

Reflection from Sister Gail

We are in the Christmas season. Spend time reflecting on the word we have heard every year since we were able to reason. Christmas means "Christ's Mass." Reflecting on the two words, Christ, which means the anointed one, and Mass which means "to be sent," the combination can take a lifetime to receive the full depth of understanding. Jesus was the anointed one who was sent to redeem the world.

Each of us has a calling on our lives. Our job or title does not reflect that calling. What reflects our calling is how we are called to be God's presence in the world. That presence can bless when we are digging ditches for a living to cleaning toilets. The power of grace is not bound to status. The power of grace is bound to our choice to allow God's divinity to take center place in our lives, and to be applied to everyday choices, situations and conversations.

Jesus' legacy changed the course of history for generations. God's love inside of us can change the course of history for generations as well. Our choice is, "Will history be changed for the better or the worst?" Each day we have the opportunity to be a blessing to all we meet. That blessing begins with how we think.

Our gospel reminds us to be kind, patient and loving to one another. It did not add a caveat. It doesn't say be kind in these situations or patient in others. It says unequivocally, be kind to one another, with no escape clause. How many passes do you give yourself for being the opposite? Jesus entrance into the world was to give those who put a period behind the call to be kind, patient and to love; a chance to spend eternity with God. Understand the power that kindness has to change the world for the better. Understand the grace that patience has and commit to being the face of God through love of all neighbors.


