



Brothers and sisters: Every high priest is taken from among men and made their representative before God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He is able to deal patiently with the ignorant and erring, for he himself is beset by weakness and so, for this reason, must make sin offerings for himself as well as for the people. No one takes this honor upon himself but only when called by God, just as Aaron was. In the same way, it was not Christ who glorified himself in becoming high

On hearing that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to cry out and say, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me." And many rebuked him, telling him to be silent. But he kept calling out all the more, "Son of David, have pity on me." Jesus stopped and said, "Call him." So they called the blind man, saying to him, "Take courage; get up, Jesus is calling you." He threw aside his cloak, sprang up, and came to Jesus. Jesus said to him in reply, "What do you want me to do for you?" The blind man replied to him, "Master, I want to see." Jesus told him, "Go your way; your faith has saved you." Immediately he received his sight and followed him on the way.

The Gospel of the Lord R: Praise to You Lord Jesus Christ

The Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, (**Bow slightly until "became man"**) and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Presentation: *A Blind Man Sat Beside the Road*

1. A blind man sat beside the road and begged for charity, Until he heard a stranger's step and asked "Who can this be?"
2. "Who can this be and will he stop for one as poor as I?" Then voices pierced his darkness deep "The Lord is passing by!"
3. Then Jesus stopped in mercy spoke, those sightless eyes he healed. Which, opened wide, by faith made whole, the Son of God revealed.
4. Our blindness cries for vision bright, our poverty for grace, O Lord have mercy now on us, to us reveal your face.

Communion: *We Walk By Faith*

1. We walk by faith, and not by sight: No gracious words we hear Of him who spoke as none e'er spoke, But we believe him near.
2. We may not touch his hands and side, Nor follow where he trod; Yet in his promise we rejoice, And cry "My Lord and God!"
3. Help then, O Lord, our unbelief, And may our faith abound; To call on you when you are near, And seek where you are found:
4. That when our life of faith is done In realms of clearer light We may behold you as you are In full and endless sight.
5. We walk by faith, and not by sight: No gracious words we hear Of him who spoke as none e'er spoke, But we believe him near.

Meditation: *Amazing Grace*

1. Amazing grace! How sweet the sound That saved a wretch like me! I once was lost, but now am found, Was blind but now I see.
2. 'Twas grace that taught my heart to fear, And grace my fears relieved; How precious did that grace appear The hour I first believed!
3. The Lord has promised good to me, His word my hope secures; He will my shield and portion be As long as life endures.
4. Through many dangers, toils and snares, I have already come; 'Tis grace has brought me safe thus far, And grace will lead me home.
5. When we've been there ten thousand years, Bright shining as the sun, We've no less days to sing God's praise Than when we'd first begun.

Closing: *Your Hands, O Lord, In Days of Old*

1. Your hands, O Lord, in days of old were strong to heal and save; They triumphed over pain and death, o'er darkness and the grave. to you they went, the blind, the mute, the palsied and the lame, The leper set apart and shunned, the sick and those in shame.
2. And then your touch brought life and health, gave speech and strength and sight; And youth renewed, with health restored, claimed you, the Lord of light. And so, O Lord, be near to bless, almighty now as then, In every street, in every home, in every troubled friend.
3. O be our mighty healer still, O Lord of life and death; Restore and strengthen, so, the and bless with your almighty breath, On hands that work and eyes that see, your healing wisdom pour, That whole and sick and weak and strong may praise you evermore.

THANKS FOR THE TIME AWAY for my annual fall vacation and thanks to Fr. Kosk and the parish staff for covering all the details during my absence.

FROM MY HEART

Dear Brothers and Sisters, my friends in Christ,

During my time away I had lots of time to reflect on being a priest and pastor. Then this morning as I interacted with the school children, several had one question on their minds: "can a person receive all 7 sacraments?" Now, how many school children are excited to know the answer to such a question??? Not many, but our St. Paul School children wanted to know. The second part of the question was: "If a man's wife dies, can he become a priest?" My answer was "YES!" They immediately knew then that a man can, in fact, receive all seven sacraments.

How excited I became to hear their enthusiasm and it made me realize what a joy it is to be your priest and pastor! That was also the conclusion of my reflections during my time away from the parish. It is exciting to be here at St. Paul Parish to journey in faith with such devoted and dedicated parishioners. My time here thus far has been filled with growth in faith and facilities. Our project to "Grow our Family and Grow our Faith" is most appropriate. Providing facilities in which to worship, play, pray, learn and serve is what this is all about.

We are to be a people of hospitality who welcome others to journey with us in faith. It is an honor to do that with each of you. This Sunday I have the privilege to present the topic of Holy Orders at our RCIA session. I would never have dreamed during my formation and studies, and at my Ordination to the Priesthood, what a treasure I have been called to and what joy would fill my heart and life.

I would also have not believed what a humbling role I would have in serving as a priest and confecting the Holy Eucharist and other sacraments. Many do not know this, but my comfort level in presiding or public speaking is zero! I would much rather be "in the pews" than presiding, but I know that's how God works. He stretches us beyond our comfort zone. The Holy Spirit gives me the courage to stand in front to preside and preach. That's just not "me!" Yet, God does not call the qualified; he qualifies the called.

As I reflected on these things, I wondered how God is calling you to serve Him and His people. How is God stretching you?

When it all comes down to it, if we don't have faith, we have nothing. We think we do, but we really don't. And that's the truth!

SEMINARIAN STEFAN CAR FUND People are inquiring about how much has been collected toward Stefan's car. We are currently at \$20,817. That sounds like a lot and it is from very generous people who are invested in the future of our Church. However, I want to be assured that there are funds in reserve for his car insurance, which will be about \$1,800/year for 4 years, until his ordination to the priesthood and a little for gas money. Seminarians are not allowed to have a job, so he has no income, except your generosity.

MASS OF REMEMBRANCE

CURBS, APRONS, SIDEWALKS AND DRIVEWAYS

Oh My!!! Lots of concrete flatwork is adding to the progress of our campus project. The Lemon Street apron is poured, as well as the curbs and sidewalks on the south side of our project. Next is to pour the main canopy drop-off driveway, completed at your reading of this article. Work continues inside the church with electrical, A/V and data wiring. Much of this work is behind walls, in ceilings and crawlspaces, so it is unseen. Plastering and painting continues inside the church.

Fr. Piotr Kosk

43 years ago, on October 16, 1978, Cardinal Karol Wojtyła was elected Pope. He took the name John Paul II and was the first non-Italian pope since 1522.

Pope John Paul I died on September 28, 1978. The conclave, that is, the election of a successor, began on October 14, 1978. 111 cardinals participated in it. Of these, 56 were European, and 26 were Italian. According to the law in force, deliberations and voting took place in the Sistine Chapel.

During the conclave, as a result of the eighth vote on October 16, the cardinals elected the Metropolitan of Krakow, 58-year-old Cardinal Karol Wojtyła, as pope. 99 cardinals voted for Wojtyła.

As is custom, the world was informed of the papal selection by white smoke rising above the Sistine Chapel. The smoke is produced by burning voting cards and other substances (to obtain the white smoke color).

Cardinal Wojtyła took the name John Paul II. His full title was: "His Holiness the Holy Father John Paul II, Bishop of Rome, Viceroy of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Successor of the Prince of Apostles, High Priest of the Catholic Church, Patriarch of the West, Primate of Italy, Archbishop and Metropolitan of the Roman Ecclesiastical Province, Sovereign Ruler of the Vatican City State".

John Paul II was the 264th head of the Catholic Church. In his first speech, he said that the cardinals "called him from a distant country, from a distant, but

always so close, union through faith and Christian tradition. I was afraid to accept this choice, but I do it in a spirit of obedience to our Lord Jesus Christ and in total entrustment to His Mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary."

A solemn Mass inaugurating the pontificate took place on October 22 in St. Peter in Rome. In his homily, the new Pope said, "Do not be afraid! Open, open wide the doors to Christ. " This message is considered to be one of the social and theological foundations of his pontificate.

The Pope's first pilgrimage was on October 29 to the Shrine of Our Lady of Grace in Mentorella (Italy). During 27 years of service, he made 104 international pilgrimages, visiting 129 countries on all continents. In addition, he made over 140 apostolic journeys around Italy.

Of all the countries that the Pope visited, he visited his home country of Poland the most - nine times. He visited the USA and France seven times, Mexico and Spain - five times each. During his foreign travels, John Paul II delivered over 2,400 speeches.

During his pontificate, Pope John Paul II published 14 encyclicals, 14 exhortations, 11 apostolic constitutions and 43 apostolic letters. He convened 9 consistory, appointed 232 cardinals (including those announced on September 28, 2003), including 10 Poles. He canonized 478 saints (including 9 Poles and two saints associated with Poland) and beatified 1,318 blessed (including 154 Poles).


**Pre Jordan
