

Pope Francis Quote: "Jesus gets in line with them and does the same thing they do. He does so with the attitude of the people, with the attitude of theirs [of the people] who, as a liturgical hymn says, approached "with bare soul and bare feet". A bare soul, that is, without anything covered, like this, a sinner. This is the gesture Jesus makes, and he goes down into the river to immerse himself in the same condition we are in. Indeed, baptism actually means "immersion"."

Baptism of the Lord

Make each feast day more than just a day. Jesus was immersed in the water for our sins. Pray over this blessing and think about how you can pass on the blessing. Who is in need in front of you? Is there a person in front of you being ostracized that you silently watch and do nothing to change the situation? How are you willing to put your reputation and good standing on the line by standing up for another? Is there a person who is talked about negatively among your peers and you participate in the same conversation? Can you immerse yourself in the blood Christ shed for us to not participate in such conversation, and interject a positive comment or have the courage to walk away?

When all are talking about what God can't do, do you have the courage to stand for God and share what He can do? Live as a sign your baptism made a difference in your life.

Reflection from Sister Gail

This Sunday we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord. Jesus, who was born without sin, had no need to be baptized. His baptism was pointing to what we must do the accept the resurrection Jesus would win for us. Baptism allows us to die to all that is not a part of the holy walk of God's children, so that we may rise with Jesus and accept new life.

The questioning of those listening to John the Baptist indicated they did not know what type of savior was coming. When Jesus arrived many still missed the type of savior Jesus was. This world looks at those with a gentle spirit as weak, those who forgive as naive, or those who choose to turn the other cheek by showing compassion to their enemies as foolish. God took the form of the meekest member of this earth; a baby. His example was to show us by personally putting aside His power and greatness to overcome all of the sin and evil that entered the world, that we too can be living examples of the power of good to transform the universe.

Access to the grace of godliness requires faith in the goodness of God. Access to the grace of holiness requires trust in the power of God's love. Access to the grace of love, requires dying to self-will to take on the eternal font of love. This love has to be chosen in every moment of adversity. It is not a feeling; it is an intentional choice that is backed up by changing every fiber of human existence to share the grace of this choice. 
