Love never divides, but to love, you have to get to know each other. Just as Jesus knows the Father and the Father knows Him, our job is to know Jesus. To know is to be in a relationship: we must be in a relationship with Jesus to know who the Father is and, consequently, also the Holy Spirit, that is, the Holy Trinity.

The mystery of God is explained to us by Christ, Our Lady, martyrs, and saints. We can discover in some parts what the mystery of God and the Church is, but it requires our effort, work, and intellect, but most of all, faith. We cannot understand everything, and we will always have questions and doubts. That is why, brothers and sisters, I encourage you to get to know Jesus; have a relationship with him, and invite the Holy Spirit into your life. Everything is possible with God, and we cannot do anything without God. Let our hearts continuously be renewed by the power of the Most High, and let us humbly ask him that the fruits of the Holy Spirit should be poured out on us, as on the Apostles in the Upper Room.

"Holy Spirit, I ask you for the gift of Wisdom to better know You and Your divine perfections, for the gift of Understanding to clearly discern the spirit of the mysteries of the holy faith, for the gift of Counsel that I may live according to the principles of this faith, for the gift of Knowledge that I may look for counsel in You and that I may always find it in You, for the gift of Fortitude that no fear or earthly preoccupations would ever separate me from You, for the gift of Piety that I may always serve Your Majesty with a filial love, for the gift of the Fear of the Lord that I may dread sin, which offends You, O my God."
























