

that Jesus wants to embrace the Capital of Portugal with His hands full of love and mercy. It is 28 meters high and sits on an impressive 82-meter plinth. These dimensions make it one of the tallest structures in Portugal.

Did you know that this majestic figure of Jesus rises above the Portuguese capital of Lisbon? The main reason for the creation of the statue of Christ the King was the desire to entrust the whole country to the protection of the Son of God, as well as to fulfill the vows made by the Portuguese episcopate in Fatima in 1940, which asked to remove the specter of joining the Second World War from Portugal.



The statue is located in Almada, adjacent to Lisbon. It rises above the picturesque banks of the Tagus, where the river flows into the Atlantic Ocean. The statue of Christ with His arms outstretched is directed towards Lisbon, expressing the conviction

The monument is part of the National Shrine of Christ the King, dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The shrine building, consisting of a rectangular body and three wings, is located south of the monument. There are several rooms inside the gigantic statue, including two chapels: Our Lady of Peace and one dedicated to Jesus' disciples. The latter is located at the top of the monument. There are relics and mementoes of St. Margaret Maria Alacoque, St. John Eudosa, St. Faustina Kowalska, and Blessed Mary of the Divine Heart of Jesus. From the observation

deck, which forms the framing of the pedestal, there is a breathtaking panorama of Lisbon, Almada, and the Tagus. During his pilgrimage to Portugal in 2010, Pope Benedict XVI was delighted with this religious monument for which the Portuguese have great respect.

- ◆ Use this prayer card to be ever mindful of the Works of Mercy.


Bereavement/Grief Support


