ALL SAINTS' AND ALL SOULS' DAY All Saints' Day is a solemn holy day of the Catholic Church celebrated on November 1. The day is dedicated to the saints of the Church, that is, all those who have attained heaven and have been canonized by the Church. This year All Saints' falls on a Monday, thereby automatically lifting the obligation to attend Mass. However, All Saints' Day remains a Holyday in the Church. Fr. Kosk will be having Mass at 7:00am and I will be having a school Mass at 8:20am. Of course, parishioners are invited to attend either Mass.

All Souls' Day, which is observed on November 2, is not a Holyday, yet is important as it commemorates those who have died and not yet reached heaven. This day is an opportunity to pray for all the faithful departed. Mass will be held at 7:00 a.m. on Tuesday, at Meridith Funeral Home Chapel.

VETERANS DAY is on Thursday, November 11. We will have an 8:20 Mass with the school children recognizing the sacrifice of our veterans. All are welcome to attend. Also, Highland area Veterans Parade is on Sunday, Nov. 14 at 1:45pm, beginning at the square.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK will be offered at the end of all Masses the weekend of Nov. 13-14. Your priests are happy to offer this sacrament at any time, especially for those who anticipate surgery or are suffering from chronic health concerns of the body, mind or spirit. Jesus cares about all of our needs and when something is heavy on our hearts, we can confidently bring our pain, suffering and concerns to Him in this Sacrament.

In Poland, the 3 most important holidays when families gather to celebrate are Christmas, Easter, and All Saints/All Souls' Day. I don't think I need to explain the first two holidays, but the third one differs from the USA.

When I think about All Souls' Day, I remember the smell of Polish autumn, the smell of linden and chestnuts and rustling, colorful leaves. On the first of November, on the vigil of the celebration of "All Souls' Day," most Poles visit the graves of their loved ones to pray for and remember them. It is a beautiful tradition that connects families, allows you to remember the dead, and take care of their burial places. People travel from all over Poland to attend Holy Mass at the cemeteries where their relatives are buried. Everyone brings beautiful candles, flowers, and various decorations to make the monuments look beautiful. In front of every cemetery in Poland, vendors put up tents where you can buy everything you need.

After each Holy Mass, there is a procession during which the priest blesses the graves and families gather around them. It is a beautiful and important event for all Poles. After the celebration at the cemetery, candles are lit at the graves of extended family and friends. It is also a social time to visit with people you know. We used to go to my grandparents' house after the cemetery to eat a warm dinner and enjoy cake with my family. Later, together we talked about our ancestors and told stories about them. During November, you can bring the names of your deceased relatives to the church with the offering attached. Every day, during the service for the dead, their names are read, and later the priest prays with the faithful for them.

At sunset I would walk down to see the beauty of the illuminated cemetery. The atmosphere is impressive; when you walk along the alleys, you can feel the warmth of the candles, and you have time to pray and talk to loved ones who are no longer with us. I hope someday I will be able to return to Poland for the feast of all The Faithful Departed and experience what I can only remember now. I would like to be able to visit the grave of my father and grandparents once again.

Finally, I would like to encourage you to pray for the dead who sometimes need our help to get to heaven. Maybe All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day will help us remember the mystery of the Communion of

Saints. May prayer with the Chaplet of Divine Mercy be an expression of our gratitude for the lives of those who have passed away. The well-known Polish priest and poet Jan Twardowski wrote, "Śpieszmy się kochać ludzi tak szybko odchodzą. . ."

Let us hurry to love people, for they perish so soon;
They will leave their shoes and unanswered calls;
Only what is unimportant drags like a cow.
The most important is so immediate, for it happens suddenly






