

Parish News & Notes

From Fr. Frank

We know very little about the magi mentioned in this Sunday's Gospel (Matthew 2:1-12). They appear only in Matthew's Gospel, and only in the verses chosen for Sunday's reading.

The Gospel does tell us these magi, these non-Jews, were "from the east." But it does not tell us where in the east nor does it reveal how many magi there were. Traditionally we surmise that there must have been three since they presented three gifts to the newborn king, namely, gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

We also assume that the magi were men. The proof of that assumption may be found in the fact we sometimes refer to them as the "three wise men" or the "three kings."

Yet as some people have humorously observed, all the magi could not have been men since they did a very unmanly thing. They stopped to ask for directions. As we read in the Gospel, when they came to Jerusalem they asked, "Where is the newborn King of the Jews?"

If they were women they might have brought diapers!

But the important thing is that although they were NOT Jews, is that the Salvation of humankind is for everyone.

So, let each of us follow the star, however it presents itself, and bring us to Jesus!

Following the star had gotten them to Jerusalem in their quest to find the newborn king, but in the end they needed to stop and ask others for directions. Those directions came from the chief priests and scribes, who at the order of King Herod had consulted the writings of the prophets. They reported that those writings predicted, "And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people Israel."

Led by those directions and by the light of the star, the magi found the child they were seeking in Bethlehem. "They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh."

Besides showing that this newborn king was revealed not only to Jews but also to Gentiles, represented by the magi, Sunday's reading also teaches us the importance of seeking direction in our spiritual life.

The fact that we know Jesus as our Savior and Lord is due to the direction we have received. We have been shown the way to Jesus by our parents and other family members, by catechists and religion teachers, by priests and religious, by Church members who have publicly witnessed to their faith by their way of life, and by the divinely inspired words recorded by Matthew, Mark, Luke and John and other scriptural writers.

If we are to grow closer to the Lord we need to continue to seek direction. In fact, the Church advises those who are serious about growing in relationship with God to seek the guidance of a spiritual director to guide them on their faith journey.

Such direction also comes to us each Sunday as we gather for Mass. We are given direction as the scriptures are proclaimed, the homily is preached, and the liturgy of the Church is celebrated. It is interesting to consider that there may be more women than men in many of our churches because women have the sense to seek direction.

As the magi would tell us, none of us, man or woman, finds Jesus on our own. We all need direction!

Sacrament of Matrimony

Arrangements must be made a minimum of 6 months in advance with the Pastor. Couples are required to attend a Pre-Cana session and a Natural Family Planning (NFP) class. FOCCUS is required and will be done with Fr. Frank for those doing marriage preparation with him.

Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are held during Mass and are not scheduled during Advent and Lent. Call the parish office to schedule a baptism.

Parents seeking Baptism for their child must be a registered parishioner for at least six months prior to the Baptism. Non-parishioners would need a letter from their pastor giving permission to have the Baptism at St. Isidore

A one time attendance to a Baptism Prep. Class is required before baptism. Godparents (not members of St. Isidore Parish) are required to have a letter from their pastor stating they are a Catholic in Good Standing. A copy of the child's birth certificate, sponsor names and sponsor forms are to be submitted to the office before a baptism. This is so all records can be kept as accurate as possible.

Sponsors

Please contact the parish office if you have been asked to be a sponsor and are needing a letter stating that you are an active Catholic. You will need to have been a member of St. Isidore Parish for 6 months to receive this letter.

Eucharistic Miracles of the World Poster Exhibit - Blessed Carlo Acutis

At every Mass, a miracle occurs. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, ordinary bread and wine become the Sacred Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ! The priest says the words of consecration in the Eucharistic prayer "This is My Body...This is My Blood.". Do we really believe this change



happens? Do we trust Jesus enough to believe in His words?

To help our unbelief, Our Lord has allowed Eucharistic miracles to take place throughout the world. When doubts creep in, we can look to these miracles and remember that God wants to help us in those times of unbelief.

Many books and other resources have been written about these miraculous events. One such resource was developed recently by Blessed Carlo Acutis, a young boy from Milan who died at the age of 15 in 2005. When Blessed Carlo Acutis was alive, he showed great interest in helping others renew their faith. In his zeal to promote the teachings of the Eucharist, a poster exhibit of documented Eucharistic miracles was created.

This poster exhibit will be on display for several weeks at the St. Aloysius Parish Hall beginning in *mid-January thru the first week of February*. Hours to view this poster display will be available in the upcoming weeks. Volunteers may be needed to sit with the poster exhibit on weekends. The Light of the Moon

If you own a television that has been turned on at any point in the last month or so, chances are you've caught at least a scene or two of the 1946 classic film "It's a Wonderful Life."

If you're not familiar with the movie, it follows the life of George Bailey from childhood through adulthood. A dreamer by nature, George has big plans for himself that involve world exploration and adventure — but family and community obligations keep him tethered to the same spot on the map, leading an altogether ordinary life.

One of the most memorable scenes from that movie is of George dancing with his sweetheart Mary while they sing "Buffalo Gals — Won't you come out tonight/And dance by the light of the moon?"

That lyric always catches my ear. Of course, the moon doesn't have any light of its own. All the moon has is the ability to reflect the light that shines upon it.

The same holds for us, doesn't it? Our stewardship is purely a reflection of the grace granted to us by another. "Upon you the LORD shines," writes Isaiah, "and over you appears his glory." Every good action we will ever take begins in the mind of God. The fact that we have the honor of carrying it out on His behalf is a beautiful gift. It is God that makes our ordinary lives extraordinary.

In the end of the movie, George Bailey realizes that he had a far greater life because, instead of being the hero of his own story, he allowed himself to reflect goodness onto others.

Remember — the magi didn't chart their own course. They merely followed the star.


