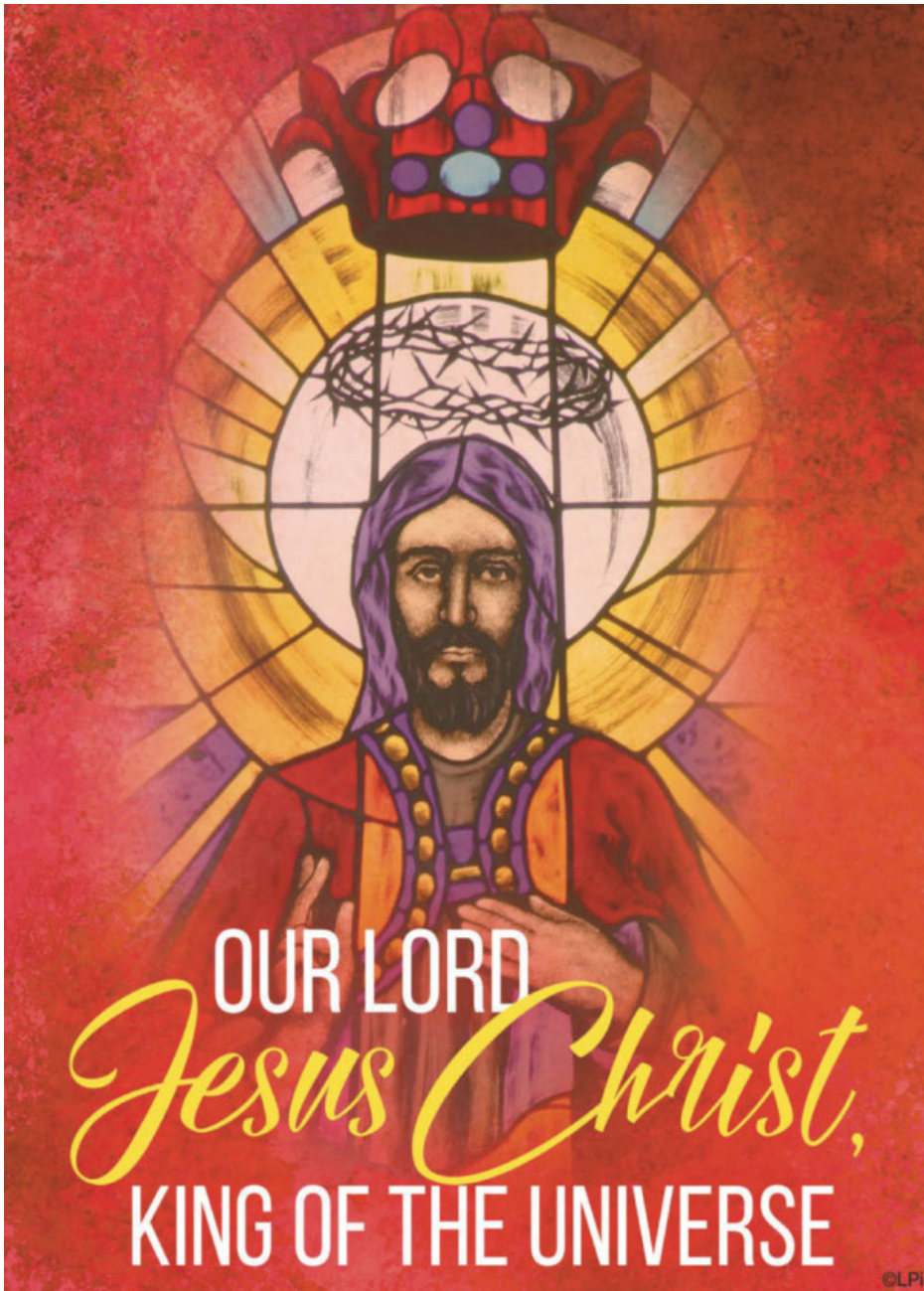

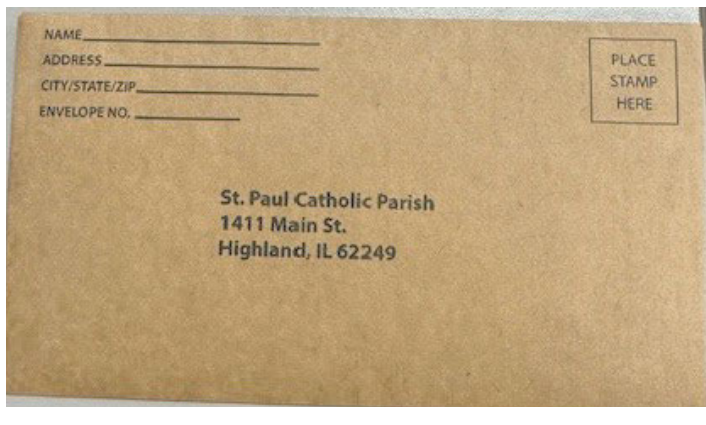

First Reading:

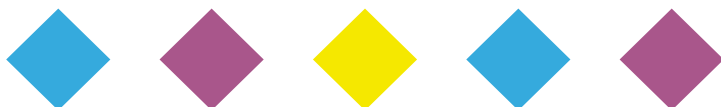

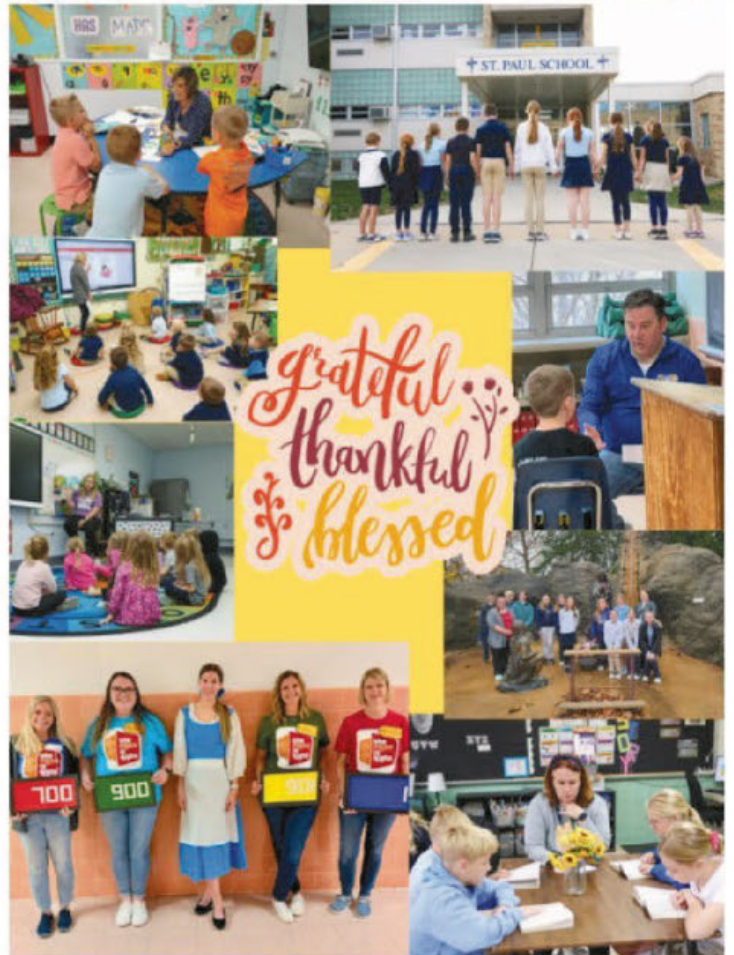

A Walk Through the Mass

This excerpt is part of the series A Walk Through the Mass by Fr. Luke Spannagel

**Do This in Remembrance of Me,
Part 1: Holy Water and Sacramentals**

Holy Water - What is one of the first things you do when entering the body of a Catholic church? You reach down and dip your fingers in the holy water font and make the Sign of the Cross on yourself.

So as you enter the body of the church, you bless yourself with holy water to recall the sacrament through which you entered into God's family, the Church. By blessing ourselves with holy water, we recommit ourselves to living holy lives in fidelity to Christ, and we prepare ourselves to participate fruitfully in the Holy Mass.

Sacramentals - The Catechism of the Catholic Church says that sacramentals "are sacred signs which bear a resemblance to the sacraments". That means that these holy things or actions remind us of sacraments in some way. They help us recall the graces of the sacraments. They don't confer grace, but prepare us to receive grace and help us be ready to cooperate with those graces so we can grow in faith and holiness.

Thanksgiving Ecumenical Prayer Service

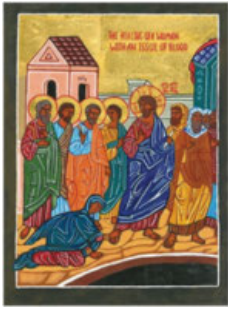
