Dear Brothers and Sisters, This weekend the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Mary under her title Mother of God and the Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord as we continue to rejoice in the season of Christmas. The word "epiphany" refers to the manifestation or revealing of Christ to the Gentiles as represented by the Magi. They saw nature herald a great birth seen in the star and followed its

brightness to discover where it would lead. It led them to find Jesus, son of Mary and the Son of God. We also can see the light of Christ shining all around us and are invited to follow it to see what we can discover. Like Mary and the Magi, we may not know where it will lead but we trust we will discover God.

The prophet Isaiah reminds us "you shall be radiant at what you see, your heart shall throb and overflow". Where do you see the light of Christ shining around you? It could be a kind word spoken to thank you or encourage you. It could be a small gesture of kindness by holding a door for you or giving you preference in traffic. It could be seen in your children doing their chores without you having to remind them. God can show Himself in small, simple ways or in explosions of nature like the birth of a new star. The appearance can vary but it is up to us to look with the eyes of faith and to see God. It is then that the work begins! Once we recognize God revealing God's self in our lives what will we do with it? Will we allow it to touch and transform us or will we see it and simply move along? Sadly, some may not see it at all!

The Christ Child said nothing, did nothing and yet He changed the lives of the shepherds and the Magi who returned from where they came from glorifying God. When you see the light of Christ shine in your life; what will you do? Let us pray that like Mary, the shepherds and the Magi we will be transformed and always give glory to God by the living of our lives.



#### WHAT HAPPENS TO A CONSECRATED HOST IF IT ACCIDENTALLY FALLS TO THE **GROUND?**

This a very practical question because, as we all know, accidents happen, even during the most careful celebration of the liturgy. The short answer to this question is that nothing happens to the consecrated host. The Real Presence of Jesus remains in the consecrated host or any consecrated wine that might accidentally be spilled.

Another question we might ask is: How should the minsters respond if the Eucharist is dropped or spilled? If this happens, the priest, deacon, or extraordinary minister of holy Communion should immediately pick up the dropped host and consume it. If it is a case of the Precious Blood being spilled, the minister would use the purificator (and additional purificators if needed) to clean the spill and then the area should be reverently washed as soon as the Mass is over and the water poured into the sacrarium (a special sink that is located in church sacristies for reverently disposing of holy water, the water used to clean sacred vessels, etc.).

#### The Epiphany of the Lord

What gifts do you give to the Lord? Pope St. Gregory said that these three gifts represent what we should give God every day. Gold – we should reflect Christ's wisdom in all our relationships. Frankincense – represents our daily prayer and adoration to God. Myrrh – is a symbol of our daily sacrifices that we unite with Jesus for the sake of others.


Dear Friend,
