### WHO WOULD HAVE EVER KNOWN???

In this article I offer bits and pieces of information regarding our church renovation project. Some of these issues were known and others were uncovered/discovered during the renovation project. All these stated issues/projects are completed or will be, as Trinity Hall construction progresses:

- Mold/Asbestos present in several areas: abated
- Damaged plaster & paint on walls & ceilings: repaired
- Wallpaper removed on ceiling & walls: completed
- Carpeting beyond cleaning: replaced
- Boiler was inefficient and on its last leg: replaced
- 1/4 of roof leaking: replaced
- Insulated area of roof that was uninsulated: completed
- Plumbing and electrical issues: corrected
- Lighting updated with LED, some dimmable: completed
- Lack of restrooms; new Trinity Hall will provide: pending
- Ineffective & inaudible sound system: replaced/tweaking
- Worn & scratched pews: refinished
- Pew kneelers beyond repair: replaced
- "Donkeys" (middle leg protruding from seats & backs of pews): removed
- 4 pews shortened, due to lack of access: completed
- 154 chairs; repaired, stained, reupholstered: completed
- Many chair ganging book holders still need repair: pending
- Low sanctuary/poor sightlines; raised 2 3 steps: completed
- Installed a ramp on our inaccessible sanctuary: completed
- Repaired water leakage into the basement: completed
- Removed Chair/Pew seats in side aisles that were in violation of fire code exiting measures: completed
- Narthex door hardware to be replaced; fire code: pending
- Damaged east canopy: removed
- Scuppers (top part of downspouts) to be replaced: pending
- Dying/dead landscaping has been removed, replaced and/or salvaged; replanting many plants: completed
- Humid basement: installed commercial dehumidifier
- Inaccessible church storage; new room to come: pending
- High humidity in church & attic, required untimely plastering & painting for years: Attic vent system installed: completed
- New humidity control system in the church: pending
- Humidity damaged prayer kneelers: New ones back ordered
- 100+ broken stained glass panes; some restored in images of St. Paul, The Lord's Supper, Loaves & Fish, St. Cecilia & Gregory. All perimeter glass replaced: completed
- City-shared cost replacing 9th St. curb/sidewalk: completed
- Lemon St. PLC entrance curb/gutter: replaced by the city
- Updated technology & live stream capabilities: pending
- Terrazzo under pews has been refinished/polished
- Storage added for music under organ pipes: completed
- Moved & refurbished organ console
- Broken condenser motor on church chiller: replaced
- Lights now operate by switches; not circuit breakers: done
- West entrance crumbling: replaced with landing & ramp
- Constantly leaking radiators: repaired & serviced
- 2nd confessional; now 2 priests can celebrate: added
- Other small projects too numerous to mention
- We saved costs with thousands of volunteer hours

Our church building is now 71 years old. It was inevitable that repairs & maintenance would need to happen. I have assisted in fulfilling a dream of many parishioners for an expanded gathering & meeting space with ample facilities that are accessible to all. Terry (Judy) Zeisset, our Campus Growth Team and I have been good stewards of the gifts offered by parishioners, especially with rising costs. You, your children and grandchildren are the reason we have had such passion for this project, assisting all to gain the prize of eternal life. Thank you for entrusting this project to us. We pray that we have served you well thus far.





#### GOSPEL MEDITATION Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

"We are called to live our baptism every day, as new creatures, clothed in Christ." — Pope Francis

What reference point do you use when making decisions? Many times, impulse takes control and decisions are made based solely on emotion and desire. We all know that these types of decisions can often get us into trouble. When a person has a confident sense of who they are and a real understanding of what is important and of value, the likelihood of kneejerk impulsive choices diminishes. Baptism gives us what we need to make well informed and purposeful decisions. By this simple gesture, God claims us as His own and provides us with the identity and purpose we need to properly live life.

It is tremendously reassuring, when we truly embrace this revelation and realize that we no longer have to wonder about the purpose of our lives or struggle to find our way. The answer of who we are in God has been given to us. We no longer have to fumble around, trip over ourselves or walk aimlessly about. Issues surrounding the sacredness of life, the meaning of death, the protection of those most vulnerable, care for the weak and the poor, offering hospitality to those in search of a home, the purpose and proper place of work, how to create a just social order, caring for creation, and understanding our roles as heralds and stewards are just a few of the wonderful gifts baptism brings. When we make decisions based on things such as these core Gospel truths we really act as Christ himself, revealing to others the new creations that we are. This is how we live our baptism.

It is difficult to walk against the tide. Yet, that is precisely what baptism calls us to do. Although we are sinners, in need of mercy and far from perfection we are called to order our life and make decisions based upon the wisdom and guidance of Almighty God. He alone is the one who can claim us as His sons and daughters. Standing up for our principles will not make us popular. But who ever said Christianity is a popularity contest? Baptism calls us to stand up for that which goes against the grain of secularism. Standing in line with other sinners, we have our anchor to steady us in the tempests of life and God is very pleased. Forge ahead. There is nothing to fear.



#### My name is Judy Hereford.

I have lived in Highland and have been a member of St Paul Parish for the last 30 years.

I have 8+ children. I say + because I was a foster mother for 13 years.

One of my 4 originals, my second son,

Graham, was diagnosed with Burkitt's Lymphoma in 2007 and, after a difficult year-long battle, succumbed to this cancer in 2008.

Grief upon losing someone, particularly your own child, remains with you, but does not define who you are; it travels with you on your journey through life. I feel as though my personal intention within this group is to travel with you on YOUR grief journey as we learn from one another and support each other.

#### My name is Gail Holthaus.

I have lived in Highland and have been a member of St. Paul Parish for 29 years. My husband Mark lost his first wife in 1988. In 1991, we married and I became the mother of his 3 children. Together we had 2 more.



Our youngest child, Greg, was a seemingly healthy 18 year old when he went into sudden cardiac arrest and died.

Grief strikes us all in very different ways but for anyone who has lost a child, we know that there will always be a part of our heart missing. My goal with this group is to be there for each other, whether you like to talk about your loved one or just listen, know that we are there for each other. We are all parents on a journey we didn't choose.
