LET THE CHILDREN COME TO ME



After the martyrdom of his Master, Simon Peter returned to his old activities: I am going fishing (Jn 21: 3). Other students joined him. So they went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing (Jn 21: 3). When he experienced helplessness in his work, Peter heard someone from the shore advise him, and he obeyed. They cast the net in the place indicated, and because of the multitude of fish, they could not pull it out (Jn 21: 6b). Then John recognized that it was the Lord, and Peter followed this discernment.

And the Lord asked the apostle if He loved Him. It is also a question of trust and faithfulness in friendship. After confirming it three times, Peter ceases to trust only himself, his skills, and his knowledge. He discovers his fragility: Lord, You know everything (Jn 21:17). From now on, Peter will allow himself to be led in the work of God's

limitless mercy towards people until his own death on the cross, similar to that of his Master.

Stop trying to overcome sins by your own strength. Stop fearing counting your mistakes and start looking to Christ. Put more effort into getting to know the Lord and His love. Look for opportunities to do this, to be with Him, to accept His gifts that He keeps giving to you. Change your thinking, so that you will receive it from Him (What you have that you would not receive - 1 Cor 4: 7).


“Stop trying to overcome sins by your own strength. Stop fearing counting your mistakes and start looking to Christ. Put more effort into getting to know the Lord and His love.”

Accept the miracles of your transformation in this or that weakness - this is His concern, not yours.

Christ's mission was not to achieve moral perfection, but to trust in your coming to God with the awareness of

your weakness. Your weakness does not bother God; what is important to Him is that, by acknowledging your weakness, you can throw yourself into His arms like the prodigal son, like a thief who trusted Him, and like a tax collector, who welcomed Him into his home.

Try to hear your own name as Jesus asks, "Do you love me?" Then go fishing.



Get ready for Christmas by praying on your own 20 minutes each day and meeting one-on-one with a spiritual companion one hour each week for four consecutive weeks.


Starts November 21. All meetings will be virtual (Zoom or phone if you prefer).


All types of blankets are greatly appreciated but, we could especially use some extra heavy ones for the men's shelter.

Saint of the Week

You may recognize the name St. Frances Xavier Cabrini (1850 – 1917) as the first United States citizen to become a saint. Known for her deep trust in God, she was a courageous woman doing the work of Christ.

Her life of service began when she was first refused admission to the religious order which had educated her to be a teacher. Not one to take things face value, she instead focused her charitable work at the House of Providence Orphanage in Cadogno, Italy, and in 1877, professed vows there and took the religious habit.

When the bishop closed the orphanage in 1880, he named St. Frances Xavier Cabrini prioress of the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart. However, she had a dream she was determined to fulfill. Since her early childhood, she had dreamed of being a missionary in China. Pope Leo XIII, however, urged her to see the need in the west. She traveled with six of her fellow religious sisters to New York City, where they worked with the thousands of Italian immigrants residing there.

Although she experienced many disappointments during this time, she persevered. When she arrived in New York, the house intended to be her first orphanage in the United States was not available. Rather than come back to Italy and the order she oversaw, she instead found a way to establish that orphanage elsewhere — plus a few more. Throughout her life, she is known for founding 67 institutions dedicated to caring for the poor, the abandoned, the uneducated, and the sick. She died of malaria in her own Columbus Hospital in Chicago in 1917.
