

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

This weekend the Church rejoices in the Feasts of the Nativity of our Lord and The Holy Family. Together these celebrations mark the great story of our salvation and the realization that our God and Creator became Flesh. In the great joy of this holy season, I wish a Blessed and Glorious Christmas to you and all those you love.

The Sacred Scriptures lead us to know and appreciate this great mystery of the Incarnation. Very few of us, though read the whole story. The Church uses four sets of readings for Christmas. Taken from Matthew, Luke, and John together they give a fuller understanding of the meaning of the Divine Birth and its impact on people. Since most of us chose to attend only one Mass on Christmas, we do not hear all these Gospel stories. It is also the option of the pastor as to which set of readings he wishes to proclaim. I, for example prefer the readings for the Christmas Night Mass! Let us look at the complete story!

Beginning with Matthew 1: 1-25, the option for the Vigil or first Mass, we read how the Christ is born into human history through a family line leading back to Abraham, our Father in Faith. Jesus is born into a human family, passing through the royal line of David but Joseph plays his part in God's plan and does not have relations with Mary, his wife. This demonstrates the role that God plays in the birth of the Messiah. We too are born into a human family.

Luke 2: 1-14, which is proclaimed for the Mass at Night, places the birth of the Messiah clearly in human history by using political names and places and draws attention to the historical census which takes the holy couple to Bethlehem. There the joyous message is first proclaimed by the angel not to the powerful but to the humble shepherds. We also are born into history at a particular time and place so that we begin our journey to God.

For the Mass at Dawn the gospel is taken from Luke 2: 15-20 which shows the response of the shepherds who, after the Angels leave, go to seek the newborn. Then they share the heavenly message and return to their jobs praising and glorifying God for what He has done. We also experience God in our lives and return from that encounter changed.

The final Mass setting takes its gospel from John 1: 1-18 which places the Word (Jesus) not in the human line leading back to Abraham or even Adam but to God himself. Here we read "the Word was with God, and the Word was God" and the Word made His dwelling with us. This Prologue of John's gospel explains in the clearest way that Jesus is not only fully human but fully God. The Word made Flesh. Together these gospel passages paint the fullest meaning of Christmas. Our God, the Eternal One, is born in human history but is and always will be God. May this truth live in our hearts and guide us always. The Reason for the Season!

The four Degrees of the Knights of Columbus are Charity, Fraternity & Patriotism


We the Knights of Columbus raise money throughout the year to support many charities in our own community.
