Brothers and sisters: Strive eagerly for the greatest spiritual gifts. But I shall show you a still more excellent way. If I speak in human and angelic tongues, but do not have love, I am a resounding gong or a clashing cymbal. And if I have the gift of prophecy, and comprehend all mysteries and all knowledge: if I have all faith so as to move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away everything I own, and if I hand my body over so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing. Love is patient, love is kind. It is not jealous, it is not pompous, It is not inflated, it is not rude, it does not seek its own interests, it is not quick-tempered, it does not brood over injury, it does not rejoice over wrongdoing but rejoices with the truth. LOOKING AHEAD "Give it a rest Father!"

While remarkable things have happened in the last 3 years due to your generosity, I'm sure the above quote from me is the feeling of many parishioners regarding campus projects. Good stewardship of what has been handed on to us in the last 177 years, since the establishment of St. Paul Parish, is critical to the longevity of our parish. To that end, I share with you what lies ahead for us.

- After phase one the school west wing was completed and during the phase two 2 remodel of the 1st floor of the PLC into parish offices, we discovered water damage in the school restrooms. Since that time we have been "retiring" toilets and urinals that are leaking behind the walls between the restrooms on all three floors. All plumbing in these 6 restrooms needs to be replaced, as well as conforming to ADA codes. This is our parish's most critical need looking ahead. By the grace of God and the help of generous parishioners this project must begin this summer. Cost: \$500,000.
- Tuck pointing the south & west walls of the school, on the docket for this summer, before damage is done to the structure and interior of the school. Cost: **\$30,000**
- Elevator for the school: WE ALL WANT THIS, so as not to exclude those who desire a Catholic Education, not to mention for their family members as well. Cost: \$500,000 guestimate
- Added parking: 110 parking spaces on the west half of our east lot. Cost: **\$250,000 guestimate**
- Fill cracks/reseal parking lots: Cost: **\$20,000**
- Rectory Renovation: Cost: **\$300,000 guestimate**
- TOTAL: \$1.6 million. We can do this! Thanks!

The Campus Growth Team, combined with the Buildings and Property Committee have been very responsible in keeping up with repairs for the last 6 1/2 years, with many, many repairs and maintenance projects. Your generous gifts have allowed this to happen, all while our campus build and church renovation is underway. **Remarkable!!!**



#### **QUESTIONS ARE ALWAYS GOOD!**

A friend, who is Catholic, recently asked me a few questions following a conversation he had with a Christian, non -Catholic friend of his. My first thought was I hope I know the answers! Here were his questions:

"I'd like to know: 1) why there's a difference between our beliefs and Protestantism; and 2) where the difference stems from. I'd also like to know: 3) the origin of why we believe our interpretation of salvation is the most accurate."

My short answer is below, and I have strived to provide an accurate answer and shed some light.

First the word "Protestantism" is taken from the word "protest." Martin Luther was a German monk, who was closed in the monastery. He was separated from the normal world and focused on studying and the Bible. With age, his view on the Church changed. Instead of trying to reform the Church to make it more spiritual and perfect, he rebelled and said I no longer belong to this church, which thinks and teaches that by your good deeds and big donations, people can be saved. He stated that the only way is to focus on the Bible and reject the traditions and teaching of the Church. So he opened the gate to interpret the Bible on your own and how you want. He thought that only by God's grace alone can people be saved and that our merits/ deeds mean nothing. This is a very simple summation. Rather than all of the good Luther could have brought to the Church, instead, perhaps by his pride and lack of humility, he rejected the Church, which existed since the beginning, and all he previously believed. We can also say that he rejected Jesus Himself, since Christ is the Church,

and it was Christ who also called the apostles, and through them we have successors (popes then bishops and priests). He rejected all the beauty, 1500 years of teaching, studies, and traditions, because he was too proud to fight and defend the Church from corruption.

Our teaching about salvation is based on the Bible, as well as tradition (which Luther also rejected – being scholars of the church, visions of Saints, example of martyrs). If you reject the Church which existed since the beginning, you also reject the Holy Spirit, which works in the Church and helps us to understand the mystery of faith.

Is faith alone enough for salvation, or does Jesus call us to do more? Jesus teaches us to love God and love your neighbor as yourself. "Teacher, I follow all the commandments. What can I do to achieve eternal life?" "Go sell your riches and give it to the poor." Good deeds are one of the ways to be saved. I think if you truly believe, you will follow Christ. What was His life all about? He died on the cross to redeem us – the greatest deed ever done.

God wants to save all of His people. If He would not, Jesus' death has no purpose. He gave us commandments to follow to help us live good lives. He left us His example of life to follow. We believe the Bible and the Gospels. So simple and yet so difficult at the same time - trust, trust, trust. The young man didn't trust and so didn't want to sell everything, which left Jesus sad. Jesus wants happiness for us. But what kind of happiness? The happiness which this world offers or the one which Jesus offers to be with Him in heaven? In the end we will truly choose – heaven or hell. If we led a bad, selfish life, we will choose hell; if we tried to follow Jesus and do good, we will want to be with God. Sister Faustina said that Jesus so loved His people that when the hour of death comes, Jesus comes 3 times and asks us what we choose, because He is so in love with His people – that He comes 3 times to give us this choice. How beautiful and amazing is our God and what a beautiful and amazing Church He has given us!
