

Parish News & Notes

From Fr. Frank

This is the third Sunday of Lent, and Lent is a special time devoted to repentance and what you might call, spiritual spring-cleaning. There is no better way to take these words of Jesus to heart than to go to confession.

Jesus speaks to us in parables again today. Figs are a seasonal fruit. Each season a new crop of figs. But after three years? Three years with no fruit, clearly the fig tree is dead and should be cut down!

But, the gardener tells Jesus, give the fig tree one more year. During that year, that season, the gardener promises to fertilize the plant, to water the plant, to cultivate the soil.

That season is right now. The season to make our lives fertile. Time to water the dry twigs that we perhaps have become. Time to cut off, to prune those unnecessary attachments that only drain us, not nourish us.

The parable of the fig tree tells us how to approach the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Reconciliation helps us to get control of our sinful routines. We just need to be watchful, be honest with ourselves, and make new efforts.

Let's look at that fig tree more closely. No gardener would water the tree once a year and expect it to grow.

Perhaps we should not expect our sinful habits to disappear if we confess only once a year. We fertilize the plant, we cultivate the soil, we cleanse our souls by frequent reconciliation.

I'm not sure why people are so afraid of the sacrament of reconciliation. Perhaps they are not scared, but anxious.

There is no need to be! In reconciliation, we name our sins, and we do this more for ourselves than for God, who already knows us better than we know ourselves.

When we name our sins, and accept responsibility for them, God knows that we intend to change, even if that takes a long time, perhaps a life time.

The more we confess a particular sinful practice, the more we are aware of it, and the better chance we have of overcoming it, whatever it may be.

Then comes the time when you realize, "Hey, I didn't have to confess _____ this time!" With frequent reconciliation, expect improvement. Expect some sinful behavior to just fade away.


The parable of the fig tree tells us, keep trying. Keep praying. Keep

confessing. Cultivate the soil, fertilize the plant, cleanse our souls.

The clock is ticking, but its tick is a friendly one.

It invites us to do what in our hearts we really want to do, to turn to Christ, acknowledge our faults and failings and receive from him mercy, forgiveness and the promise of eternal life.

"If the fig tree does not bear fruit after one more year, cut it down." Let's not let our time run out!

Sacrament of Matrimony

Arrangements must be made a minimum of 6 months in advance with the Pastor. Couples are required to attend a Pre-Cana session and a Natural Family Planning (NFP) class. FOCCUS is required and will be done with Fr. Frank for those doing marriage preparation with him.

Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are held during Mass and are not scheduled during Advent and Lent. Call the parish office to schedule a baptism.

Parents seeking Baptism for their child must be a registered parishioner for at least six months prior to the Baptism. Non-parishioners would need a letter from their pastor giving permission to have the Baptism at St. Isidore Parish.

A one time attendance to a Baptism Prep. Class is required before baptism. Godparents (not members of St. Isidore Parish) are required to have a letter from their pastor stating they are a *Catholic in Good Standing*. A copy of the child's birth certificate, sponsor names and sponsor forms are to be submitted to the office before a baptism. This is so all records can be kept as accurate as possible.

Sponsors

Please contact the parish office if you have been asked to be a sponsor and are needing a letter stating that you are an active Catholic. You will need to have been a member of St. Isidore Parish for 6 months to receive this letter.




