From Fr. Frank

Traditions. Christmas. New year. Mother's day. Birthdays.

Traditions and rituals are essential to family life. They strengthen relationships, bring family members together, and keep cherished memories alive.

Rituals and traditions are also important to our national life.

For example, Fourth of July celebrations, Memorial Day and Veterans Day observances, singing the National Anthem, and flying the flag help to unite us as citizens.

Rituals and traditions bring us into contact with the Lord and into contact with others who share our faith.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Mary and Joseph observe the religious rituals connected with the birth of Jesus.

Then when Mary and Joseph "had fulfilled all the prescriptions in the law of the Lord, they returned ... to their own town of Nazareth."

Jesus grew up in a home where Mary and Joseph faithfully followed their religious customs, traditions, and rituals.

Being in such an environment helped Jesus to grow in wisdom and grace.

As Catholics we too have our religious customs, rituals, and traditions that bring us into a relationship with God, **that form us as a Church community**, that help us to grow in our faith, and strengthen us to fulfill our mission of proclaiming the Gospel.

Those rituals include celebrating the Sacraments and, above all, gathering each Sunday for the celebration of Mass.

That Sunday ritual, that tradition handed down from the time of the Apostles, that sacred custom, forms us like no other.

Without Sunday Mass our faith begins to fade way.

Just as family life is weakened when customs and traditions are no longer followed; the same is true when it comes to our faith life.

Jesus, Mary, and Joseph show us that loving families, holy families, are ones where parents and children keep the traditions, rituals, and customs of their faith.

Sacrament of Matrimony

Arrangements must be made a minimum of 6 months in advance with the Pastor. Couples are required to attend a Pre-Cana session and a Natural Family Planning (NFP) class. FOCCUS is required and will be done with Fr. Frank for those doing marriage preparation with him.

Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are held during Mass and are not scheduled during Advent and Lent. Call the parish office to schedule a baptism.

Parents seeking Baptism for their child must be a registered parishioner for at least six months prior to the Baptism. Non-parishioners would need a letter from their pastor giving permission to have the Baptism at St. Isidore Parish.

A one time attendance to a Baptism Prep. Class is required before baptism. Godparents (not members of St. Isidore Parish) are required to have a letter from their pastor stating they are a *Catholic in Good Standing*. A copy of the child's birth certificate, sponsor names and sponsor forms are to be submitted to the office before a baptism. This is so all records can be kept as accurate as possible.

Sponsors

Please contact the parish office if you have been asked to be a sponsor and are needing a letter stating that you are an active Catholic. You will need to have been a member of St. Isidore Parish for 6 months to receive this letter.



Eucharistic Miracles of the World Poster Exhibit - Blessed Carlo Acutis

At every Mass, a miracle occurs. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, ordinary bread and wine become the Sacred Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ! The priest says the words of consecration in the Eucharistic prayer "This is My Body...This is My Blood.". Do we really believe this change



To help our unbelief, Our Lord has allowed Eucharistic miracles to take place throughout the world. When doubts creep in, we can look to these miracles and remember that God wants to help us in those times of unbelief.

Many books and other resources have been written about these miraculous events. One such resource was developed recently by Blessed Carlo Acutis, a young boy from Milan who died at the age of 15 in 2005. When Blessed Carlo Acutis was alive, he showed great interest in helping others renew their faith. In his zeal to promote the teachings of the Eucharist, a poster exhibit of documented Eucharistic miracles was created.

This poster exhibit will be on display for several weeks at the St. Aloysius Parish Hall beginning in *mid-January thru the first week of February*. Hours to view this poster display will be available in the upcoming weeks. Volunteers may be needed to sit with the poster exhibit on weekends. 


