




CONFIRMATION FOR ADULTS – We want to ensure that any adult – **high-school age and older** – who is not yet Confirmed has the opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. Some adults “missed” this Sacrament if their family moved or changed schools at a time when formation was offered.



On Sunday, January 9, from 11a.m.-12:30a.m. we will offer a preparation session at St. Paul for those adults who wish to be **Confirmed on Saturday, Feb. 5, 10 a.m. at the Cathedral of Immaculate Conception in Springfield.**

In the Sacrament of Confirmation, “the baptized person is ‘sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit’ and is strengthened for service to the Body of Christ” (*United States Catholic Catechism for Adults, page 203*). This Sacrament strongly helps us as individuals and as a community as we live out Baptismal promises.
