



Two marble box shelves raises the tabernacle more in congruence with the arch and more visible to the congregation. **We love the Blessed Sacrament!** The base and front is the center piece from the old altar that stood where the organ pipe chamber is now located. The two sides of the old altar are used as our current altar. We made every effort to preserve and enhance those items that are part of our parish history.



Through the process of faux painting, an artisan from "Paintsmiths" changes regular concrete columns into marble with the stroke of a brush; actually a feather. Remarkable!!! Before on the left and after on the right. Don't tell anyone it's not real marble!!!

Is Mary and Joseph's love that surrounded the Child Jesus present in me? Does your heart long to sing "Glory to God in the highest" like the angels? Do I kneel before the Child in the manger with the faith of the shepherds? The heart says it is still not enough! Jesus was born in Bethlehem over 2,000 years ago, but today He also comes to me, **ALIVE AND TRUE!**

St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta once said:

Then it is Christmas.

Whenever you smile at your brother,
and you stretch out your hands to him,
it is Christmas.

Whenever you go silent to listen,
it is Christmas.

Whenever you give up the rules

CONFIRMATION FOR ADULTS – We want to ensure that any adult – **high-school age and older** – who is not yet Confirmed has the opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. Some adults “missed” this Sacrament if their family moved or changed schools at a time when formation was offered.



On Sunday, January 9, from 11a.m.-12:30p.m. we will offer a preparation session at St. Paul for those adults who wish to be **Confirmed on Saturday, Feb. 5, 10 a.m. at the Cathedral of Immaculate Conception in Springfield.**

In the Sacrament of Confirmation, “the baptized person is ‘sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit’ and is strengthened for service to the Body of Christ” (*United States Catholic Catechism for Adults*, page 203). This Sacrament strongly helps us as individuals and as a community as we live out Baptismal promises.


